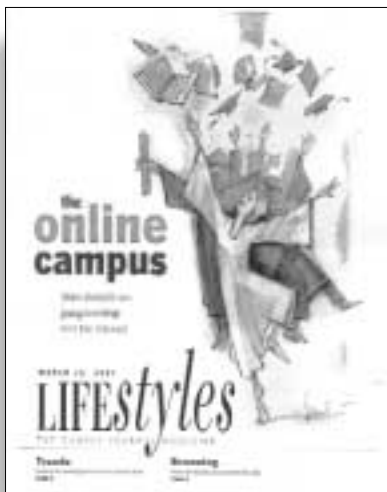

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

The purpose of any newspapers' Commentary pages is to encourage readers to form their own opinions. Therefore, we invite readers to send us Letters to the Editor. Of the 4,000 letters we receive every year, a little less than one-third are printed. The decision to print a letter is determined by many factors, including space allotment and the content of the letter.

The Editorial Page Editor will discard letters that contain libelous statements and letters that attribute statements or quotes that are not factual. Open letters to public figures or letters printed elsewhere also will not be printed. Letters selected to be printed usually address topical issues of public interest.

How to Submit a Letter:

We prefer that letters be fewer than 250 words long, typed and double-spaced. Letters must carry the writer's name, signature, home address and daytime phone number.

Local Letters:

If your letter or commentary deals purely with a local issue, send your letter to your local office. (See the breakdown of local offices along with a contact person and mailing address on the preceding pages.) Each local section (whether it be West Bay, Blackstone Valley, Massachusetts, etc.) carries Letters to the Editor under the heading "Your Turn".

Regional/National/International

If your letter or commentary addresses an issue of general interest, an issue concerning the southern New England region, the Nation or countries abroad, send your letter to the address below. Our Rhode Island section carries the statewide, national, international and general interest Letters to the Editor, Opinions and other Commentary.

PHOTOS

Most local photos in The Providence Journal are taken by our staff, but we sometimes use photos provided to us. The pictures most likely to be used are those that accompany press releases about events or people in the news.

Color prints are preferred, but The Providence Journal can use black and white prints, slides or digital photos on disk. For pictures of events, we prefer active photos of a few people rather than static or large group photos.

Requesting Photo Coverage:

If you wish to get photo coverage of your event, you can submit a "Photo Opportunity Release" to the photo assignment desk.

Photo Reprints:

All staff photos published in The Providence Journal are available for sale. Staff photos carry a credit line with the photographer's name preceded by "Providence Journal Photo" and are typically available for two years after publication. We cannot sell wire service photos (AP, KRT, etc.) or unpublished staff photos. For more information on how to buy a photo for personal use, recorded information is available by calling 401.277.7007.

Journal Clips:

This is a research service for customers who need an article published in The Providence Journal from January 1, 1983 to the present. For more information, call 401.277.8111.

Back Issues:

You can purchase back issues of The Providence Journal (within 60 days of the current date of publication or while supplies last). Be sure to specify the date(s), zone(s) and number of issues you are requesting. No phone orders will be accepted. Daily newspapers are \$2.50 per copy and Sunday newspapers are \$4.50 per copy. THE PROVIDENCE JOURNAL ON MICROFILM

The Providence Journal's entire microfilm library (dating back to 1820) is available to the general public at major public libraries as well as at the libraries of some of the state's colleges and universities. (There is a three month delay between the time the newspaper is transferred to microfilm.)

THE PROVIDENCE JOURNAL ARCHIVES

On projo.com, the Web site of The Providence Journal

This library contains articles published in The Providence Journal since 1983. When the search engine finds information that is relevant to your search entry, it displays a results list of articles. Each result that is displayed includes a brief abstract of the article. The abstract contains the headline, date, author and a few lines of the opening text. There is no charge to search the archive and no account needs to be established for you to perform a search. However, a user must establish an account to retrieve an article, since there is a fee for this service. Articles are accessible in the archive approximately 72 hours after publication. The archive does not include photos or graphics.

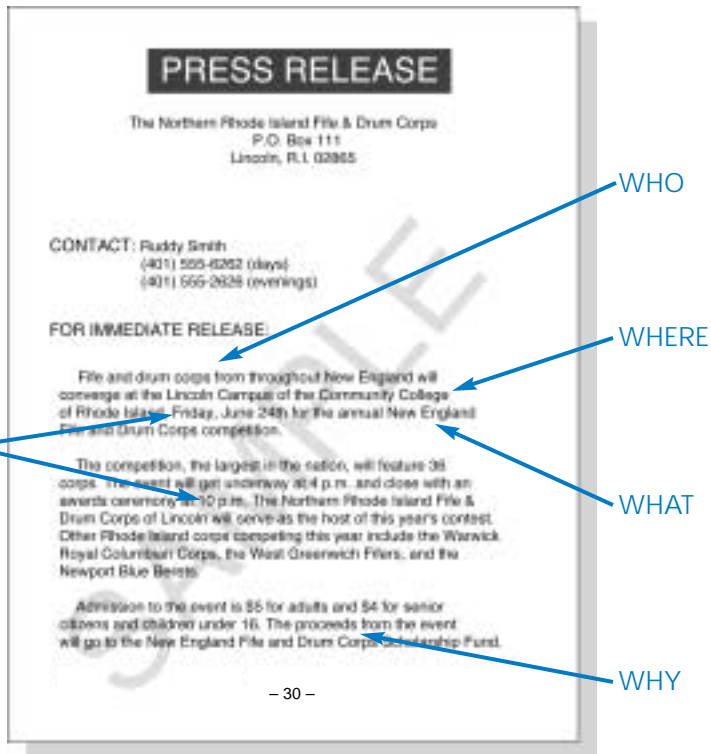

HOW TO WRITE A PRESS RELEASE



- 1 – Use your company or organization's letterhead.
- 2 – Include the name and phone number of a contact (or most informed) person.
- 3 – When appropriate, indicate the timeliness of the release (i.e., For Immediate Release; or, For Release After March 1, 2003; or, For release Before June 24, 2003).
- 4 – Include the basic information.
Who, What, Where, When, Why (and if necessary, How)
- 5 – If a release is more than one page, indicate — MORE — at the bottom of Page 1; the second page should be identified in the top righthand corner with Page 2 of 2.
- 6 – The end of your release is identified by — 30 —.

Basic Tips. . . . Type and double space your copy; include all of the important information up front; use people's complete names (not nicknames) and addresses; use (cq) after an unusual spelling to indicate it is correct; use addresses only when significant to the event.

Basic Tips. . . Use the same guidelines for a general press release except replace "For Immediate Release" or "For Release After. . ." with — Photo Opportunity/ (date of event). This release usually is brief — giving just the basic facts (who, what, where and when). It is in advance of the event. Please include information on the location of the event and directions. The request should be forwarded to the appropriate editor or to the photo assignment editor. (Names and addresses on previous pages.)
