The new Oyster card has arrived. The smarter, faster way to travel around London. To find out more, visit oystercard.com

- Adult and 'Discount' rate monthly and longer period Travelcards and Bus Passes, issued from Tube stations, most Ticket Stops (monthly Travelcards and Bus Passes, and annual Bus Passes only) and London Travel Information Centres, are only available on Oyster cards. You will need to register to obtain an Oyster card


 application forms are available at all outlets.
- 7 Day Travelcards and Bus Passes are also available on Oyster cards you will need to register (see above). 7 Day tickets will continue to be available on printed tickets without the need to register.

If you are only buying a 7 Day Travelcard, 7 Day Bus Pass or Oyster Pre Pay, a deposit of £3.00 is payable for the Oyster card when it is first issued. Should you no longer require your Oyster card, on return of the card the deposit will be refunded (certain conditions apply).

- Should your registered Oyster card be lost or stolen, we can stop anyone from using it and issue either a refund of the unused balance or issue a replacement (certain conditions apply).
- Pre Pay is a new way of paying your fare using your Oyster card. It is currently only available at the adult rates shown in this booklet. Your Oyster card does not need to be registered if it is only to be used for Pre Pay. If your Oyster card is charged only with Pre Pay you are free to lend or give it to another person for their use.
- Only one person at a time can travel using an Oyster card. However, any Pre Pay on your Oyster card can be used to buy adult and child rate printed tickets at Tube stations, most Ticket Stops and London Travel Information Centres.
- From 4 January 2004, Oyster Pre Pay will be available for use on Tube and DLR services. It will become available for use on bus and Tramlink services later in 2004.

There's good news for our regular customers. Alongside Carnet and Saver we've introduced Oyster Pre Pay, a brand new way of paying for travel.

Oyster card

The new way of using your 7 Day, monthly or longer period Travelcard and Bus Pass. Also needed for Oyster Pre Pay.

Oyster Pre Pay

You pay 2003 single fares when using the Tube and DLR.

Carnet

Carnets are still great value when you travel on the Tube in Zone 1. You'll save £5 on every Carnet of ten tickets you buy, compared to the 2004 single fare.

Saver

Buy a book of six bus Saver tickets and you'll only pay 70p per journey, instead of £1 (35p instead of 40p for children).

Children accompanied by an adult who has a 7 Day, monthly or longer period Travelcard can buy an Off-Peak Day Travelcard (valid for Zones 1-6) for just £1.

Children travel free at weekends

When you buy Family Travelcard tickets, children's all-day tickets cost just 80p — and at weekends they travel completely free.

16-17 year olds travel at child rate

16-17 year olds with a '16-17' photocard can now buy 7 Day, monthly or longer period Travelcards and Bus Passes at the child rate.

New child fares for 11-15 year olds

Child fares for 11-15 year olds are now extended on buses and Tramlink to any time, day or night.



Discount Travelcards and Bus Passes

Anyone with a valid Student photocard can buy Travelcards and Bus Passes at 30% off the equivalent adult rate. These discount tickets are available for 7 Days, one month and for longer periods up to one year.

Discount DLR Shuttle/Flyer season tickets Students who hold a valid Student photocard can also buy discount 7 Day, monthly and annual DLR Flyer/Shuttle season tickets. Again, these cost 30% less than the equivalent adult rate.

Check your university, college or school to find out if they are registered on the Transport for London Student photocard scheme.

Single fares and Pre Pay

- Single and return tickets are valid for travel only on the date shown on the ticket and up to 0430 the next day.
- Return tickets, valid for outward and return travel on the day of issue only, are twice the single fare.

Points to note:

- ◆If you are travelling on the Bakerloo line to or from Harrow & Wealdstone, single and return fares are not charged on a zonal basis and different fares apply. Please enquire at the station for details before you start your journey.
- ◆If you wish to buy a ticket to a National Rail destination from a self-service ticket machine at a Tube or DLR station, you can only do so if your destination is shown. If your destination does not appear on the machine, at Tube stations please buy your ticket from the ticket office. If the ticket office is closed, they cannot sell a ticket to your destination or you are at a DLR station, you will need to buy a ticket for your Tube/DLR journey and buy a further ticket where you join National Rail services.

Tube Carnet

A book of 10 single Tube tickets, which can be bought in advance. An adult Carnet gives a saving of £5.00 compared with 10 separate Zone 1 single tickets.

For travel on:

• Tube (within Zone 1 only).

Points to note:

- ◆ Valid for 12 months from the issue date printed on the tickets.
- ◆Can be used by you or by anyone you wish to give them to.
- ◆Each ticket is for a single journey, starting and finishing in Zone 1 but not for use on the DLR or on National Rail services (except on Thameslink between King's Cross and Moorgate/Elephant & Castle/London Bridge).
- ◆The ticket has to be validated for use on the day of travel at the Zone 1 station where you start your journey. If you travel with a ticket that has not been validated, you will be liable to pay a Penalty Fare.
- Carnet tickets cannot be used with Pre Pay, as Ticket Extensions nor can they be extended by the purchase of an additional ticket.

- Allow you to make as many journeys as you want.
- ◆ Valid for travel in Zones 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6.
- ◆ Under 18s travel at the child rate. Photocards are not needed.
- ◆ Larger groups are advised to contact the local Tube station supervisor in advance. The supervisor will be pleased to suggest the best route for your journey and will contact staff at interchange and destination stations to ensure your travel throughout the day is as trouble free as possible.
- ◆ Are not valid for travel on buses and most National Rail services, or on the Bakerloo line between Kenton and Harrow & Wealdstone.

Available for some shorter journeys across a zone boundary between specific Tube stations.

- Student 'Discount' rate period tickets are available up to a maximum period of one year, but cannot be dated to expire later than the expiry date of the accompanying 'Student' photocard.



 You need the appropriate photocard before you can buy or use a 7 Day*, monthly or longer period Bus Pass, Travelcard or period ticket.

*Not needed for adult rate 7 Day Bus Passes and adult rate 7 Day Zone 1 or 2 or Zones 1 & 2 Travelcards.

Travel for:

Under 16s

- Up to two accompanied children under the age of 5 years can travel free on buses and Tramlink. All accompanied children under the age of 5 years travel free on the Tube and DLR.
- Children aged 5 to 10 years can travel free on buses and Tramlink on production of a '5-10' photocard. Child photocards issued prior to 4 January 2004 are not valid for free travel on bus and Tramlink services.

- 14 and 15 year olds need an '11-15' photocard or 14/15 CitizenCard when buying and using child single/return tickets, Carnet, Day Travelcards (including Family and Weekend Travelcards), Child Saver and One Day LT Cards, Bus Passes and DLR tickets. CitizenCards are not valid for the issue and use of 7 Day, monthly and longer period tickets.
- If you are nearing your 11th or 16th birthday you can buy Travelcard period tickets and Bus Pass period tickets at the child rate valid for up to almost 4 months after the expiry date of your '5-10', '11-15' or Child photocard.

Tickets must be bought and have to start before your photocard expiry date.

You must have a '5-10', '11-15' or Child photocard valid on the day that the ticket starts. The photocard must be kept with the ticket at all times until the ticket expires.

You must show both the ticket and the photocard whether requested or not.

Child photocards issued prior to 4 January 2004 will continue to be valid for use until expiry, except for free travel on bus and Tramlink services.

16 and 17 year olds

- Holders of '16-17' photocards are entitled to buy child rate 7 Day, monthly and longer period Travelcards, Bus Passes and Tube only period tickets.
- The expiry date on the ticket cannot be later than that on the accompanying '16-17' photocard.

18+ students

 For details of whether you are eligible and how to obtain a 'Student' photocard, for which a charge is made, ask at your university, college or school.

- Holders of valid 'Student' photocards are entitled to buy 'Discount' rate Travelcards, Bus Passes and DLR Flyer/Shuttle period tickets.
- The expiry date on the ticket cannot be later than that on the accompanying 'Student' photocard.

'New Deal' photocard holders

- Persons participating in the New Deal programme and holding a 'New Deal' photocard are entitled to travel at child rate.
 Family Travelcards and Group Day tickets are not available under the New Deal scheme.
 Details of the 'New Deal' photocard are in the leaflet distributed by the Employment Service.
- The expiry date on the ticket cannot be later than that on the accompanying 'New Deal' photocard.

- Phone lines are open 24 hours a day.
- Please allow a minimum of 3 working days for delivery.
- Collect your Travelcard at the Tube station ticket gates or DLR station validators by touching your Oyster card on the card reader.
- For details visit www.oystercard.com or pick up a leaflet at any Tube station, London Travel Information Centre or most Ticket Stops.

- Tube stations sell a comprehensive range of tickets and Oyster Pre Pay and a selection of tickets, together with Oyster Pre Pay, is available from the self-service ticket machines in station ticket halls. Ticket offices at busier Tube stations are generally open throughout the day. At less busy stations, supervisors undertake a range of duties and may not always be available in the ticket office. Please ask a member of staff for assistance.
- Ticket Stops are independent retailers selling tickets on behalf of Transport for London. Over 2,300 of these issue Oyster cards and sell a comprehensive range of One Day, 7 Day and monthly Travelcards and Bus Passes as well as Savers and Pre Pay. They also issue Adult, '5-10', '11-15' and '16-17' photocards. A further 1,350+ Ticket Stops sell a selected range of One Day Travelcards and Bus Passes as well as Savers and adult rate 7 Day Bus Passes. How to pay

Cash

 You can pay by cash for all tickets except when using a Quick Ticket machine at Tube stations or when using our Internet and telephone sales service.

Cheques

- Tube stations and London Travel Information Centres welcome personal and company cheques.
- If your personal cheque, which must be supported by a cheque guarantee card, is in excess of your card guarantee limit you will need to provide proof of your identity and your home address.
- If you are presenting a company cheque, please provide two proofs of your identity and your home address.
- At most Tube stations, we will print the details on your personal cheque. Company cheques must be made payable to 'London Underground Ltd'.
- At London Travel Information Centres, cheques must be made payable to 'Transport Trading Limited'.
- When paying at other ticket selling outlets, please ask for cheque payment details.

Beat the queues

- One Day tickets (including Weekend Travelcard) may be bought up to 7 days in advance of the date of validity or start date.
- 7 Day, monthly and longer period tickets may be bought up to 4 days in advance of the start date. Where charged on to an Oyster card they may be bought up to one calendar month in advance of the start date.

- At Tube stations, monthly and longer period tickets may be renewed up to 7 days (one calendar month where charged on to an Oyster card) in advance of the start date, providing there is no break in continuity of tickets.
- At Tube stations we sell period tickets valid for any period between 1 month and up to 10½ months, which may better suit your needs enquire at the ticket office for rates. Travelcards valid for 3 months or 6 months are also available through our Internet and telephone sales service. For periods longer than 10½ months an annual ticket will generally be issued subject to the validity of the accompanying photocard.

Care of your ticket

Whichever ticket you buy, whether printed on card or charged on to an Oyster card, please remember that it is valuable. A damaged ticket or Oyster card may not operate the Tube ticket gates or card reader or may not be accepted by a ticket inspector.

Be careful where you keep your ticket or Oyster card. With printed card tickets, the encoded information on the back can become damaged if it comes into close contact with magnetic objects such as handbag clasps, keys and security passes.

If your printed card ticket is damaged or becomes illegible, please ask at any Tube station where it will be replaced free of charge.

If your Oyster card fails to work the yellow card readers, please ask at any Tube station where it will be replaced free of charge. If you are unable to do so, please call the Oyster Help line on 0845 330 9876.

Period ticket information – what happens if?

- I wish to travel beyond the validity of my Travelcard.
- I lose my season ticket.
- I'm sick and off work.
- I require a refund.
- I change my address or job.

All these questions are answered in the 'Period tickets' or 'Oyster' leaflet. Ask for a copy at your local Tube station or visit www.tfl.gov.uk

Compensation

- If your Tube journey is delayed for more than 15 minutes by circumstances within our control, you can apply for a refund.
- For details and a refund form, please pick up a copy of London Underground's Customer Charter from any Tube station ticket office or call the Customer Service Centre (London Underground) on 0845 330 9880.

Penalty fares

Please remember that your Tube, DLR, bus and Tramlink ticket, or Oyster Pre Pay must cover the whole of your journey and all the zones in which you wish to travel.

It is your responsibility to have the correct ticket or, when using Pre Pay, to have validated your Oyster card. Anyone who cannot produce, on request, a valid ticket or validated Oyster card for their complete journey is liable to pay a Penalty fare on the Tube, DLR, buses and Tramlink. Penalty fares also apply on some National Rail services.
