



Wm. Bernette Burch, Writer and Publisher of this little book was born at White Store, Anson County, N. C. on April 29<sup>th</sup>, 1894, son of Joseph Blakeney and Lizzie I. Barrett Burch. His father died in 1901 leaving four children; three baby daughter and the son seven years old.

At the age of fifteen he persuaded his mother to move to Florida, and they located at Winter Garden.

In 1916 when trouble with Mexico was imminent he volunteered and went with the Second Florida Infantry to Laredo and Zapata Tex., returning in March 1917, he was hardly out of service before being called back to his regiment to take part in the World War. He went over-sea with the  $31^{st}$  (Dixie) Division and served on the Meuse-Argonne front with the 26th (Yankee) Div. Discharged at Camp Gordon, Atlanta, Ga., May 14, 1919.

June 12, 1921, he married Miss Kate Agnes Story, who was born and reared at Winter Garden. They have three children; Lena Claire, born August 3, 1922; Joe Story, born September 18, 1925; and Selby Rhodes, born March 19, 1929 at Orlando, Florida.

Owner Burch Printing Company, founder of the West Orange Herald (newspaper), belongs to the Masonic and and other fraternal organizations.

#### BURCH

It seems from the data I have collected that the first of the Burches to come to America was John Burch who settled at Georgetown, S. C. in 1684, his father was an Englishman of the nobility, Burchwood, Lynkinshire near Oxfordshire, England, his mother an Italian half Norman.

The following dates are taken from the old family bible at Mt. Croghan, S.C.

C., was a large slaveholder and planter captured by Sherman's army and his home, property etc. burned or destroyed. children; John Sebrey, born June 9, 1821, married Lucy Waddle, mooved to Miss. after war.

Joseph Thomas Burch's 6 sons served in the Confederate Army through the entire war, all calvarymen.

## THOMAS

The following data relative to the Thomas family taken from "Gregg's History of the Old Cheraws" by Bishop Gregg pastor St. Davids Episcopal Church, Cheraw, S. C. (written about 1820 to 1830)

TRISTRAM THOMAS emigrated from Wales to the Province of Maryland in the early part of the last century. He died on Feb. 11th. 1746, leaving a numerous family, some emigrated to Penn., some to Virginia, his eldest son, Stephen went to North Carolina about 1750 and died there, leaving a large lamily, several of his (Stephen's) sons and daughters subsequently came to the Pedee, (S. C.) of whom a portion removed soon after the Revolution to the then north-west territory (Tenn.) This family was of the Society of Friends, while in Marlborough they worshiped near Adamsville (Piney Grove) S. C.

STEPHEN THOMAS died in N. C. as above stated. Children as follows; Sarah, Robt., Stephen, Mary, William, John, Susan, Elizabeth, Lewis, Tristram, Philemon, Benjamin, and James, born between years 1731-1758 inclusive. Robert the eldest son married Mary Sands in 1756, he died at the age of 84, was a preacher for fifty years, changing from the Friends to Baptist. Lewis the second son married a Miss Breeden, a name long known in Marlborough.

General TRISTRAM THOMAS married MARY HOLLDENS-WORTH of a Welch family. He was the seventh son of Stephen Thomas, and born July 28, 1752, though but a few years past his maturity when the Revolution began, he became a prominent leader. His children were Tristram Jr. went to Tenn; James married Mary Davis; Elizabeth married Joseph Burch Jr.

Bishop Gregg in his History of the Old Cheraws says;

"Tristram Thomas was a name respected and honored by all classes on the Pedee. General Thomas was modest and retiring in disposition, but firm and decided whenever principal was involved in the conduct of life. Sturdy by habit, and resolute in character, he was happily fitted by nature for the perils and labors of the Revolution. Possessed of a solid understanding, a practical turn of mind, and virtuous principals, he faithfully discharged the duties incumbent upon him in every station to which he was called in the councils of the State. He was the first Brigadier General on the Pedee after the war 1794. He lived to a good ripe old age, universally esteemed, and died at his residence at Ellerbe's Mills between Society Hill and Bennettsville in Marlborough Dist. In 1817."

#### "St. David's Society"

Jan. 31, 1778, for establishing a school to teach Latin, Greek, and other branches of learning in St. David's Parish, Philemon Thomas 25 pounds, Tristram Thomas 55 pounds.

This was money donated by Gen. Thomas and his brother.

Some offices held by Tristram Thomas;

- 1778-79-80 Overseer of the poor of St. David's Parish.
- 1779-80 Captain in Hick's Kolb's, and Benton's Regiments.
- 1780 Major under Col. Hicks in 2nd. Division.
- 1780 Major in command of a detachment that captured a body of British and Tories at Hunt's Bluff, near Cheraw, S.C.
- 1781-82 Maj. in Benton's Regt. under Gen. Marion "Swamp Fox"
- 1782 Elected Senator from St. David's in November.
- 1783 Took seat at Jacksonborough Jan. 18, as Senator
- 1785 Representative from St. David's Parish.
- 1786 Justice in Marlborough
- 1788 Delegate to Convention to Ratify Constitution of United States, May 12, at Charleston. Vote 149 to 73 in favor.
- 1791 County Court Judge for Marlborough.
- 1794 Made a Brigadier General.
- 1797 Senator, his brother William was also Senator this year and one of eight electors to cast a vote for President of the U. S. Wm. Thomas was also Senator in 1787-88.

Elizabeth Thomas daughter of Gen. Tristum Thomas born on Dec. 25, 1781, died April 24, 1856, 74 years 4 months. Married Joseph Burch Apl. 27, 1797 (look under Burch for children) he died March 12, 1818, and she married Archie Caraway.

Elizabeth Thomas married Archie Caraway on Dec. 15, 1822, He was born Feb. 19, 1766, died Sept. 18, 1835. They had two children; Tristram Thomas born Dec. 8, 1823, died Aug. 1, 1841 James Clothier born Aug. 3, 1825, died July 6, 1905, he was a Colonel in the Civil War, married Wincy Smith, five children; Mary, James Manly, Tristram Thomas, Cora, and William A., Tristram Thomas married twice, first a Miss Horne, and Sarah Barrett (see Barrett); Mary and Cora married Capt. John C. McLauchlin; Wm. A. married Nannie Leak.

#### NOTES

Gregg's History says; "The Blakeneys and Evans were particular enemies of the Tories. They lived on Lynches Creek in Chesterfield Dist. Chas. Evans was first husband of Mrs Mary Blakeney, he was captured by the British in 1782 and carried and held at Charleston until close of war. They were rich people. Mrs. Mary Evan s Blakeney lived to an advanced age, and when past eighty rode over her fields looking after the work." She was the second wife of James Blakeney (see Blakeney).

Mary Blakeney Jackson, wife of Henry A. Jackson and daughter of above Jas. Blakeney and his first wife Susanna Haile was born May 13, 1789 died in August 1882.

Gregg's History says; "Stephen Jackson was a Captain under Colonels Kolb, and Benton in 1780; served under Gen. Marion" the "Swamp Fox" this is the father of Henry A. Jackson and grandfather of Col. Stephen Jackson of Civil War. (see Jackson)

Samuel Timmons son of Isaac Timmons was a Major in the Seminole War in Florida (see Timmons)

General TRISTUM THOMAS, his wifes name was MARY HOLLINGSWORTH he was an officer in the American army during the Revolutionary war, children; Tristum Jr. went to Tenn., James married Mary Davis, Elizabeth married Joseph Burch Jr.

Prof. HENRY JACKSON married MARY BLAKENEY he was a school teacher, children; Stephen married Roxanna Timmons, Henrietta married Col. Alford Lowery one time U. S. Senator from S. C., Susannah married Alexander May. Benjamin married Mary Blakeney, William and Henry died young. Benjamin served in the Southern army he and his nephew Henry, were in first battle, Manassas.

Col. STEPHEN JACKSON wife ROXANNA TIMMONS born 1808 died Nov. 16, 1887 at Chesterfield, S. C., He was one of South Carolina's most prominent men and a public man all his life. He was the Sheriff of Chesterfield county for 8 years, member of the S. C. Legislature for 10 years, member of the Secession Convention which met in Charleston and on Dec. 20 1860 every member voted for secession, Stephen Jackson was Treasurer of the Republic of South Carolina which later became a state of the C.S.A. he was a big planter and slaveholder. When the Stars and Bars waved no more the original paper copy of the Secession Ordinance among other papers which the state officials carried from the Capitol on the approach of Sherman's army, remained in his hands, and is now in the home of his grandson, Henry A. Burch, Cheraw, S. C., There is a duplicate cut in marble on the wall in the Capitol at Columbia.

Children of Stephen Jackson; Franklin Maximillian fought through war, married Sue Burch and Lou Beason, Henry Andrew killed May 1864, battle Williamsburg, Va., Henrietta Francis born Jan. 22, 1843 died May 26, 1913, married W. ### BLAKENEY

Capt. JOHN BLAKENEY, wife's name supposed to be Peggy or Margaret, tradition that he came from Limeric, Ireland, Grimes Abstracts of wills in N. C. states that he witnessed the will of John Lynch, Granville Co., N.C. Aug. 31st. 1753 He is mentioned in Gregg's "History of the old Cheraws" as being overseer of the poor for Chesterfield District, Vestryman of St. Davids parish 1776, Capt. Militia Company Nov. 30, 1775 assigned to Col. Benton's Regt. and served through the war under Gen. Francis Marion. He came from N. C. and settled near what is now Pageland, Chesterfield Co., S. C. between 1760 and 1770. He signed several deeds on Aug. 8, 1832 conveying his lands to his sons Hugh and John Jr., which leads us to think he was on his death bed, if he was 21 in 1753, he would be 100 years or more old in 1832, he is buried in Flat Creek burying ground on his plantation. He had six sons and two daughter as follows; John Jr. born Jan. 14, 1758 in Bates Co., N. C., he served in the Revolutionary war, he married Nancy Lowry and Nancy May; Thomas married Susanna Lowry; Hugh, William, Robert, Jas. Married Susanna Haile and later Mary Evans.

JAS. BLAKENEY married SUSANNA HAILE, Apr. 8, 1788 He died in October 1819 and is buried in the Evans cemetery at Catarrh. He was member legislatures of S. C. 1794-1798. The following dates are from a page in his bible.

Jas. Blakeney was born Nov. 12, 1765. Susanna his wife born Jan. 31, 1766, married Apl. 8, 1788 being 23rd year of their age. Susanna Blakeney died November 17, 1807, being in her 42 year. left her husband and six children to lament the loss of wife and mother, to-wit; Mary daughter of above born May 13th. 1789, (married Henry A. Jackson) William born Feb. 22, 1791, Benjamin born May 12th. 1793, John Goodloe born Feb. 20th. 1795, Alfred born Oct. 25, 1796, Calvin James born Sep. 21, 1802 and died Oct. 9, 1808. Above record kept by James Blakeney him-

Benjamin, John Goodloe and Alfred lived in Ala. for a time, but the first two died in Prairie Co., Ark. John Goodloe married Isabella McLendon their son Benjamin married Mary Elizabeth Quarles, and three of their sons are Benjamin, a lawyer and Robert of Oklahoma City and John Oscar Little Rock, Ark. John Oscar born 1852 married Annie Moose have two children, Martha unmarried, Mary Emily married James Lemuel Blakeney descended from Benjamin son of James and brother of John Goodloe Blakeney, this Benjamin married Eliza Ferguson.

James Blakeney's second wife was Mrs. Mary Evans, who had a daughter Amelia Evans who married Benjamin Haile Jr. James Blakeney and Mary Evans had a son Gen. James White Blakeney who served in the Seminole war and was a noted lawyer of Chesterfield Co., and died in 1863 at Columbia, white attending the legislature as a member of that body.

### HAILE

Capt. BENJAMIN HAILE married KATIE FERGUSON He was born 1745 died 1842 age 97 years, he came to Lancaster Co., S. C. about 1760 from Fredericksburg, Va. And settled on Lynches Creek. He may have lived in Edgecombe Co. N. C. for a while as records show that he witnessed will of John Marshall there in Feb. 1758. He was Captain of a company in Col. John Marshall's regiment in Revolutionary war, as shown by pay vouchers now in the S. C. Historic Collection, also Pierces Register p.367 shows warrants for service. Capt. Haile represented his county in the legislature 1792, was trustee of S. C. College (now university) 1809, discovered the Haile Gold Mine the richest in the state, and became very wealthy. He had four

children; Benjamin Jr. born 1768 married Mary Cureton, later Amelia Evans step daughter of his brother-in-law, Jas. Blakeney; Ferguson Haile moved to Tennessee; Columbus moved to Missouri; Susanna born Jan. 31, 1766 married James Blakeney.

The S. C. census of 1790 shows three males over 16 yrs. and one under 16 yrs. and two females in Capt. Haile's family.

Benjamin Haile Jr. was the father of fourteen children, it is uncertain whether it was him or his father that discovered the Haile God Mine.

Haile, although we have reason to believe that Benjamin and James Ferguson were her brothers, they were members of Capt. Eli Kershaw's company, of Col. John Marshalls reg't. July 1, 1775 age 23 years height 5 ft. 10 in. born in Virginia 1752. James Ferguson and wife Abigail had a daughter Eliza, who married Benjamin Blakeney.

Katie Ferguson wife of Capt. Benj. Haile is said to have lived to 105 years of age, and her mother to 110.

After his wifes death in 1849 he gave his land and old negroes to his children and moved to Texas carrying his young negroes, he built a fine home in Texas and would have married again if his children had not interfered. He was born \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ and died Nov. 14, 1873 and was buried in Smith County, Tex.

The Brooks families lived in Mecklenburg and Cabarrus Co's. and were large land and slave holders.

Hester Brooks Carelock wife a Samuel A., born \_\_\_\_\_\_ died May 5, 1849 buried in old Barrett Cemetery on the Thomas Barrett plantation one mile north White Store, Anson Co., N. C.

Dominick Barrett (see page 1) owned many Negroes and a large land owner, born in Ireland, weight about 160 pounds and height about 5 ft. 10 in., buried wife his wife Martha in Barrett Cemetery.

Thomas Barrett (page 3) son of Dominick, owned about fifty negroes and lots of land, buried in Barrett Cemetery with his wife Jane Eleanor near the house he lived in, he weighed about 200 pounds, height 5 ft. 10 in. The Barretts all believed in the course the South took in seceeding and were glad to give their lives for this noble cause, as many of them did.

William Alexander Barrett (page 4) son of Thomas, was a well to do farmer at the time of his death Sep. 16, 1887, born June 13, 1837, served 4 years in war, buried Barrett Cemetery. I began collecting the data in this book when a small boy, about 1907, and feel indedted for the same to the following persons; Mrs. Henrietta F. Burch, W. M. Burch, Mrs. Mary Laney, Miss Sue H. Burch, Mrs. Eliza Timmons, S. B. Timmons, Mrs. Rachel Huntley, T. T. Burch, and others.

I started to publish this book in 1917, after returning from service on the Mexican border, but was called back and sent across, being on the front when the war ended.
