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
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The Gift Everybody Needs BY JOEL OSTEEN

As the holiday season gets busier,

most of us search high and low hoping to find the perfect presents for the special people in our lives. We spend our hard-earned money and many hours of precious time to buy things for people who may not even want, need, or appreciate the gifts we are giving. But one of the best gifts you can give costs very little, takes very little time, and you can be sure everyone will appreciate it.

What is it? A blessing. You can profoundly influence the people around you simply by blessing them with your words or blessing them by doing something nice for them.

As a business owner, you can help set the direction for your employees by speaking well about them. As a husband, wife, or parent, you can set the tone for your entire family by speaking positive words to them and about them. With our words, we have the ability to help mold and shape the future of anyone over whom we have influence.

That doesn't mean we will never disagree with them or that we shouldn't confront and correct them when we know they are in the wrong. But the general tenor of our words to them and about them should be positive.

A well-meaning mother was constantly nagging her teenage son. "You're so lazy; you're never going to amount to anything!" Those kinds of negative words can destroy a person. You cannot speak negatively about someone on one hand, then turn around and expect that person to be blessed. If you want your son or daughter to be productive and successful, you need to begin declaring words of life over your children rather than predictions of doom and despair. The Scripture reminds us that with our words we can bless people or we can curse them¹.

In the Old Testament, the people clearly understood the power of the blessing. As the family patriarch approached senility or death, the oldest sons gathered alongside their father. The father would then lay his hands on each son's head and speak loving, faith-filled words over them about their future. These pronouncements comprised what was known ever after as "the blessing." The family realized that these were more than Dad's dying wishes; these words carried spiritual authority and had the ability to bring success, prosperity, and health into their future.

Many times, children even fought over the father's blessing. They weren't fighting over money that they might inherit. Nor were they arguing over the family business. No, they wanted those faith-filled words. They realized that if they received the father's blessing, wealth and success would be a natural by-product.

One of the first things I do when I see my little boy, Jonathan, in the morning is to say, "Jonathan, you're the best, man." I'm constantly telling him, "Jonathan, you are God's gift to Mother and me. We love you. We're proud of you. We'll always stand behind you."Victoria and I tell our daughter, Alexandra, the sort of things. We constantly tell our children, "There's nothing you can't do. You have a bright future in front of you. You're surrounded by God's favor. Everything you touch is going to prosper."



1. James 3:6-12

We believe that we have an opportunity and a responsibility to speak God's blessings into our children now, while they are young. Why should we wait till they are teenagers, or in their twenties and about to get married, to begin praying for God's blessings in their lives? No, we're declaring God's blessings over them all the days of their lives. And we are convinced that our words will impact our children long after they are grown and have children of their own.

Funny thing about blessings, though: A blessing is not a blessing until it is spoken. Your children need to hear you say words such as, "I love you. I believe in you. I think you're great. There's nobody else like you. You have the favor of God." They need to hear your approval. They need to feel your love. Quit criticizing your child and start declaring the great things that are in store for his or her future.

Use your words to speak blessings over your friends, family members, and co-workers, too. We should never speak negative, destructive words toward anybody, especially toward people over whom we have authority or influence. Just because you have your own business or supervise a large number of employees doesn't give you the right to talk down to them and make them feel badly about themselves. Quite the contrary! God is going to hold you accountable for what you say to those individuals under your authority, and He is going to judge you by a stricter standard. You should go out of your way to speak positive words that build up and encourage.


Similarly, it is important for a husband to understand that his words have tremendous power in his wife's life. He needs to bless her with his words. She's given her life to love and care for him, to partner with him, to create a family together, to nurture his children. If he is always finding fault in something she's doing, always putting her down, he will reap horrendous problems in his marriage and in his life. Moreover, many women today are depressed and feel emotionally abused because their husbands do not bless them with their words. If you want to see God do wonders in your marriage, start praising your spouse.

Every day, a husband should tell his wife, "I love you. I appreciate you. You're the best thing that ever happened to me." A wife should do the same for her husband. Your relationship would improve immensely if you'd simply start speaking kind, positive words, blessing your spouse instead of cursing him or her.

You must start declaring God's goodness in your own life, as well. Start boldly declaring, "God's face is smiling toward me, and He longs to be good to me." That is how God says we're going to be blessed—when we start declaring His goodness.

Let's not forget that we are blessed so we can be a blessing. We should get up every day looking for ways that we can be a blessing. If I meet other people's needs, God will always meet mine. If I make somebody else happy, God will make sure that I'm happy. Every day—not simply during the holiday season—we should look for opportunities to be good to people. Maybe you can buy somebody's dinner, give them a ride, or baby sit their children. Get in a habit of doing good, and don't make the mistake of living selfishly. Self-centeredness is a prison of your own making, and it is one of the worst dungeons that you could ever live in. You were not created to be in-grown, focused on yourself. You were made by Almighty God to be a giver.

To be truly fulfilled, you must get your mind off yourself and start reaching out to others. Start doing good to somebody else. Get up in the morning and have the attitude, Who can I be a blessing to today? Who can I encourage? Where is there a need that I can meet?

Remember, your actions often speak much louder than your words. I can say "I love you and I care about you," but true love is seen in what I do. If I love you, I'll go out of my way to help you. If I love you, I'll give you a ride even though I have to get up early to do so. True love takes action.

And not just in the big things. Learn to be good to people in your everyday life. When you stop to get a cup of coffee at work, bring your coworker back a cup, too. When traffic backs up on the freeway, let that car into the lane in front of you. At the grocery store, when you have a bunch of groceries and somebody behind you has just a few, let them go ahead of you. Or how about in the parking lot, when you pull up to that last front row parking space at the same time as another car? Why don't you back up and let them have that space?

"But, Joel," you may be saying, "I thought that was God's favor helping me to beat that other car to the spot." No, that's your old selfish nature wanting to be first. If you will be good to people, you will have more of God's favor than you'll ever need.

Do you want another simple way of blessing someone? When you're at a restaurant, be a good tipper. Don't leave that server a dollar bill when you just spent thirty dollars

"Well, I shared my testimony," one person said. "I invited our waitress to church."

That's fine, but don't cancel your testimony by your miserly tip. God's people believe in being good to people. We believe in showing God's kindness wherever we go.

When I tip people, I tell Victoria, "We're going to sow a

seed into that person's life.



I want that server to be able to say, "That couple sure is generous. They are good to people." Friend, love is seen in our actions. This world does not need to hear another sermon nearly as much as it needs to see us being good to

Keep in mind this holiday season, you're never more like God than when you give. Learn to give your time, your money, or an encouraging word. When you show love, you are showing God to the world. And don't worry if you don't get any credit. When you let somebody in traffic in front of you, you may never see that person again. When you give somebody twenty dollars because you had compassion in your heart, you may never hear back from them, but let me assure you, God is keeping the records. He's seen every time you've been good to somebody. He's heard every encouraging word you've spoken. God has seen all the times you went out of your way to help somebody but they never even said thank you. The Scripture says when you do things in secret, when you do things without getting any credit, when nobody thanks you, God sees it, and you will even receive a greater reward.

It's one thing to make a big splash and let everybody know how generous you are, but if you really want to be blessed, do something good for somebody and don't tell anybody about it. Leave some cash in an unmarked envelope on the desk of that coworker that's struggling to make ends meet. At the restaurant, buy somebody's dinner and remain anonymous. Clean up the kitchen at the office and don't tell anybody that you did it. When you do things in secret and you don't get any credit, you are sowing a seed for God to do great things in

What was that? That's just a person wanting to be good to someone else. That's just somebody doing good and not needing to get the credit. That says someone cares; it says this world is not such a bad place to live in. It's amazing how just one little act of kindness can brighten somebody's whole day.

I wonder what our world would be like if each of us would find someone to be good to every day. What would our city be like? What would our offices be like? What would our schools be like if we made it a priority to brighten somebody else's day? Scripture teaches "Every opportunity we have we should do good to people". That means we need to be on the lookout. We need to be proactive. Who can I bless today? For whom can I do a favor? You can't just sit back and wait for the need to come to you. You have to go after it.

Be sensitive. Pay attention to the people around you. If you see one of your friends wearing the same clothes all the time, why don't you step up to the plate and say "Let me buy you a new suit or two." Or, "Take this gift certificate and go get yourself some new clothes." Don't miss that opportunity to do good.

Or maybe you overhear one of your coworkers saying, "Next week I've got to take my car in the shop. I don't know what I'm going to do. I don't know how I'm going to get to work." Why don't you tell her, "Let me swing by in the mornings and pick you up."

"Oh, no, that's too far," she may protest. "Its out of your way."

You can say, "It's no big deal. I'll be glad to do it."

Jesus said. "When you do it to the least of one of these, it's like you're doing it unto Me,"⁴. Proverbs 19:17 says, "He who is gracious to a poor man lends to the LORD, and He will repay him for his good deed." When you give to the poor you are lending to God. And God knows how to pay you back—with interest! You may not be able to give money, but you can baby sit that single mom's children. Why don't you give her a break one night? Tell her,"You go do something special for yourself. Here's a gift certificate. You go up to the mall. You go get your nails done. Our family is going to keep your children tonight."

Maybe you and your family go out to eat every Sunday after church. Why don't you take a single parent family along with you? Or better yet, be a mentor to one of those young children. That doesn't take a lot of money. It just takes time and love. That just takes somebody that cares, somebody that's willing to make a difference.

The Scripture says that in the last days the love of the great body of people will grow cold⁵. That simply means

that people will be so busy, they'll

And look for opportunities to bless them.

A while back I had a friend over to help me on a project. I had just bought a brand new computer monitor, one of those flat screens, real large, real easy to see. My friend said, "Joel, I love your monitor. It's so easy on our eyes."

I picked up on that. I said, "It sure is. What kind of monitor do you have?"

"Oh, just an old piece of junk that I've been using for years," he said.

I thought, Here's a great opportunity to be a blessing. A few days later, my friend had one of those new flat screen monitors show up on his doorstep. That was too good of an opportunity to pass up. I realize we can't do that all the time. We can't spend all our money like that. But we should be doing something good for somebody else. The Scripture says people will know true Christians by their fruit³. They're not going to know us by how many scriptures we quote. They're not going to know us by how many Christian bumper stickers we have on our car. People are going to really know that we're believers when we're helping other people, meeting needs, doing good works, when we are blessing people with our words and our actions.

Friend, all around us are hurting people who need our love and encouragement. Don't miss the miracle of the moment. Don't be too busy, or insensitive to the needs around you. Be willing to be inconvenienced.

Sometimes it's easy for us to get so caught up in our own little world that we're focused only on ourselves. "I've got my plans. Don't get me off my schedule." "I'd love to help you out with some work around your house, but I'm sorry, this is football season. I just don't have the time."

No, don't live selfishly. Take time to make a difference in somebody's life. John Bunyan, author of the classic Pilgrim's Progress said, "You have not lived today until you have done something for someone that cannot pay you back."

"But, Joel," I hear you saying, "I want to find out how I can get blessed. I want to know how I can get my needs met." Friend, you are never more like God than when you give. You're never more like God than when you take time for people, than when you do something to bless someone else. This holiday season, don't get sucked into this society's way of thinking that it's all about me, Me, ME!

You will never be happy that way. Why don't you make a decision with me that you're going to start being good to people? Pay attention to those around you, your friends, your coworkers, your relatives. Listen to what they're saying. Be sensitive and don't miss any opportunity to do good.

Learn to speak blessings over your life, your friends, your future. Remember, a blessing is not a blessing until it is spoken. If you'll do your part and start boldly speaking blessings over your life and the lives of those around you, God will provide everything you need to live the life of abundance He wants you to have.

Friend, this is exactly how it happens. You've got to sow a seed. If you will meet somebody else's needs, God will meet your own needs. What you make happen for others, God will make happen for you.

Maybe the reason you don't have any real joy is because you've become ingrown. You're focused on yourself. If you want to get your joy back, if you want to get your victory back, get your mind off yourself, and go out and do something good for somebody else. One thing I like to do when I'm feeling down is to go up to the hospital and pray for people. I find when I start giving encouragement, when I start giving people hope, my joy quickly returns. It changes my focus.

I heard a story about a young boy that lived in the inner city. He was about eight years old and was very poor. One cold day, he was looking in the window of a local store admiring a pair of tennis shoes. As he stood there, cold and barefooted, a lady came along and asked, "Young man, what are you doing staring so intently in this window?"

Shyly he said, "Well, I was just sort of praying and asking God if He'd give me a new pair of tennis shoes."

Without hesitation, the lady took him into the store and very gently and lovingly washed off his cold dirty feet. She put a brand new pair of socks on his feet. Then she told him to pick out three new pairs of tennis shoes.

The boy couldn't believe it. He was so excited! He had never owned a new pair of shoes. He'd always just worn old hand-me-downs. After she had paid for the purchase, the woman handed the shoes to the child. "Enjoy your shoes, son," she said.

The little boy looked at her in amazement. Nobody had ever taken that kind of interest in him. As serious as could be, with tears running down his cheeks, he said, "Lady can I ask you a question? Are you God's wife?"

And remember, true love is always backed up with our actions. People are watching us, and one of the best witnesses we could have is simply by being good to people.

Your Children

As parents, we can profoundly influence the direction of our children's lives by the words we say to them. Yet many parents fail to do so. "Oh, my kids know that I love them," a lot of parents say. "They know that I pray for them."

Maybe so, but your children need to hear those words of blessing in their lives. And the good news is that it is not difficult to change the tone around your home. You can begin speaking positive truth into your children's lives any time you want. Joel and I try to speak God's Word into the lives of children in our natural, ordinary, "everyday" circumstances of life. For instance, when I drop our kids off at school, before they even get out of the car, I remind them, "You are blessed today. You have the favor of God."

Parents, you can do something similar. Speak God's Word over your children every day before they go to school or go out to play. You don't need to preach a sermon; just say something like, "God's Word says that He loves you, and He has something special in store for you today!"

Or pray, "You promised me in Psalm 91 that You will give Your angels charge over us and that no evil would come near our household. So I thank You that my children are supernaturally protected, and You are guiding them and watching after them. Father, You said that we're the head and not the tail, and You will surround us with favor. So I thank You that my children are blessed, and they will excel at whatever they put their hands to do."

our words affect our children's future for either **good** or **evil**


Whether we realize it or not, our words affect our children's future for either good or evil. We need to speak loving words of approval and acceptance, words that encourage, inspire, and motivate our children to reach for new heights. When we do that, we are speaking blessings into their lives. We are speaking abundance and increase. We're declaring God's favor in their lives.

All too often, parents slip into being harsh and critical with their children, nitpicking, and easily finding fault in whatever the kids are doing. "Why can't you make better grades? Go clean your room—it looks like a pigpen! Can you do anything right?"

Such negative words will cause our children to lose the sense of value God has placed within them. Certainly, as parents, we have a responsibility before God and society to train our children, to discipline them when they disobey, to lovingly correct them when they make wrong choices. But we should not constantly harp on our kids. If you continually speak words that discourage and dishearten, before long you will destroy your child's self-image. And with your negative words, you will open a door, allowing the enemy to bring all sorts of insecurity and inferiority into your child's life.

Remember, if you make the mistake of constantly speaking negative words over your children, you are cursing their future. Moreover, God will hold you responsible for destroying their destiny. With authority comes responsibility, and you have the responsibility as the spiritual authority over your child to make sure that he feels loved, accepted, and approved. You have the responsibility to bless your children.

Besides, we all want good things for our children. We want our kids to be blessed. Why not put those thoughts and feelings into words? As Joel likes to say, "A blessing isn't really a blessing until it is spoken." Say those words aloud that will bless your children: "You are a child of God. God has good things in store for you. You are blessed and cannot be cursed!" Then watch to see how your child begins to thrive, how his attitude about himself will change, how her actions with others will improve, as the blessings of God begin to take root in the lives of your children.

New York Mets second baseman Marlon Anderson is a baseball journeyman who has found his spiritual home at Houston's Lakewood Church. Before joining the Mets for the 2005 season, Anderson went to the World Series with the St. Louis Cardinals – proving himself as one of the National League's best pinch hitters along the way.

While Anderson admits that the life of a professional baseball player is not necessarily conducive to regular church attendance, he says Joel Osteen's preaching drew him back to the Bible, and to a deeper commitment to God: "I grew up in church – my family was always going – and I was always playing ball. When I was ten I years at the University of South Alabama, I was drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies. But once you get into pro ball it's easy to be distracted, so for a while I stopped going to church and sort of lost night I watched Joel. That was my church. Hearing Joel got me into was just asking God for direction, and for the things I wanted. Then marriage, being a father, playing baseball – everything. I asked Him to lead me and show me what He wanted."

I've learned to let God take control

Marlon's 2004 season with the St. Louis Cardinals tested his faith, and strengthened his prayer life, although he jokes that perhaps he might have prayed more specifically: My wife and I prayed about where we would go and where God would lead. From April on, we believed we were going to the World Series, and we prayed to get winning the World Series – just about going!" (The Boston Red Sox swept the St. Louis Cardinals in four games to win it.)

Today Marlon is active in the men's ministry at Lakewood, making friends and making it his family's home base. "I've learned to let God take control and send me the places He wants me to go, to do the things He wants me to do," Marlon says. "It's good to have that free-flowing spirit about you that says 'God is in control.'"






live in darkness or despair. He has a better


plan for our lives – a bright future and a hope.²

The lives of great men and women are often recalled by a single moment that defines them - a snapshot that captures their special passion and typifies their most lasting contribution.

We remember Abraham Lincoln for his brief but powerful Gettysburg address, where he envisioned a nation "of the people, by the people and for the people." Theologian Martin Luther will be forever immortalized for nailing his 95 theses to the door of Wittenberg's All Saints Chapel, ushering in the protestant reformation. Michelangelo considered himself a sculptor, but perhaps his best known and most lasting work of art was done from atop a high scaffold, painting the ceiling of Rome's Sistine Chapel. Winston Churchill captured the hearts of Britain and the world when he boldly declared, as bombs fell on his beloved London, "This will be our finest hour."

Single snapshots like these can sum up the greatest moments of great lives.

I wonder, if we were to consider our all-powerful, all-knowing, supreme God, what his finest hour would be. Would it be His creation of the heavens and the earth by the very power of His spoken word? Or the dazzling creativity He displayed in the crafting of every living thing on the earth? Some might argue that God's greatest hour was the creation of man from the dust and of woman from man – but I would suggest that there was something even greater than that.

As we celebrate this season the coming of God in the form of a baby born in Bethlehem, I believe that God's finest hour began with the birth of His Son, Jesus Christ.

If we are honest with ourselves, each of us would admit a deep longing that cannot be satisfied; a deep inner pain and emptiness that will not go away. Education can't satisfy it, career and money can't quiet it, relationships can't fill it and drugs or alcohol can't make it disappear. It's always there because we are made by God and for God, and because of sin we are separated from Him. We know we need Him, and we long to be made right with Him – we just don't know how.

The coming of Christ was the beginning of God's finest hour because it addresses this awful separation. God loved us so much that He didn't leave us separated from Him, trapped in our own sin and its devastating effects. He loved us so much that He came to us! God Himself came to a virgin named Mary and placed His life inside her womb. And that child who was born of Mary – the one born in a manger in the little town of Bethlehem – that child was called "Immanuel," which means "God with us." And it didn't stop there.

The apostle Paul wrote of Jesus, "He appeared in a body, was vindicated by the Spirit, was seen by angels, was preached among the nations, was believed on by the world, was taken up in glory."

Jesus Christ was God's finest hour. He was born to us in the flesh, lived a perfect, sinless life, then went to the cross and suffered and died in our place. God placed on Him every sin that will ever be committed, and Jesus willingly took our punishment. Then three days later, the Spirit of God raised Jesus from the dead, breaking forever the power of sin. In Jesus, the price has been paid. In Him, we have forgiveness, and through Him, we are welcomed back into fellowship with Holy God.

So is there a "snapshot" of this great, great hour? I believe there is – and it lies in a story Jesus Himself told: the story of the prodigal son. It's recorded in Luke 15. A wealthy landowner had two sons, and the youngest demanded his inheritance while his father was still living, left home, and squandered every cent on wild living. When he was at his very lowest, he remembered that even the slaves in his father's house were well cared for, so he decided to return home, not daring to hope he might be received back as a son, but planning to beg to be allowed home as a slave.

When he returned, his father recognized him from a long way off, and before the son could apologize and plead for charity, the father ran to him, embraced him, smothered him with kisses and said "all is forgiven!" Many, many wrongs had been done by this wayward son, but all the father cared about was his return.

If you could hold in your memory one snapshot of God's finest hour this season, will you hold this one? The God of the universe loved you so much that through His Son, Jesus Christ, He has made a way for you to come back home. And when He sees you coming, He will run to you, wrap His arms around you, and welcome you home, making His finest hour your finest hour.
