



Fig.1 Front View





Please verify the device configuration jumpers are set as shown in Fig. 2 on the previous page. The jumpers are preset at the factory for all PC configurations. DO NOT change any of the default settings.

Floppy Configuration Jumpers

Please verify the device configuration jumpers are set as shown in Fig. 5. The jumpers are preset at the factory for all PC configurations. DO NOT change any of the default settings.

BEFORE YOU START

System Requirements

- IBM or IBM-compatible personal computer, 386 or higher processor.
- One available 3 1/2", (TAPE700) bay or 5 1/4" bay (TAPE700 or COMBO700).
- ◆ Caution: The tape drive interface data cable provided can be used in IBM PC/AT or 100% IBM-compatible PCs only.

If you will be installing the Arcada backup software through Windows™, you will need the following:

DOS: 386 or higher processor, 500 KB RAM minimum, 1.7 MB

free disk space, DOS 3.1 or higher.

Windows: 386 or higher processor, 4 MB RAM minimum, 1.7 MB free

disk space, Windows 3.1 or higher.

NETWORK OPERATION

The tape drive of your Combo700 or TAPE700 will backup and restore files on network drives and will restore files on local and network drives when running under NetWare [®] (Versions 2.x and 3.x), LANtastic[™] and Banyan Vines[™]. Important files stored on a network server can easily be included in regular backups.

HARDWARE INSTALLATION

Select a free drive bay and remove its cover plate OR remove an existing floppy drive so you can install the tape drive unit in its place.

- 1. Turn off your computer, monitor and any other peripherals.
- 2. Unplug your computer, monitor and any other peripherals.





- 3. Unscrew and remove the cover from the computer.
- 4. Remove the cover plate from the free bay OR remove an existing floppy drive.
- 5. Currently, your floppy drives are connected to your floppy controller board with an existing cable as shown below:



When installing your tape drive unit, you will connect the tape drive interface data cable as shown in the appropriate figure below.





HARDWARE INSTALLATION

- 6. Plug the tape drive interface data cable into the back of the tape drive as shown.
- 7. Route the tape drive interface data cable through the drive bay opening and slide the tape drive unit into the drive bay.
- 8. Follow the flat ribbon cable from the back of the existing floppy drive to the floppy controller. Make a note of the orientation of the color stripe, indicating Pin 1 on the cable, then unplug this cable from the floppy controller.
- Match the color stripes on the two cables, then plug your floppy drive data cable into the second connector on the tape drive interface data cable.
- 10. Plug the remaining end of the tape drive interface data cable into the floppy controller card. Orient the color stripe as noted in Step 8.
- 11. Find any unused power cable inside your computer and plug it into the back of the tape drive unit. The COMBO700 comes with dual power adapter. The power connector is keyed so that you can only plug it in one way. Press firmly until the connector snaps into place.
- 12. Secure and ground the tape drive unit in the bay, if necessary.
- ◆ Note: You do not need to change your CMOS settings when you install the TAPE700.
- 13. If you are installing the TAPE700, put the cover back on your computer. For the COMBO700 installation, continue on to the next section.

CONFIGURING THE FLOPPY DRIVE FOR COMBO700

 To configure the floppy drive of the COMBO700 unit as your A drive, connect the built-in floppy drive to Connector A: on the existing floppy drive data cable. Connector A: is the end connector of that cable as shown in Figure 6. Connector A: must be used if this is the only floppy drive in your system.

CONFIGURING THE FLOPPY DRIVE FOR COMBO700 (cont'd)

- To configure as your B: drive, connect the built-in floppy drive of your COMBO700 to Connector B: on the existing floppy data cable.
 Connector B: is the middle connector of the existing floppy data cable as shown in Figure 8.
- 3. Connect the ground cable if your system requires it.
- ◆ Note: You DO NOT need to change your CMOS settings when you install the COMBO700, IF the floppy drive you have removed is a 1.44MB floppy drive type.

You MUST change your CMOS settings if the built-in floppy drive is different than the drive you removed. Consult your computer system manual for how to change the CMOS settings.

TAPE LOADING AND EJECTION

Tape Loading

- Hold the tape with the label facing upward and the tape window facing the drive.
- 2. Insert the tape into the tape drive slot keeping the tape as straight as possible while pushing the center of the tape until the tape cartdrige snaps and locks into place. When fully inserted, the tape cartridge extends approximately 0.5" out.

Tape Ejection


- 1. Hold tape and firmly remove it straight out from drive.
- ◆ Caution: To prevent the tape from becoming excessively loose and causing damage:

DO NOT eject a tape while it is running

and the LED is on.

DO NOT switch the power off while a tape is running.

After ejection, store the tape in a tape carrying case until it is to be used again.





Fig.1 Front View




Fig.4 Front View




Fig.6 Rear View

- 6. Plug the tape drive interface data cable into the back of the tape drive as shown.
- 7. Route the tape drive interface data cable through the drive bay opening and slide the tape drive unit into the drive bay.
- 8. Follow the flat ribbon cable from the back of the existing floppy drive to the floppy controller. Make a note of the orientation of the color stripe, indicating Pin 1 on the cable, then unplug this cable from the floppy controller.
- Match the color stripes on the two cables, then plug your floppy drive data cable into the second connector on the tape drive interface data cable.
- 10. Plug the remaining end of the tape drive interface data cable into the floppy controller card. Orient the color stripe as noted in Step 8.
- 11. Find any unused power cable inside your computer and plug it into the back of the tape drive unit. The COMBO700 comes with a dual power adapter. The power connector is keyed so that you can only plug it in one way. Press firmly until the connector snaps into place.
- 12. Secure and ground the tape drive unit in the bay, if necessary.
- ◆ Note: You do not need to change your CMOS settings when you install the TAPE700 or TAPE1.4GB.
- 13. If you are installing the TAPE700 or TAPE1.4GB, put the cover back on your computer. For the COMBO700 installation, continue on to the next section.

CONFIGURING THE FLOPPY DRIVE FOR COMBO700

 To configure the floppy drive of the COMBO700 unit as your A drive, connect the built-in floppy drive to Connector A: on the existing floppy drive data cable. Connector A: is the end connector of that cable as shown in Figure 6. Connector A: must be used if this is the only floppy drive in your system.

CONFIGURING THE FLOPPY DRIVE FOR COMBO700 (cont'd)

- To configure as your B: drive, connect the built-in floppy drive of your COMBO700 to Connector B: on the existing floppy data cable.
 Connector B: is the middle connector of the existing floppy data cable as shown in Figure 8.
- 3. Connect the ground cable if your system requires it.
- Note: You DO NOT need to change your CMOS settings when you install the COMBO700, IF the floppy drive you have removed is a 1.44MB floppy drive type.

You MUST change your CMOS settings if the built-in floppy drive is different than the drive you removed. Consult your computer system manual for how to change the CMOS settings.

TAPE LOADING AND EJECTION

Tape Loading

- 1. Hold the tape with the label facing upward and the tape window facing the drive.
- 2. Insert the tape into the tape drive slot keeping the tape as straight as possible while pushing the center of the tape until the tape cartridge snaps and locks into place. When fully inserted, the tape cartridge extends approximately 0.5" out.

Tape Ejection


- 1. Hold tape and firmly remove it straight out from drive.
- ◆ Caution: To prevent the tape from becoming excessively loose and causing damage:

DO NOT eject a tape while it is running

and the LED is on.

DO NOT switch the power off while a tape is running.

After ejection, store the tape in a tape carrying case until it is to be used again.
