


## Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Zoning Plan 2003 MPZ1 - Cape York





## 3323 Major road / Minor road (sealed, unsealed) National Park / Conservation Tenure

4. Reefs, shoals and islands within the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park are numbered west to east within one-degree bands. They are prefixed with the latitude at the top of the band in which they lie. A centre point is used to determine the appropriate one-degree band for features straddling parallels.

5. Islands, or parts of islands that form part of Queensland and are not owned by the Commonwealth, are not part of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park.

6. The information displayed is held in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority Geospatial Data Library. This includes data provided by Geoscience Australia National Mapping Division (including the GEODATA product) and the Australian Hydrographic Office.
