#### Players Code

- (a) All courtesies should be observed; teams must be punctual; the Coach and Captain of both teams should receive the opposition team members courteously.
- (b) Play may be hard and vigorous in body contact sports, but never deliberately foul and unfair. Any player using deliberate violence should be removed by his coach, before it becomes necessary for the referee to take action.
- (c) Bad language will not be tolerated. A player offending in this way should be removed from the field by the Coach.
- (d) Barracking should be enthusiastic, but never belittling. Neither should it be provocative or designed to upset the opponents or encourage rough play.
- (e) A team or individual that wins should behave modestly. A team that is defeated or an individual, who makes an error, should behave in a sportsman like manner.
- (f) Good play should be recognised, whether by an opponent or by a member of one's own team.
- (g) Players, coaches or spectators must accept the referee's decision without negative response.
- (h) Unfair tactics must never be used. Eg. the use of provocative comments of a personal nature.
- i) All players should show courtesy to visiting spectators as well as players. All players must respect the host school's premises and rules in matter of parking, tidiness, access to playing areas and change rooms.

# Coaches and Managers Code

- (a) Coaches and managers should recognise that games are for enjoyment, and satisfaction should come from participation in a team. Coaches and managers should kindle in their players, on the one hand, a desire to win; which should motivate them towards excellence; and, on the other hand, a readiness to accept defeat.
- (b) Coaches and managers should develop within their player's respect for the ability of their opponents, as well as for the judgement of officials (referees, touch judges etc).
- (c) Coaches and managers should welcome the opposition and encourage the Captain of the team to seek out the opposition's Captain.
- (d) Coaches and managers should be reasonable in their expectations of the players and in their demands of players' time and energy. They should be sensitive to the age, skill and physical maturity of their players.
- (e) It is an educational responsibility of coaches to acquaint their players thoroughly with the laws of the game, as these provide structure and order. For this reason, coaches should continually update their knowledge of the game.
- (f) The role of the coach and manager is to teach, support and encourage players. Criticism should focus on the mistake and no personal derogatory remarks should be made. Never yell or ridicule a player for making a mistake.
- (g) Coaches and managers should be meticulous to observe the ruling that there is to be no coaching from the sidelines while the game is in progress and encroaching on the field is not allowed.
- v Coaches and managers must notify the Championship Director or his nominee, if any player from his team is sent off. All players who are dismissed from the field shall appear before the Championship Judiciary Committee.
- v A player suspended by the judiciary may appeal against the decision. The manager must lodge the appeal, in writing, within 1 hour of the decision being handed down.



#### CODE OF ETHICS AND CONDUCT - AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

#### **Players**

As players competing at the representative level of Rugby in Australia, it is important that you understand and observe the following:

This is important, so that:

- (a) You maximise your own chances of performing well at this level.
- b) You obtain all the benefits from participating, including those additional to playing.
- (c) You bring added respect to the high reputation that representative junior/schools rugby enjoys in Australia.

#### General

#### 1. Junior/Schoolboy Rugby

You are participating in these Championships as a member of your junior/schoolboy team, which has been selected to represent your association or State. Thus you are under the jurisdiction of the Australian Rugby Union. The Officials in charge of you have a responsibility to the Australian Rugby Union, your junior/schoolboy/State team, as well as to your parents.

#### 2. Accommodation

- (a) Must never change accommodation arrangements without approval by the Championship Director or his nominee and your team manager.
- (b) Must abide by the Championship timetable in respect to all matters.
- (c) Must not leave the Championship venue other than as permitted by the Championship Director.
- (d) Must, at all times, show due respect for the property of others.

#### 3. Alcohol – and banned substances

The use of which:

- (a) Is inconsistent with achievement at representative levels of Rugby.
- (b) Is inappropriate for junior/schoolboy players attending.
- (c) Can lead to difficulties in social situations when in groups.
- (d) Is forbidden at any Championships event, or Championship related event, or when travelling.
- (e) Can lead to a player being sent home from the Championships and a report sent to the junior/school association and State, where the consumption of and/or subsequent behaviour due to alcohol is judged to be inappropriate to the Championship Officials.
- (f) Will, in the case of banned substances; result in the matter being referred to the Police. The players will then be sent home immediately and a report will be sent to the junior/school association and State of the player(s) involved.
- (g) No player shall bring caffeine based drinks e.g. V, Red Bull etc. which with excessive consumption can be detrimental to adolescent health.
- (h) Any player on prescribed medication must declare to their team manager and championship director, or his nominee, prior to the Championships.

#### 4. Games

- (a) Attitudes and conduct towards other teams must be consistent with the highest standards of sportsmanship. Foul language on or off the field is unacceptable and will be dealt with firmly.
- (b) Foul, violent or dangerous play on the field can lead to a player being cited to appear before Judiciary, whether or not the action was detected or dealt with by the referee.

#### CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

#### 8.1 iRB Laws of the Game

All matches shall be played in accordance with iRB Laws of the Game of Rugby Union, the iRB Under 19 Variations and Australian U19 Law Variations. (A copy of the iRB and Australian U19 Law Variations are included as Appendix 2).

#### 8.2 Duration of Matches

The duration of all matches will be 30-minutes each half with a 5-minute half time. A maximum 5 minutes injury time will be added per match. The match referee shall be responsible for keeping time.

#### 8.3 Extra Time

During the Championship, in the event of a match being drawn at the end of normal time, no extra time will be played. The result will be determined as outlined below.

#### 8.4 Determining Positions - Division 1

In case of a draw in Division 1 knockout competition, the team scoring:

- ) most number of tries wins
- b) if tries are equal, the first try scorer wins
- if no tries are scored, the first goal wins
- if no goals are scored, the game will be decided by a coin toss; except for the Championship Finals, see below.

## 8.5 Determining Final Winner - Division 1

If teams are tied at the end of a Championship Finals match (including the Rod Macqueen and Nick Farr-Jones Shield) the title will be shared. No extra time will be played.

#### 8.6 Points Tabulation - Division 2

All teams in Division 2 will play each other on a round robin basis. Points will be awarded for the matches on the following basis:

Win 4 points Draw 2 points

Loss 1 point for loss within 7 points or less of the team that wins

Loss 0 points for loss of more than 7 points

Bonus 1 point for 4 tries or more

# 8.7 Determining Positions - Division 2

If two or more teams are equal on points for any position on the table following the round robin matches, such position will be determined by:

- a) number of wins against losses,
- b) the points for and against ratio,
- c) the result of the corresponding fixtures.

Should this still fail to separate teams, they shall be declared of equal position.

#### **BOB DWYER PLAQUE – Best Team Man**

Played his rugby at Randwick as a flanker & played 347 games for the club. Coached Randwick to five premierships and in 1982 became Australian coach. Lost the position in 1984 to Alan Jones but was reappointed in 1988 and up to 1995. Steered Australia to 1991 World Cup and Bledisloe Cup victories in 1992 and 1994. In 10 years as coach his record stands at 73 Tests for 46 wins, 25 losses. 2 draws.

#### NIGEL JEROME STIFFE MEMORIAL TROPHY – Team Managers Award

Nigel Jerome Stiffe (1956 to 2001)

Nigel Jerome Stiff attended St Ignatius' College - Riverview from 1968 to 1974. During that period, Nigel represented the school the school in rugby in the "A" level from U12's to the U16's, the 2nd IV and the 1st IV in 1974.

Nigel was a natural prop, very strong and loved to scrummage, the highlight of his junior career was the outstanding try he scored to snatch a victory against "Joeys" in the 15 A's, a 25 meter dash down the side line, beating 6 players to score.

After school Nigel played rugby at Manly and finished his career at Hunters Hill Rugby, where he played in two premierships Judd Cup teams, one as captain.

Nigel was tragically murdered in 2001 and taken from his family and friends, but his "Prop" like personality, humour, strength of character and love of Rugby will be missed by all.

#### TONY LACAZE MEMORIAL SHIELD - Best Referee Award

Charles Anthony (Tony) Lacaze (1924 to 1997)

Tony saw in the early sixties, that Rugby was ignoring a source of new players, as it did not have a junior organisation, and relied solely on rugby playing schools for players. In 1962, he established the first Junior Club in Queensland, namely Southern Districts JRUFC. In the seventies his attention moved to managing State and District Teams at Championships.

With the establishment of the Australian Junior Rugby Football Union as a company, in 1978 Tony moved to national administration, firstly as a founding Director and later as a Team Manager to New Zealand in 1985 and Secretary Manager from 1983 to 1997.

Tony was made a life member to the Australian Junior Rugby Limited, Queensland Rugby Union, and the Queensland Junior Rugby Union Inc, as Tony's contribution and association to the game was greatly appreciated.

#### **ROD MACQUEEN SHIELD – Division 1 Winners**

#### 1997 - 2001 Rod Macqueen

Macqueen's appointment to the national coaching position came in September 1997, after the resignation of Greg Smith. Prior to his appointment Macqueen had coached the ACT Brumbies since their inception in 1996 and enjoyed much success. The Nineties also saw him coach the NSW Warratahs (1991-92) and the Australian XV (1995). He was also an Australian selector in 1992 and 1994-95.

Macqueen bought exceptional management and organisational skills to the role of national coach. His appointment of assistant coaches, defensive coaches and technical advisers was one of the keys to his great success as coach. He took the team to the top by winning the 1999 World Cup, won a record three Bledisloe Cups in a row and steered Australia to victory in the Tri Nations for the first time in 2000.

His remarkable career was capped off in 2001 with an historic series victory against the Lions, coming from one-nil down in the series to beat the Lions for the first time.

#### NICK FARR-JONES SHIELD - Division 1 Plate Winners

Nick Farr-Jones was Wallaby captain of the successful 1991 World Cup winning team and a member of the Australian team for the inaugural Rugby World Cup in 1987. He played 63 Tests for Australia between 1984 and 1993, and was captain on 36 occasions.

After a successful World Cup campaign, Farr-Jones also captaining his side in the highly successful 1992 season which included victories against the All Blacks in the Bledisloe Cup and then against South Africa in a one off test in Cape Town. He retired from the international game but was persuaded back for one last series against South Africa the following year. Though no longer captain, Farr-Jones drew on all his experience to guide the Wallabies to a 2-1 triumph before hanging up his boots for a second and final time.

In total, Farr-Jones played 63 times for Australia between 1984 and 1993, including 36 as captain, and scored nine tries.

#### **JOHN EALES SHIELD - Division 2 Winners**

John Eales retired from rugby at the end of the 2001 domestic season having achieved everything there is to achieve in international rugby. Hailed as the most complete lock in international rugby, Eales made an enormous contribution during his decade of playing rugby for Australia.

He has played a part in winning every international rugby trophy for Australia, including two World Cups, two Tri Nations Trophies and five Bledisloe Cups, the last four of which were won in consecutive years from 1998-2001. In his final season he led Australia to their first ever series victory against the Lions, and was given the perfect farewell in his final Test at Stadium Australia with a last-minute victory over the All Blacks to seal the 2001 Tri Nations Trophy.

Those qualities were again demonstrated in 2000 when he helped Australia achieve its first Tri Nations championship, which included his penalty goal on the bell against the All Blacks in Wellington.

John Eales' retirement leaves him as Australia's most capped captain. In his 55 Tests as skipper the Wallabies won on 41 occasions, a 75 per cent winning ratio. He is also Australia's highest Test point-scoring forward, standing at fifth position on Australia's all time Test point scorers list.
