Sanlam Financial Services was experiencing a number of issues with their Microsoft Exchange infrastructure. Across their six Exchange sites, the information stores had grown to significant sizes in most locations, which had implications on their backup and recovery times, and were also a concern with regard to the organization's imminent migration to Exchange 2003.

In addition, although their strategy of encouraging users to archive their own e-mail to Outlook personal store (PST) files had been somewhat successful, it had led to a dispersed collection of files across the organization. There was no guarantee that a copy of an e-mail could be recovered from a centralized store, should a user move an item to their local personal store. There were also compliance issues, as it made it complex to attempt to retain a copy of all e-mail messages flowing through the system.

When looking for an e-mail management solution, Sanlam identified several key drivers: managing the ever-increasing volumes of e-mail, delivering enhanced e-mail management (including advanced search capabilities), compliance and a need to reduce e-mail volumes within Microsoft Exchange.

The Ouest Solution

Sanlam found the setup of Quest® Archive Manager extremely straightforward, and the whole process was completed in less than two hours. It was simply a case of installing and configuring the software on a dedicated Microsoft SQL Server 2000 server, and then configuring Archive Manager to connect to each Exchange site to retrieve the mail. "Archive Manager's easy-to-use Web interface allowed us to monitor this process from the start, through easily accessible real-time storage statistics," said Robin Talbot, group IT director, Sanlam.

Sanlam selected Archive Manager for several reasons. Archive Manager's non-obtrusive interface with Exchange meant no changes that could potentially impact the existing e-mail architecture. It was able to help reduce the size of the data in the Microsoft Exchange Server. Backup and recovery is now a fast and easy process.
