

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ORGANISERS OF THE FIA EUROPEAN HISTORIC SPORTING RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

In addition to the Prescriptions of the FIA International Sporting Code (ISC), the regulations for the "FIA European Historic Sporting Rally Championship" and the "Standard Supplementary Regulations for the FIA European Historic Sporting Rally Championship", the organisers must observe the following prescriptions:

1. CANDIDATURES

1.1 Preliminary conditions

Before it can be included in the championship, an international event must be organised in accordance with all the criteria required for championship events, so that the FIA can assess its validity.

In order to assess this validity, one FIA observer shall be appointed by the FIA, and the report from this observer shall be the basis on which the Historic Motor Sport Commission shall decide if the event deserves the championship status for the following season.

The observer's travelling expenses and the cost of his stay shall be borne by the organisers.

Candidatures can only reach the FIA via the ASNs, which guarantee the technical and organisational competence and financial solvency of the organisers. The ASN must send the FIA a dossier describing the sporting and technical characteristics of the event and details of its running in previous years.

The dossier must include the following documentation:

- information concerning the services: spectator safety, officials, fire-fighting, rescue;
- possible special prescriptions issued by the administrative authorities when authorising the running of the event;
- regulations of the event for the previous editions on the same course;
- report on the availability of hotel accommodation in the region, on the means of communication and on the infrastructure of the region;
- the number of events organised, indicating which of these are international.

This article 1.1 does not apply to events organised within the framework of the championship.

1.2 Registration of events on the FIA International Calendar

All the applications must be presented by the ASNs to the FIA.

In the case of events whose courses crosses borders between different countries, the FIA must receive copy of all the concerned ASNs' approvals before the applications can be accepted.

2. FIA OBSERVERS

2.1 For events entered on the championship calendar, the FIA shall delegate one observer whose travelling expenses shall be borne by the FIA. The cost of his stay shall be borne by the organiser.

2.2 The name of the observer must be featured in the Supplementary Regulations of the event. During the event, the observer cannot play another role than that of the observer.

3. ORGANISATION

3.1 Supplementary regulations

Via their ASN, the organisers must send the FIA the French or English version of the Supplementary Regulations, with the ASN's visa, at least 2 months prior to the date on which the event is to take place, in order for the FIA to grant its visa in turn.

Two copies of the definitive regulations will then be sent to the FIA.

The Supplementary Regulations issued by the organiser with the FIA's visa number must be written in French or English, and possibly in the language of the organising country on the basis of the "Standard Supplementary Regulations for the FIA European Historic Sporting Rally Championship".

3.2 Insurance

The Supplementary Regulations must give precise details of all the measures taken concerning insurance, including policies taken out by the organisers and policies covering the competitors (description of the risks and sums covered).

A photocopy of the insurance policy must be given to the FIA observer.

3.3 Results

All the results must reach the FIA Secretariat immediately after the running of the event, along with all the bulletins.

3.4 Rescue services

These must fulfil the requirements of Appendix H to the ISC.

3.5 Information

Press/Media:

The organiser must provide a press/media room which has good technical equipment in terms of communications and which is appropriate to the fame of the event.

A designated official must be available to assist the media.

Information Secretariat:

The organiser must provide a Secretariat, with an official available to assist the competitors.

The location of this Secretariat must be given in the Supplementary Regulations.

3.6 Technical Controls

The Organiser must supply the Eligibility Delegate with two wooden blocks to enable ground clearance to be measured (800 mm x 800 mm x 100 mm and 800 mm x 800 mm x 60 mm).

4. FIA OFFICIALS

The panel of the stewards of the meeting must be made up of 3. At least two of them must be of a nationality different from that of the organising country, including the Chairman of the Stewards nominated by the FIA, and a second one also nominated by the FIA..

The FIA will also nominate a Eligibility Delegate and an Observer (see art. 2 above).

Travel and accommodation expenses for the two Stewards nominated by the FIA and the Eligibility Delegate shall be supported by the organiser.
