
TRAVEL INFORMATION

There is no checked baggage service on this route. Each passenger is limited to two pieces of baggage. A wheelchair lift is available at the Grand Rapids and Holland Station. This is a non-smoking train.

Plan to arrive at the station about 30 minutes before your train leaves. All passengers, 18 years or older, should be sure to carry a driver's license, passport or other photo identification.

Grand Rapids

With a gleaming new downtown convention and hotel complex, a presidential museum, theatre, fine restaurants and the historic Heritage Hill district, Grand Rapids is the vibrant, friendly and cosmopolitan highlight of western Michigan. As the state's second-largest population and commerce center, the city boasts the resources necessary to attractively host major conventions and visiting groups. Despite its dynamic growth, the community retains much of the small town charm and graciousness that makes Grand Rapids such a delightful place to either visit or live in. Grand Rapids serves as a truly regional business, education and recreation center and is a convenient jumping off point for travel to and from all of northwestern Michigan.

Holland

Arrival in Holland means not only a world of Dutch windmills, wooden shoes and tulip gardens, but also a four season fascination with the clear blue waters of both
Lake Michigan and beautiful
Lake Macatawa. Hosting its
famous Tulip Time Festival
each May, Holland also
serves as a convenient stop
for nearby Saugatuck, often
called the "Key West" of midAmerica. Amtrak's Holland
Station is also convenient for
travel to and from Zeeland,
Grand Haven and the
Muskegon Area.

Bangor

Step off the Amtrak in Bangor and step into a newly renovated station (August 2004). A newly renovated waiting area and bathroom for Amtrak passengers will be completed by Spring 2005. Bangor is in the heart of pickle, blueberry and apple country. The 1,000 gallon green tanks you see along the tracks are actually production vats for the Freestone Pickle Company which has been in operation in Bangor for more than 100 years. Quaint shops and sites can be found in downtown Bangor. The annual lighted Christmas Parade (1st Saturday in December) was the first in Van Buren County and remains a

hi-light of the holiday season. The annual Apple Festival (October) offers fun, crafts, cars, a carnival and apples for the whole family. Bangor is located on the southern branch of the Black River. State highway M-43 runs through Bangor; 25 miles east is Kalamazoo and 10 miles west is South Haven.

Benton Harbor/ St. Joseph

Overlooking Lake Michigan, we offer broad expanses of sandy beaches, an outstanding array of quality dining, shopping along quaint brick streets, world class golfing, boating, and winery tours. This is Michigan's Wine Country, with thousands of acres of award winning vinevards. The regional Blossomtime Festival each May, Krasl Art Fair & Venetian Festival each July, and Tri-State Regatta every Labor Day weekend are just a handful of the myriad offerings to be enioved here.

New Buffalo

Welcome to Harbor Country! New Buffalo is in the heart of a quickly developing lakeside resort center offering a scenic and relaxing waterside atmosphere, yet conveniently close to the big city life of Chicago. The "Pere Marquette" is an attractive shuttle train that links "Harbor Life" with the Windy City. With all that Lake Michigan has to offer, visitors to New Buffalo also explore a varied selection of pick-it-yourself vegetable farms and fruit orchards. Enjoy the Annual "Ship & Shore" Festival that takes place the first weekend in August. Come visit the Harbor with 1,000 boat slips.

Chicago

Aside from Chicago as a destination in and of itself, the *Pere Marquette* connects to and from 50 daily Amtrak trains to points throughout the U.S. and dozens of trains to and from the Chicago suburbs. The morning arrival in Chicago allows for lunch in the Windy City, sightseeing in the Loop and an afternoon return to West Michigan or a transfer to other Amtrak trains to the west, east, north and south.
