I, Myron Gilbert, clerk of the village of Wauwatosa, Wisconsin, do hereby certify, that at a regular meeting of the Village Board, of the aforesaid village, held at the Village Hall therein situated, on Thursday evening, April, 29th, 1897, the Trustees of said village of Wauwatosa, in the County of Milwaukee, and State of Wisconsin in accordance with the provisions of Section Ninety-eight (98) of Chapter Two Hundred Eighty-seven (287), Laws of Wisconsin, for the year 1897, did unanimously adopt a resolution declaring and making publication,

That the Village of Wauwatosa County and State aforesaid, a Village in the State of Wisconsin, having a population exceeding Fifteen Hundred (1500) as shown by the last State census, to-wit) a population of Twenty-seven Hundred Fifty-six (2756), as shown by the State census of 1895, shall as provided by Section Ninety-eight (98) of Chapter Two Hundred Eighty-seven (287), Laws of Wisconsin, for the year of 1897, <sup>be</sup> a Fourth class city, by the name of WAUWATOSA, and did in such resolution fix the number and boundary of the Wards into which such city shall be divided; and did fix Tuesday May 25th, 1897, a day not less than twenty days from the date of the adoption of the aforesaid resolution, as the time for holding the first city election therein; and did in such resolution name three inspectors and one clerk of election for each Ward, at said election; and did provide that the polls should be opened at 6 o'clock, A.M. and close at 5 o'clock P.M. of said day; and did in

such resolution instruct and direct the village clerk of the aforesaid village to give ten days previous notice of the time and place of such election, and of the officers to be elected at the same, by publishing the said notice in the Wauwatosa Northwestern, a newspaper published in the said village, and by posting such notice in three public places in said village, which resolution is now on file and of record in the office of the clerk of Wauwatosa, Wisconsin.

And I do hereby further certify that the aforesaid notice was by me duly given by publication of the same, ten days prior to the time of holding the said election, in the aforesaid Wauwatosa Northwestern, and was by me duly posted ten days prior to the time of holding the said election, in three public places in said village; and that the notice so published and posted as aforesaid, did name the time and place in each Ward for holding the said election, and did further give notice of the officers to be elected at the said election to be held on the 25th day of May, 1897, in the said city of Wauwatosa, Wisconsin.

And I do further certify that due proof of publication and posting the said notice are now on file in the office of the clerk of the Village of Wauwatosa, Wisconsin,

And I do further certify that the election so called as aforesaid was duly held in each of the Wards of the City of Wauwatosa, upon the 25th day of May, 1897, at the places mentioned and described as the places for holding the same, in the notice so published and posted as aforesaid.

That the polls of election at each of the polling places in said city were opened at 6 o'clock A.M. and closed at 5 o'clock P.M., on the said 25th day of May, 1897; That all proceedings were had and done as required by law, by the inspectors and clerks of

election at each of the said *polling* places, and the votes therein cast counted and proper returns made thereof, and

I do hereby further certify that thereafter to-wit: On Tuesday evening May 25th, 1897, the Village Board of Wauwatosa in said County and State, did meet at the Village Hall in said Village for the purpose of canvassing the returns of said election, as made by the said inspectors and clerks of election, and did canvass the said returns and determine the result of the said election, and the said Village Board did on Tuesday evening May 25th, 1897, upon completion of the canvass of said returns, determine that E.D. Hoyt was duly elected at the said election, to the office of Mayor of the City of Wauwatosa, for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That F.E. Loveland was duly elected at the said election to the office of Treasurer of the City of Wauwatosa, for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That A.F. Kellogg was duly elected at the said election to the office of Assessor of the City of Wauwatosa, for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That L.G. Wheeler was duly elected at the said election to the office of Comptroller of the City of Wauwatosa, for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That William Splitt and Clinton Goit were duly elected at the said election to the office of Justice of the Peace for the City of Wauwatosa, for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That William Splitt was duly elected at the said election to the office of Police Justice for the City of Wauwatosa, for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That William von Baumbach and W.J. Underwood were each duly elected at the said election to the office of Alderman of the

first Ward of the City of Wauwatosa, each for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That James Lefeber and C.A. Breed were each duly elected at the said election to the office of Alderman of the second Ward of the City of Wauwatosa, each for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That F.W. Kalfahs and L.C. Rogers were each duly elected at the said election to the office of Alderman of the third Ward of the City of Wauwatosa, each for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That Fred Yehle and William Picker were each duly elected at the said election to the office of Alderman for the fourth Ward of the City of Wauwatosa, each for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That R.M. Brown was duly elected at the said election to the office of Supervisor of the first Ward of the City of Wauwatosa, for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That Vernon Kinney was duly elected at said election to the office of Supervisor of the second Ward of the City of Wauwatosa for the term of office provided by law for that office.

That S.S. Leonard was duly elected at said election to the office of Supervisor of the third Ward of the City of Wauwatosa, for the term of office provided by law for that office.

And that John Armstrong was duly elected at said election to the office of Supervisor for the fourth Ward of the City of Wauwatosa, for the term of office provided by law for that office.


