The

Prophet (saw) said that *"Every child is born upon the fitrah..."* But what is the fitrah?

Da'wah – An obligation

Da'wah is an obligation on every muslim who declares 'La illaha ill Allah' and it is extremely important that we all realise this.

Allah (swt) says in the Qur'aan:

"Invite to the Way of your Lord (i.e. Islam) with wisdom and fair preaching, and argue with them in a way that is better. Truly, your Lord knows best who has gone astray from His Path, and He is the Best Aware of those who are guided." (Quran 16:125)

"Let there arise out of you a group of people inviting to all that is good, enjoining alma`roof [i.e. Islamic Monotheism and all that Islam orders one to do] and forbidding al-Munkar [polytheism and disbelief and all that Islam has forbidden]. And it is they who are successful." (Quran, 3:104)

There are a number of hadith that also stress the importance of dawah and hisbah (enjoining good and forbidding evil). The Prophet (sallallaahu `alayhi wa sallam) has said: "Convey from me, even one verse." (Bukhari)

Conveying the message therefore does not require a high level of scholarship, it is in fact a responsibility of each and every Muslim, according to his or her ability.

The obligation is further emphasized by the following verse which explains that not conveying the message - hiding knowledge - is disobedience to Allah that causes Allah's curse to descend upon such people, which shows that such a sin leads to the Hellfire.

"Verily, those who conceal the clear proofs, evidences and the guidance, which We have sent down, after We have made it clear for the people in the book, they are the ones cursed by Allah and cursed by the cursers." [al-Qur'aan, al-Baqara(2):159]

In the same connection, the Prophet (sallallaahu `alayhi wa sallam) has stated, "When the people see a wrongdoer and do not prevent him, Allah will soon punish them all." [Ahmad]

Calling people to Allah also means completing our own worship, the reason for which we are created. It is one of the noblest acts that entails a high reward.

"And who is better in speech than he who invites to Allah and does righteous deeds, and says: 'I am one of the Muslims.' (Quran 41:33)

With regards to the reward, the Prophet (sallallaahu `alayhi wa sallam) has said: "Whoever guides [another] to a good deed will get a reward similar to the one who performs it." (Muslim)

The Aim of Da'wah

The aim of dawah is to bring the people out of the darkness and into the light, and to guide them to the truth until they hold on to it and are saved from the Fire and the Anger of Allah. To take the disbeliever out of the darkness of disbelief into the light and guidance, to take the ignorant out of the darkness of ignorance into the light of knowledge and to take the disobedient out of the darkness of disobedience into the light of obedience.

This is the aim of dawah as Allah says in the Qur'an,

"Allah is a Walee (protector/guardian) of those who believe and brings them out of the darkness into light" (2:257).

The Messengers were sent in order to bring the people out of the darkness into the light. Likewise the callers to the truth establish dawah and are active in it, in order to bring the people out of the darkness into the light, rescue them from the Fire, obedience to the shaytaan and to save them from obeying their desires to obeying Allah and His Messenger (sallallaahu `alayhi wa sallam).

Our Prophet (s.a.w) passed away after he had conveyed the Message, fulfilled the trust and counselled the Ummah. Our duty is to safeguard the trust handed down to us through generations of the Muslim Ummah.

"May Allah bless a man who hears my sayings and commits them to memory, then faithfully communicates them (to others)" (Bukhari)



Mixing freely among men and women is Haraam?

The meeting together, mixing, and intermingling of men and women in one place, the crowding of them together, and the revealing and exposure of women to men are prohibited by the Law of Islam (Shari'ah). These acts are prohibited because they are among the causes for fitnah (temptation or trial which implies evil consequences), the arousing of desires, and the committing of indecency and wrongdoing.

There is much evidence regarding the prohibition of the meeting and mixing of men and women in the Qur'aan and Sunnah. For example:

The Prophet (May peace and blessings be upon him) enforced separation of men and women even at Allaah's most revered and preferred place, the mosque. This was accomplished via the separation of the women's rows from the men's; men were asked to stay in the mosque after completion of the obligatory prayer so that women will have enough time to leave the mosque; and, a special door was assigned to women. If this was enforced in the most sacred of places, the masjid, then how about all other places where evil and fitnah are present?

Music is Haraam?

It is forbidden and is not permissible to play musical instruments or listen to songs and tunes. The majority of scholars say that it is haraam, including the four imams of figh: Abu Haneefah, Maalik, al-Shaafa'i and Ahmad (may Allaah have mercy on them all).

Evidence of prohibition in the Qur'aan and Sunnah:

Allaah says in Surah Luqmaan (interpretation of the meaning): "And of mankind is he who purchases idle talks (i.e. music, singing) to mislead (men) from the path of Allaah..." (Quran 31:6)

Al-Hasan al-Basri (may Allaah have mercy on him) said: this aayah was revealed concerning singing and musical instruments (lit. woodwind instruments). (*Tafseer Ibn Katheer*, 3/451).

Allaah says in the Quran (interpretation of the meaning): [Allaah said to Iblees:] "And befool them gradually those whom you can among them with your voice (i.e. songs, music, and any other call for Allaah's disobedience)..." (Surah al-Israa' 17:64)

The scholars therefore say that everyone who speaks in any way that is not obedient to Allaah, everyone who blows into a flute or other woodwind instrument, or who plays any haraam kind of drum, this is the voice of the Shaytaan.

Hijaab is fard (an obligation) for women?

Hijab is obligatory for all Muslim women who have reached the age of puberty.

Allah (swt) says in Surah Al-Ahzaab 33:59: "O Prophet! Tell your wives and your daughters and the women of the believers to draw their cloaks (veils) all over their bodies (i.e. screen themselves). That will be better, that they should be known (as free respectable women) so as not to be annoyed. And Allaah is Ever Oft-Forgiving, Most Merciful."

These are all clear commandments from Allah swt and if these are willingly disobeyed then one is asking for Allah's punishment. May Allah swt guide us to obey Him and follow his religion in its entirety and make this easy for us ameen.
