Saxophone Virtuosi

Saxofourte, are four young Saxophone players, whose avowed goal it is to break conventions and cross borders. The four, who all studied classical music, manage to combine the charm and the intimacy of a classical chamber music ensemble with the passion and easiness of a modern "Band" in a most fascinating way. The diversity of work constantly demands commitment to new pieces, ideas and styles from the ensemble. All this contributes to an overwhelming joy of playing, making Saxofourte a true experience for the senses.

and Ralf Ritscher studied with well-known saxophone teachers at various conservatories and colleges of music. Apart from their work with different orchestras, including the Stuttgart State Theatre, the Bavarian Radio Symphony Orchestra and the Chamber Orchestra of Europe, the four musicians concentrate entirely on quartet playing, and since they founded "Saxofourte" in 1994 they have made successful concert appearances across Europe. They have also toured farther afield, e.g. to the Lebanon, Syria, Egypt and the USA. The saxophone quartet is a regular guest at various music festivals, such as the Schleswig-Holstein, the Rheingau and the Rheinland-Pfalz festivals, and has also appeared as an opening act to the "Young Tenors". After winning prizes in various competitions and being awarded a number of scholarships, the ensemble was particularly proud to win first prize ("Primo Classificato") at the 1997 International Chamber Music Competition in Verona, Italy.

During their Murray River International Music Festival tour Saxofourte will perform in the Mildura region at the Gol Gol Pub beside the Murray River and Yarrawonga on the banks of the beautiful Lake Muwala in New South Wales.



Grand Master of the Piano & Organ



"....Musician of the finest calibre" El Diario, Spain

Anthony Halliday has given numerous piano and organ recitals performances throughout Europe and Australia. He won critical praise from the renowned conductors with whom he appeared as soloist. The eminent conductor Walter Süsskind hailed Anthony Halliday's playing as "magnificent", and singled out particularly the performance of Beethoven's Fourth Piano Concerto, describing his interpretation as "outstanding". He has received many awards and prizes, including a Churchill Fellowship and all the Fellowship prizes at the Royal College of Organists (London), as well as the Silver Medal of The Worshipful Company of Musicians (London).

His transcription for organ of the nine symphonies of Beethoven won critical acclaim, and won the Myerson Prize. He won first prize in the A.B.C. Commonwealth Concerto Competition and regularly performs in Europe and Australasia. He has recently recorded all the Beethoven Sonatas for Pianoforte for ABC Music.

Anthony will perform on many Murray River pianos including Mildura, Swan Hill, Echuca, Mulwala NSW, Shepparton and Corryong.

Each year the Murray River International Music Festival works closely with the Slow River Project who produce the Chefs of the Murray Series.


