#### **Governor's Hunter Women Convict Assignment Report 1798**

Whilst researching for my forthcoming publication "Ladies of the Royal Admiral 1792" I came across - Governor Hunter's Assignment List. This being the Return of convict women in the services of Officers or other Households 1798 (AONSW ref:SZ767 pp.155 - 157, COD 197).

According to this document a Government Order was issued on 7 November 1798 requesting that "every Officer or other Housekeeper in the Colony who may have women servants in their Family" immediately forward the names of such as they employ in their respective Families.

There was no response from any Hawkesbury residents, which indicates that the resulting report is incomplete. Some convict women, for example, Martha Eaton (arr 1788), would have already served their time by 1798 but are still noted on the report, thus they were still consider convicts.

Fourteen of the eighty seven women were recorded as "wife of", whilst my research shows that twenty five were actually married to their employer and nine were in a defacto relationship at the time of the report.

Sarah Greggs is listed as Nurse to Lieutenant Lucas at Norfolk Island, when she was actually the mother of his three children. Was 'Nurse' used to disguise their true relationship.

Only one women seems to be recorded by her married name - Margaret Joiner nee Metcalfe who arrived on the Royal Admiral 1792.

I have included variations to the spelling of names found in numerous records and I have added corrections when my research has proved the information incorrect, for example Mary Parker, wife of George Small, has been corrected to John Small.

In some instances it has proven impossible to came to a final decision particularly in the case of common names: there were five Sarah Smith's in the colony in 1798 and after researching all five I am still unable to prove which one was a servant to Captain John Macarthur.

Women were not held in high regard in 1798 and convict women even less status. However they were pioneers who made the colony survive and expand thorough their own efforts and those of their children.

- 3. 1798 Britannia 12/7/1797 Middlesex.

A Conditional Pardon was given to a Elizabeth Allen on 12/12/1794.

- 1. Elizabeth Allen 1791 Mary Ann married Abraham Martin 10/3/1792 St Phillips Sydney.
- 2. Elizabeth Allen nee Walker (Royal Admiral 1792) FBS married John Bolger Sydney 1805.
- 3. Elizabeth Allen 1800 was with Joseph Taylor. Elizabeth Allen gave birth to a son John in 1796 with Charles Grimes recorded as the father. This leads to the conclusion that the Elizabeth with Grimes in 1798 is Elizabeth from the Royal Admiral 1792.

Charles Grimes is recorded as Surveyor 1795+ at Parramatta. Elizabeth Hill also assigned to Grimes.

**ANDERSON, Margaret**. William Skinner. 1796 Indispensable 8/10/1793 Southampton 7 years. Age 28 yrs.

Married William Skinner 17/10/1796 St Johns Parramatta. Margaret d. 1819 Aged 55. St Lukes Liverpool.

William Skinner - Convict - arr Neptune. Landowner Liverpool.

#### ATKINSON, Elizabeth.

Capt Thomas Rowley. NSW Corps. 1798 Britannia 11/10/1797 Lancaster 7 years. Age 38 yrs. Some records gives name as Betty. 1800 Elizabeth was with Thomas Tollis. Thomas Rowley arr Pitt 1792.

BISHOP, Mary. Harry Carson NSW Corps. Mary Davis Shrewsbury 12/3/1785. A death sentence was commuted to 7 years transportation. Mary arr 26/1/1788 on the Lady Penrhyn under the name of Davis. She married Samuel Day 2/11/1788 Sydney Cove using the name of Mary Bishop. Witnesses were William Cross and Samual Wheeler.

Samuel Day was also a convict who arrived on the Alexander in 1788 14 years.

Mary Bishop is to be found in the records using both Bishop and Davis. Mary Bishop is not to be confused with Mary Bolton. They both arrived on the Lady Penrhyn 26/1/1788 also both women were associated with Samuel Day.

Mary Davis arr Norfolk Island 1790 and left on 9/3/1793 whilst there she gave birth to daughter in July 1791. This child appears on Victualling lists as Mary Davis but later uses the name Charlotte Bishop.

In 1806 Mary Bishop is recorded as being in Port Jackson working at Government House and having a daughter.

Meanwhile Samuel Day was back at Norfolk Island and now with Mary Bolton. This relationship had started back in 1791. Samuel Day and Mary Bolton left Norfolk Island in 1813.

Mary Bishop is recorded as being a House keeper to Joseph Martin in 1828 and living with her was her grandson Alexander Crabb.

Mary Bishop went to live with her daughter Charlotte Bishop who had married Richard Shrimpton. Mary died 1/1/1839 at Kurrajong bu. St Peters Richmond.

This is a common burial plot with her daughter Charlotte Bishop. Charlotte Bishop had several marriages.

BOND, Sarah. William Brodie. 1793 Bellona 23/5/1792 London 7 years. Sarah married William Jenner or Janners in November 1802 Norfolk Island. The muster of Norfolk Island February 1805 gives both William Jenners and Sarah Bond on Stores. Sarah died on Norfolk Island and was died 15/4/1805. Some records give 18/4/1805 as death date.

## BRIGGS, Elizabeth.

Wife Corporal George Pitt NSW Corps. Biggs 1794 Surprise 25/5/1793 Middlesex 7 years. Biggs Elizabeth married George Angus Pitt 3/10/1796 St Phillips Sydney. Children:-

**BRYAN, Judith.** Henry Neale. Brien Judy. 1797 Britannia 1/7/1796 Dublin City 7 years. 1800 Living at Seven Hills with Henry Neale.

BRYAN, Mary. Bryan Egan.
Several possible Mary Bryan/Brian/Brien.
Bryan Egan arr Britannia 1796 Summer 1795
Longford life. Age 32 years. Noting on the same ship was a Mary Bryan Summer 1794 Cork 7 years also a Mary Brien arr Britannia 1798.

BRYAN, Mary. Wife to George Patfield. 1793 Bellona 22/8/1791 Exeter 7 years. Stealing goods (cotton gown and petticoat). Mary O'Brien (Brian/Bryan) was nearly 20 years old at the time of her arrival in Sydney Cove. She was actually listed to join the Royal Admiral in May 1792 but for some reason Mary actual boarded the Bellona at Deptford from Newgate Prison. Mary Brian married George Patfield at St John's Parramatta on 19/5/1793.

George himself was also a convict. Arr 1790 Neptune. Tried 17/3/1788 at Taunton Somerset theft 7yrs transportation. They settled at Eastern Farms in 1789 where their young family grew up in the new colony at Kissing Point. George Patfield died 11/10/1809 leaving Mary to raise their young family.

Mary passed away 28/4/1853 at Ryde aged 85 years. Abode is recorded as Hunter Hill. She was buried in the Church grounds at St Anne's Ryde on 30/4/1853.

Temporary in Service to Serg Flemming NSW Corps. 1791 Mary Ann 23/3/1790 Warwick 7 years. 1801 Expired convict living at Sydney Cove. Ann Burdock m. 1811 St Phillips John Holdsworth.. 1822 Ann was living at Windsor wife to John Holsworth.

#### BURLEIGH, Eliza Thomas Arndel.

Eliza: abbreviation for Elizabeth.

Elizabeth Burley arr 26/1/1788 Lady Penrhyn under the name Dalton. Tried 1785 7 years for Stealing.

Thomas Arndell was the Colony's Assistant Surgeon and later was a magistrate. Spelling as found on assignment list and other records. Arr 26/1/1788 Friendship.

Elizabeth had a child to John Clements - Frances Hannah b. 21/1/1788 Botany Bay. She was conceived and born on the voyage of the First Fleet. bap. 20/4/1788 Sydney Cove. d.20/1/1800 Cattai. Frances was therefore the youngest first fleeter to arrive in the colony in 1788. Elizabeth Burley married Thomas Arndell c.1805/6. The Australian IGI gives us a marriage year only as 1792 Windsor Cattai.

Whilst *Founding Mothers* (Page 102) by Helen Heney mentions this relationship as a de-facto only. Both are incorrect:-

After Thomas Arndell died in 1821 Rev Samual Marsden signed a Stat.Dec saying that he married them in 1807: this was when Elizabeth was applying for a pension.

A family member states that they were married between the births of their 6th and 7th children. She also has a document dated 1806 that they were married.

Elizabeth d. Jan 1843 Aged 75 yrs. Buried St Mathews Windsor with headstone noting her as the wife of Thomas.

Thomas arr 1788 Friendship, he died 2/5/1821 Cattai Windsor buried St Mathew's CE Windsor aged 74yrs.

Thomas and Elizabeth lived at Parramatta until 1799 at which time they began farming land at Cattai. Thomas's land grant is dated 1804. Children:-

COCKS, Mary. Thomas Jones. Nil result on convict indents. No record of Mary Cocks was found in any records apart from the 1798 Assignment Report. Several Thomas Jones's in the Colony. Eg. Thomas Jones and his wife Elizabeth who murdered Samuel Clode on 2nd July 1799. John Elbery an ex - convict was also involved. All 3 were excuted Samuel Clode was a missionary who left London on the Duff. He was an assistant to Surgeon Harris. Thomas Jones and Samuel Clode had actually attended School together back in Ireland.

**CRESWELL, Mary.** Serg Major Jamieson. 1798 Britannia 15/8/1797 Hereford 7 years. Age 22 yrs. Arrived with younger sister Susannah, who was also tried on 15/8/1797 Hereford 7 years. Age 20 yrs. Susannah buried 11/4/1799 Convict.

In 1800 Mary was in Sydney with Ambrose McQuigen. Mary Creswell married George Wilson 1817 St Johns Parramatta.

**DAWSON, Margaret.** William Balmain. 1788 Lady Penrhyn 10/1/1787 Stealing 7 years. William Balmain Principal Surgeon arr 1788 Alexander. Margaret returned to England with William who died in 1803, she inherited his estate even though not legally married. Children:-

**DILLON, Anne.** In service of Richard Dore. 1798 Britannia 12/7/1797 Middlesex 7 years. Age 40 yrs. 1800 in Sydney with J Morton. Richard Dore - Judge Advocate had received his commission on 9/9/1797 following the resignation of Collins who deliberately stepped down so that a appointment could be made. Dore was a lawyer by profession and died 13/12/1800 Sydney and buried 15/12/1800.

EATON, Martha. Edward Jones. 1788 Lady Penrhyn Receiving stolen goods 7 years 25 yrs old. Martha married Edward Jones 23/3/1788 Sydney Cove as Martha Beddingfield, this being one of the first marriages in the colonies. Witnesses to marriage were Ann Reed and E B Perrott. Edward Jones arr 1788 Alexander Stealing. Left wife and children in England?? Martha died 1817. Children:-

A Katherine Evans "convict" was buried 26/10/1796 (Kitty) who was possible married to Thomas Galvin. Catherine Evans from Royal Admiral 1792 is recorded as a Widow in early censuses. In 1822 Catherine Evans (Royal Admiral 2 1800?) was recorded as a lodger in Sydney with Thomas Palmer.

**EVANS, Sarah.** Wife to James Stewart. 1790 Neptune 1/7/1786 Denbingshire 7 years. Married 18/12/1791 St Johns Parramatta. John Robinson witness. James Stewart arr 1788 Scarborough. Tried 1784 Stealing. James died November 1806. 30 acres 11/11/1794 Eastern Farms. The Sarah Evans 1791 Mary Anne 29/9/1879 Worcester married J Casher and they had settled in Windsor before 1822.

FARLEY, Anne. Mathews Kearens.
Anne Farrelly - 1793 Sugar Cane 4/1791
Co.Cavan Life capitally committed. Age 20 yrs.
In 1801 Anne was living in Sydney noted as a expired convict. Mathew Kearns Landowner Pitts Row Port Jackson 1803 - 1810.

## FARRELL, Catherine.

Lieut Shortland Royal Navy. 1796 Marquis Cornwallis 21/3/1794 Limerick 7 years. Age 34 yrs. 1801 Catherine Farrel off stores expired convict in Sydney Cove.

**FLYNN, Mary**. John Sheaffisheiman. ?? 1792 Kitty Stealing Linen. Husband and children were left behind in England. 1800 living Parammatta with John Burcham.

FORD, Eliza James Williamson. Elizabeth Ford 1794 Surprize 20/2/1793 iddlesex. Age 23 yrs 4' 6" tall. 1801 Elizabeth was noted as an expired convict living in Sydney. Ann Wilson also assigned to Williamson. James Williamson was the acting Commissary return to England on the Buffalo in August 1800 (Collins Vol 2 Page 214).

FORD, Mary.In service Captain George Johnston. 1798 Britannia 26/4/1797 Somerset 7 years. Wife of Thomas Age 24 yrs. In 1800 Mary was with Richard Fitzgerald at Toonagabbie. Mary married Richard Fitzgerald of Windsor in 1815 St Mathews Windsor and was a resident in Windsor still in 1822. Children:-

GREGGS, Sarah. Nurse to Lieut Lucas. Sarah Griggs 1790 Neptune 13/10/1788 Kent 7 years. James Lucas Arr 1790 Ensign NSW Corps. James died 22/8/1800 Norfolk Island.Children:-

Ann Hall convict received her Absolute Pardon on 4/6/1800. This is most likely Ann Hall of the Britannia.

HARRIMAN, Elizabeth. Serg Maven NSW Corps. NR Convict Indents under Harriman. However this Elizabeth may be Elizabeth Hardyman arr 1790 Lady Juliana 22/4/1789 Middlesex. Her issue:-Mary Maria Hardiman. bap. 19/7/1791 St Phillips Sydney. Fa. Reputed to be William Blackburn of the NSW Corps. Mo. Elizabeth Hardiman. Possible Serg Haven. of the NSW Corps. Enlisted in London 1789.

**HARRISON**, **Elizabeth**. John Cullund. Two possible:-

- 1. 1794 Surprize 12/9/1792 Middlesex 14 years. 1800 this Elizabeth was with Collins.
- 2. 1796 Indispensable 15/4/1795 Middlesex 7 years. Aged 36 yrs.

HAYDON, Mary. William Yardley. NR Convict Indents. William Yardley Surprize Conditional Pardon 7/7/1797. William Yardley (Yearly) married Catherine Edwards (Everett) 7/11/1796 St Johns Parramatta.

HENSLEY, Maria. Rev. Samuel Marsden. NR Convict Indent. John Arnel m. Maria Hensley 17/4/1797. St Johns Parramatta. Children:1. Esther Arnel 9/3/1797. Bap. 2/4/1797. St Johns Parramatta. John Arne(I) arr Surprize.

HILL, Elizabeth. In service Charles Grimes. 1796 Indispensable 8/3/1794 Lincoln. 1803 living on Chapel Row Sydney whilst in 1822 she was a lodger at Mrs Arkell in Sydney. Children:-

This gives us two Ann Wilson in the colonies at the time of the Assignment Report. The Royal Admiral 1792 Ann is most likely Ann Willson mother of John Willson b. 6/6/1793. Bap. 15/9/1793 St Phillips Sydney.

Father of this child is recorded as Robert Rhodes. The 1796 Indispensable Ann Wilson married Thomas Colley 9/10/1796 St Phillips Sydney. Thomas Colley arrived on the 1792 Royal Admiral. Children:-

- 1. Ann Colley. B. 25/6/1797 Sydney Cove. Bap. 16/7/1797 St Phillips Sydney Cove. Died 17/11/1797 Sydney.
- 2. Sarah b. possible 1806 Sydney. Ann Wilson received a conditional pardon on 4/7/1800. This is most likely the Ann Wilson of the 1796 Indispensable who is listed as a free convict in 1802 at Norfolk Island as Thomas Colley's wife. James Williamson was the acting Commissary return to England on the Buffalo in August 1800 (Collins Vol 2 Page 214). Eliza Ford also assigned to Williamson.

WOOD, Jane. A widow with 3 children. Is Wood her maiden name or married name? Did she marry here in the Colonies or back in England and brought her children out to Australia with her??? There are very references to her along with being careful as to her common name.

1800 records show Jane Wood as arriving on the Pitt. A Jane Wood married Thomas Wilson in 1801 Parramatta.

1814 Muster Jane Wood Widow Royal Admiral 1792. There were 4 Janes who arrived on the Royal Admiral in 1792.

**WOOLLEY, Elizabeth**. William Kentwell. No shipping indent could be found. Kentwell arr Admiral Barrington.
