### 'White identity' lecture Feb. 28

The Poly Christian Fellowship club is hosting a speaker on the topic of "white identity" and positive race relations **Monday, Feb. 28, at 7 p.m.** in Chumash Auditorium. Author, writer and speaker Doug Schaupp will give the talk with a question-and-answer time to follow. Schaupp is the Southern California regional director for InterVarsity Christian Fellowship and co-author of "Being White: Finding our Place in a Multiethnic World." Schaupp will speak about a Christian perspective and discuss roles white people have in working toward racial reconciliation and a more just society. The title of his talk is "Finding White Identity: A Christian Perspective on White Culture and Race."

### Beat Museum rolls in Monday

The Beat Museum on Wheels will roll into campus on **Monday, Feb. 28**, with writer and musician John Allen Cassady on board. He'll talk about his famous father, Neal Cassady, and Beat Generation writers Jack Kerouac and Allen Ginsberg. Cassady will speak at **7 p.m.** in the Spanos Theater as part of the traveling show, "This is The Beat Generation!" Cassady will play piano, guitar and tell stories.

The multimedia event will include photographs and video clips, as well as readings by poet, actor and playwright Garland Thompson Jr. The "Beat Mobile" will be parked on campus next to Dexter Lawn **all afternoon on Feb. 28**. Visitors can view books, posters, videos, listen to recordings and talk to the speakers as part of the traveling Beat Museum.

The free show is sponsored by the College of Liberal Arts, the Consortium for the Arts and Media (CAM), the Women's Center and Pride Alliance Multicultural Center, the WriterSpeak program, as well as Corners of the Mouth/The SLO Poetry Festival.
