Spring Commencement

More than 3,600 students are set to graduate in two ceremonies at Spring Commencement June 11. The morning ceremony begins at 9 a.m., and the afternoon ceremony begins at 3 p.m. Both ceremonies will be held in Mustang Stadium.

Cal Poly President Warren J. Baker recognized the College of Science and Mathematics and Career Services as the recipients of the 2005 President's Diversity Award. The College of Science and Mathematics was honored for reaching out to minority students in California's public elementary, middle and high schools. Career Services was recognized for its efforts during the Winter Job Fair, where more than \$18,000 was raised for scholarships and programming in support of diversity. The department also sponsored a breakfast for students and employers to meet and talk about diversity efforts offered by various participating companies.

Commencement parking and traffic information

- The C-7 parking lot on California Boulevard will be reserved for disabled parking. The lot will be closed to parking from 5 p.m., Friday, June 10, until 5 p.m., Saturday, June 11.
- North Perimeter Road will not be accessible from California Boulevard on June 11 from 7 a.m.-5 p.m.
- There will be limited parking on the California Boulevard side of campus. Visitors are encouraged to use Highland Drive to access the H-12, H-14 and H-16 parking lots and Grand Avenue to access the G-1, G-2 parking lots and parking structure.
- From 11:45 a.m.-12:45 p.m., Via Carta Road north of Highland Drive will be one-way traffic to expedite vehicles leaving campus. There will be no through traffic on Via Carta south of Highland throughout the day.
- City and regional bus service will not operate on June 11.

A shuttle service will be provided from 7 a.m.-7 p.m. Shuttles will pick up passengers at the H-1 parking lot on Mt. Bishop Road and on Via Carta Road adjacent to the Campus Market. Shuttles will drop passengers off on California Boulevard in the C-7 parking lot. The pickup areas for return shuttles will be on South Perimeter Road at the bus stops adjacent to Mott Gym and across from the Graphic Arts Building. Shuttles will return guests to the H-1 parking lot, the Campus Market and California Boulevard at the C-7 parking lot.

Three selected for Outstanding Staff Award

Three employees were chosen to receive the 2004-2005 Outstanding Staff Award: Sharon Arnold, administrative analyst/specialist in the College of Science and Mathematics; Prisila Johnson, administrative support coordinator in Food Science and Nutrition; and Dan Mull, information technology consultant in ITS-Media Distribution Services. Remember to pick up your new PolyCard

New PolyCards are available for pickup Monday-Friday, from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. in the Lighthouse Atrium (Bldg. 19) on an ongoing basis until all cards have been replaced or destroyed. Faculty, staff, emeritus employees and all non-graduating students are asked to bring their current PolyCard as a form of identification at time of pickup. OCS migration to continue through summer

Migration of the campus community to the new Oracle Collaboration Suite (OCS) e-mail system is under way and will continue through the summer term. Those not yet migrated will be sent an initial instructional e-mail telling them what to do before and after migration.

To prepare for migration, visit <http://email.calpoly.edu/migration/> and click on "What to Expect Before, During and After the Migration." Users will receive three additional informational e-mail messages before their scheduled migration date. When migrated, individuals can access e-mail using the Web application on the campus portal at <http://my.calpoly.edu>.

In order to access e-mail using a desktop application, such as Microsoft Outlook, users will need to change their settings to point their application to the new system. To change settings, visit <http://email.calpoly.edu/> and select the appropriate application option under "Email Setup."

For help with a desktop application setup, contact your LAN coordinator or call the ITS Service Desk at ext. 6-7000; select option 1. LAN coordinators and ITS assistants will be available at the start of fall quarter to help answer setup questions and resolve migration issues, especially for faculty and staff who were away during the summer and unable to complete the process until fall.
