INTRODUCTION

The Independent Colleges and Universities of Florida (ICUF) accountability process was initiated in 1994 in consultation with the Postsecondary Education Planning Commission (PEPC) in response to Florida Statute 240.147. The Statute required all independent postsecondary institutions eligible for the Florida Resident Access Grant (FRAG) to develop accountability processes. This is the 12th cycle of reporting by ICUF institutions. The statute requiring this report was eliminated when the Florida Department of Education was reorganized in the 2001-2002 fiscal year.

The Florida legislature recently developed a series of performance measures largely focused on outcomes of students receiving the FRAG or other types of state funding. Although no longer required by statute, this “accountability” report contains information proven to be valuable to legislators, and provides essential context for any accountability process. It also provides an important resource for other ICUF constituencies. Therefore, this information will continue to be collected and published by ICUF in the future, even though it is no longer required by the State of Florida.

This Accountability Report contains a summary of data provided by institutions that are members of ICUF. Other regionally accredited independent institutions that are not members of ICUF, and nonregionally accredited proprietary institutions are not included.

Institutions are grouped by the types of degrees they offer (i.e., bachelor’s, master’s, and doctorate). Although this provides a convenient way to group institutions, it should not be assumed that institutions in each group have the same missions, or are directly comparable in their characteristics. It must be emphasized that the ICUF institutions are diverse: they differ from each other in details of their mission, characteristics of the student body, degree offerings, etc. Therefore, it should not be assumed that data for one ICUF institution is comparable to that of another, or to one of the Florida public universities.

The report is intended to address broad issues of quality, productivity, diversity, and access. Initially, the majority of data contained in the Accountability Report focused on *undergraduate* students, faculty, and programs. Over the years a variety of additional data have been added to the report to provide a broader context in which to become familiar with the contributions of ICUF institutions. For example, data on race/ethnicity, and gender of Florida resident enrolled students and degree recipients were added to demonstrate the access to higher education provided by ICUF institutions to Florida students from racial/ethnic minorities, and women. Data on enrollments by selected fields of study were added to demonstrate that ICUF trains students for entry or advancement in areas of the workforce that are of special interest in Florida.

While undergraduates are of particular interest to federal and state legislators, it should not be forgotten that many ICUF institutions also offer a variety of master’s, doctoral, and first-professional degree programs. The latter contribute significantly to the overall quality of institutions. Accordingly, substantial data concerning graduate and first-professional students were added to the report to demonstrate the significant contribution made by ICUF institutions in educating professionals with advanced degrees.

Furthermore, addition of data on the number of Florida residents served by member institutions makes it possible for state agencies and other constituencies to gauge the contribution made by ICUF institutions in educating Florida residents. Student demographics demonstrate service to

racial/ethnic minorities and women, and data such as the number of degrees awarded provide measures of institutional and independent sector productivity. Regional, professional, and special accreditations of ICUF institutions resulted from thorough external reviews, and provide strong evidence of the overall quality of ICUF institutions.

Where similar data were available, comparisons were made between aggregate data for the ICUF *sector* versus aggregate data for the State University System of Florida (SUS) *sector*. Comparing aggregate data at the *sector-level* should normalize to some extent for some of the differences among institutions cited above. For example, at the sector level, the racial/ethnic demographics of faculty are similar for ICUF and the SUS. The intent is to provide some type of context in which to interpret the data and evaluate the contribution the ICUF group of institutions makes to higher education in Florida.

Notes on Methodology

In keeping with the spirit of the original statute, and to reduce the reporting burden on institutions, data from required federal reports were used whenever possible. For example, portions of the report present data taken directly from various reports required by the U.S. Department of Education for maintenance of the national Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS).

A detailed description of the methodology used to generate the data is published separately in the *ICUF Guidelines for Institutional Data Reports*. This 30 page manual helps assure that data definitions, data collection methods, and calculations are uniform across all contributing institutions. The manual is accompanied by a diskette containing spreadsheets for data entry. Institutions are given the option of recording data in electronic files, or manually using forms included in the guidelines. All but a few institutions choose the electronic option.

Much of the data describing undergraduate students focuses on cohorts of full-time students that entered college for the first time at an ICUF institution in the fall 1998. Cohorts were constructed using the methodology and criteria prescribed by the federal Student Right-to-Know Act, and detailed in the IPEDS Graduation Rate Survey.

Racial/ethnic data for faculty were collected using methods and criteria prescribed in the IPEDS Fall Staff Survey that institutions submit to the U.S. Department of Education. Similarly, data concerning institutional enrollments were obtained from data appearing in 2005 IPEDS Enrollment Survey.

Data on enrollments by field of study group enrollment by all majors classified by the institution under one of the five CIP codes included here (i.e., 11, computer and information sciences; 13, education; 14, engineering; 51.16, nursing; and 52, business). The 2000 Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) was used. With the exception of nursing, fields of study were defined using the first two digits of the CIP code. Consequently, each field of study may include multiple majors offered by an institution. For example, CIP 52, business may include several subfields, such as business administration, accounting, finance, marketing, etc.

The number of degrees awarded came from the 2004-2005 IPEDS Completions Survey. Data on rates of graduation came from the IPEDS Graduation Rate Survey. None of the other data in the report could be obtained from any existing federal or other reports routinely prepared by institutions.

Unless noted otherwise, the latest comparative data available for SUS institutions came from either the Florida Board of Education's Web site at www.fldcu.org/factbbook/default.asp, or from the National Center for Education Statistics Peer Analysis System at <http://nces.ed.gov/ipedspas/>. Fall 2005 SUS enrollment data, and degrees awarded during the period July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005 were used for comparison with ICUF data.

Note that occasionally the data expressed as percentages may not add to exactly 100 percent. The variance of ± 1 percent in these cases is due to rounding to whole numbers.

OVERVIEW

The Independent Colleges and Universities of Florida (ICUF) are a diverse group of 28 institutions with different missions, serving diverse student populations, and offering a wide variety of undergraduate, graduate, and first-professional programs. They are dispersed throughout the state located in or near large cities, such as Miami, Fort Lauderdale, Jacksonville, and Tampa, as well as in more rural areas of Florida. Several institutions date back to the 1800s, while some others are relatively young, opening their doors to students as recently as 1992.

Total enrollments at ICUF institutions range from approximately 100 to 26,000 students. The total enrollment for ICUF increased 2.9 percent compared to fall 2004. The ICUF group includes institutions that offer majors in liberal arts and sciences, business, fine arts, as well as engineering and technical fields. The group includes both religious- and nonreligious-affiliated institutions, as well as several historically black institutions.

This report attempts to identify key data elements that may provide indicators of attributes such as racial/ethnic diversity, broad access to educational opportunities and to specific majors or fields of study, educational quality, and institutional productivity. Some of these attributes are more amenable to quantitative measurement than others. In particular, quality of education cannot be measured or characterized solely by quantitative criteria. A fundamental definition of academic quality has been a subject of much debate in academia spanning many decades. Nevertheless, regional and specialized accreditations provide an important quality assurance process to protect the public.

The Florida Board of Education's Web site, Fact Books of the State University System of Florida, and the IPEDS Peer Analysis System provided excellent sources of data for limited comparisons of SUS statistics with those of the ICUF institutions. ICUF institutions were comparable to the SUS in areas such as the diversity of faculty, and three-year graduation rates of full-time associate's degree students that transferred to ICUF institutions. However, ICUF institutions had a higher proportion of students from racial/ethnic minorities than the SUS. Comparative data were not readily available for a variety of other types of data contained in this report.

Several outstanding strengths of ICUF institutions emerged from examination of data contained in this report:

Access to Higher Education

One of the ways that ICUF institutions complement the institutions of the SUS is by providing access to a wide array of fields of study. ICUF institutions offer some programs not available in the SUS, and others that provide student access to particular majors or fields of study that are space-limited in the SUS. For example, with few exceptions, ICUF institutions admitted 100% of students transferring from Florida Community Colleges with an associate's degree into the undergraduate program of their choice.

ICUF institutions also provide greater access to students from racial/ethnic minorities at all degree levels. When data for Florida residents attending ICUF institutions are compared with the SUS where 91 percent of enrolled students are Florida residents, ICUF institutions admit and graduate significantly higher proportions of students from minorities. The proportion of

Florida resident students from minorities enrolled in ICUF institutions at all degree levels in fall 2005 was 26 percent higher than at SUS institutions (i.e., 44 percent minorities versus 35 percent in the SUS).

Small Class Sizes

Eighty-eight percent of all fall 2005 undergraduate classes at ICUF institutions had fewer than 30 students and 95 percent of all classes contained fewer than 40 students. Compared to the SUS, ICUF institutions had smaller mean undergraduate class sizes. Sector-wide, the mean class size was 19 and individual ICUF institution means ranged from 9 to 32 students. Moreover, the single largest class at any ICUF institution in fall 2005 was 412 students (range 14-412), substantially smaller than the largest classes at many SUS institutions.

Efficient Progression to Degree Completion

An area that has been problematic at Florida Community Colleges and the SUS was that many students were graduating with large numbers of credits over and above the minimum number needed to graduate. This increased students' length of stay, and the cost to state taxpayers. Both state systems have taken action to reduce this problem. SUS institutions have attempted to limit excess credits to less than 115 percent of the total credits required for graduation. For 120 credit programs, this translates to a maximum of 138 credits, or 18 credits more than needed for graduation.

As shown by data contained in this report, students graduated from ICUF institutions without a lot of extra credits in excess of the minimum required for graduation. On average, students graduated with only eight credits in excess of the minimum required to graduate. Mean total credits accrued at graduation by students at ICUF institutions were consistently well below the 115 percent ceiling set for the SUS. Moreover, a retrospective analysis of full-time freshmen that entered college for the first time at ICUF institutions in fall 1999 revealed that they graduated in a mean of 4.2 years. The mean time to degree at individual ICUF institutions ranged from 3.5 to six years.

Productivity in Degrees Awarded

The ratio of total undergraduate enrollment in fall 2005 to total bachelor's degrees awarded in 2004-2005 was approximately 5.1 for ICUF and 5.3 for the SUS, suggesting similar levels of productivity in the two sectors.

The ICUF institutions graduated a significantly higher proportion than the SUS of Florida resident students from racial/ethnic minorities at all award levels. For example, 41 percent of all degrees awarded by ICUF institutions were to Florida residents from minorities versus 31 percent in the SUS.

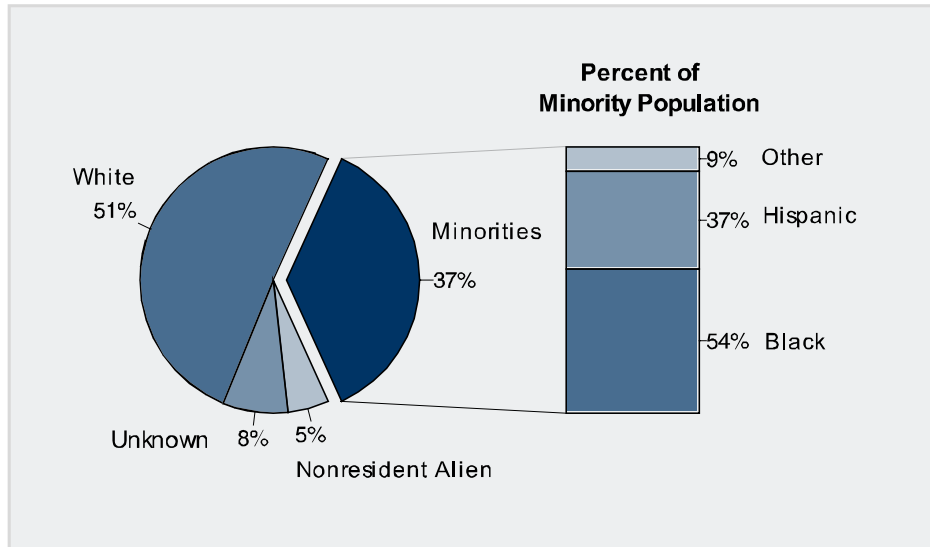

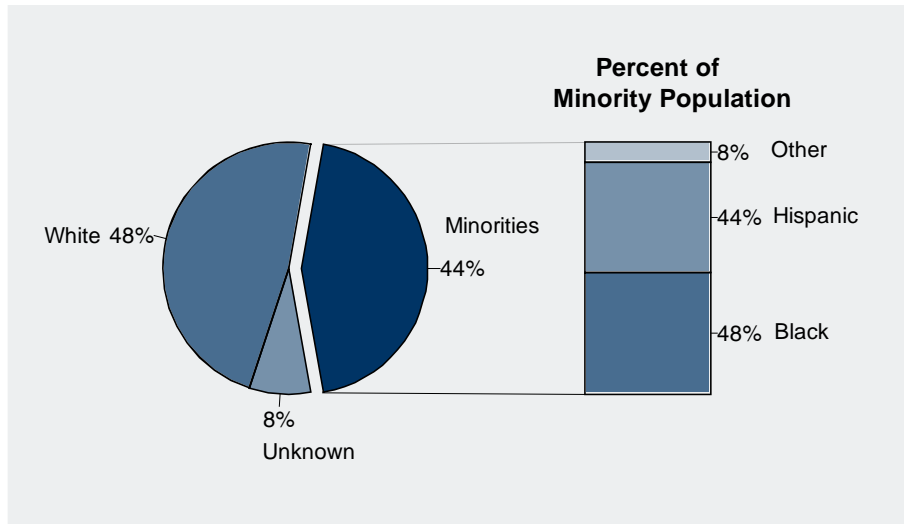

Fall 2005 Racial/Ethnic Distribution of Total Florida Resident Students Attending ICUF Institutions

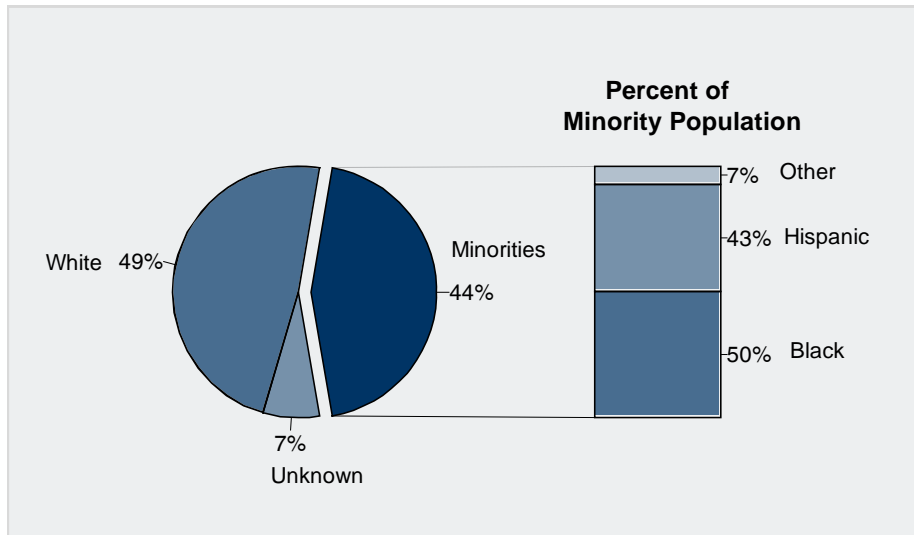

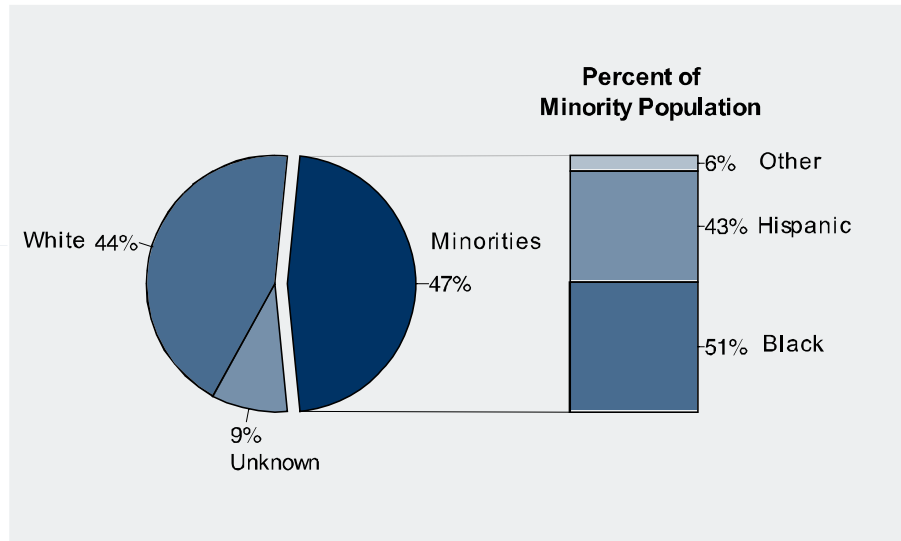

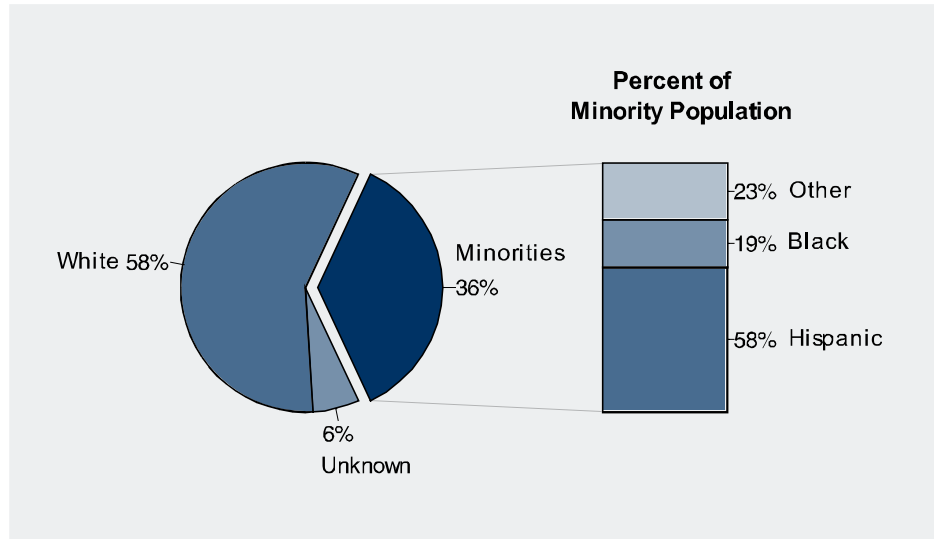

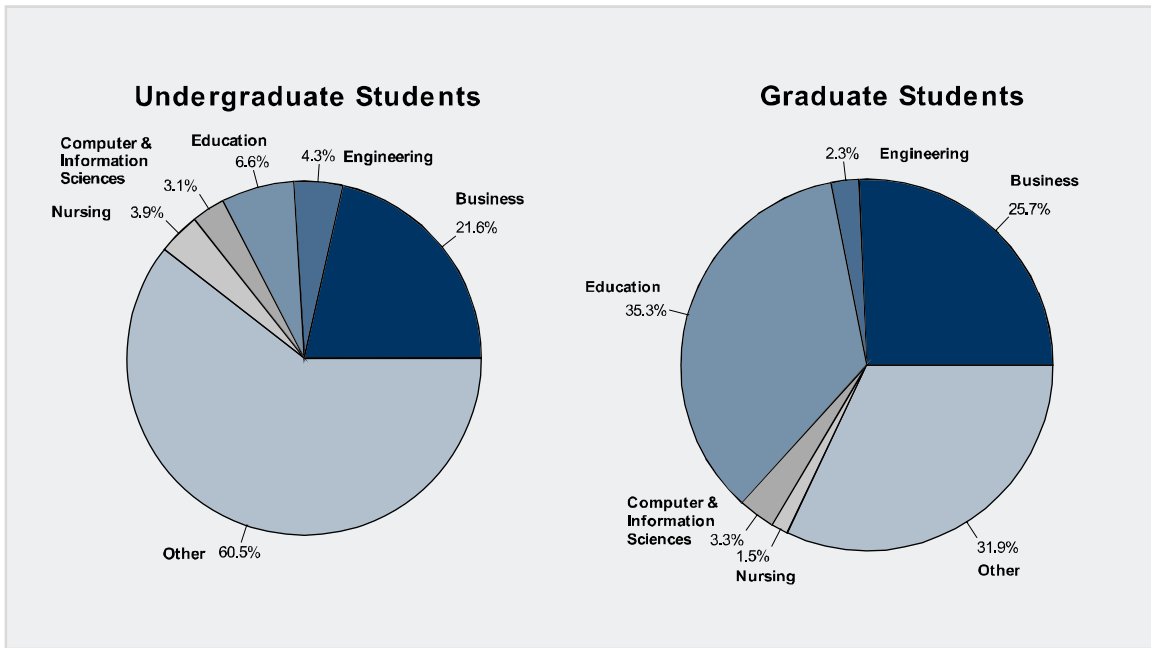

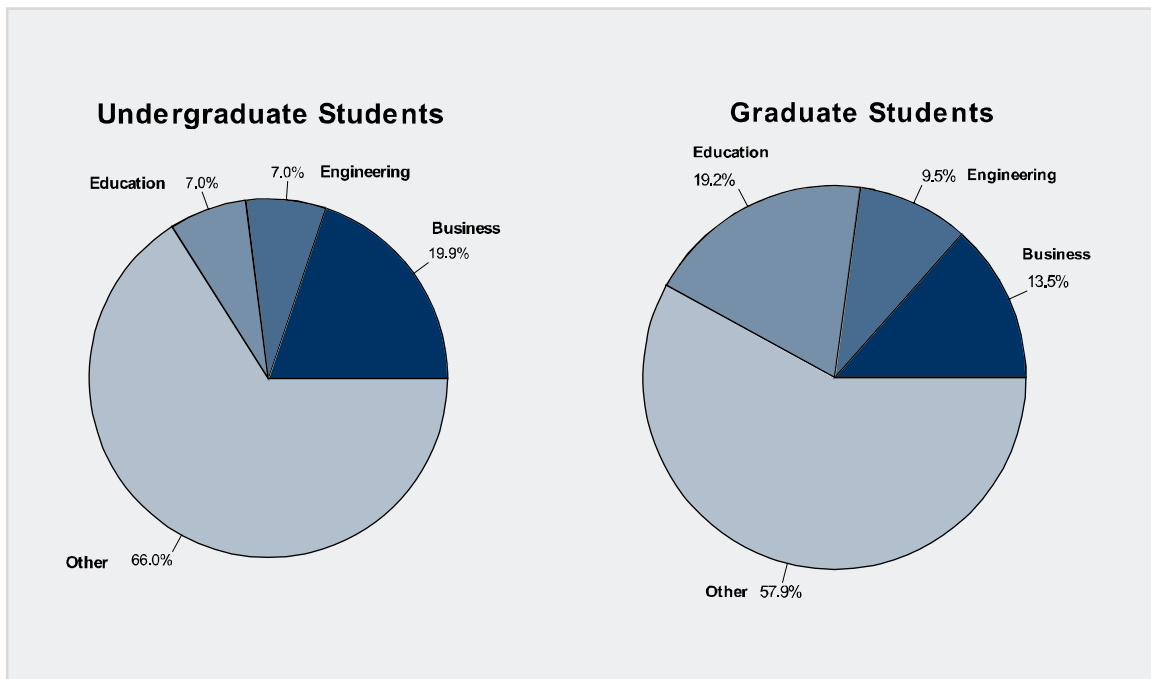

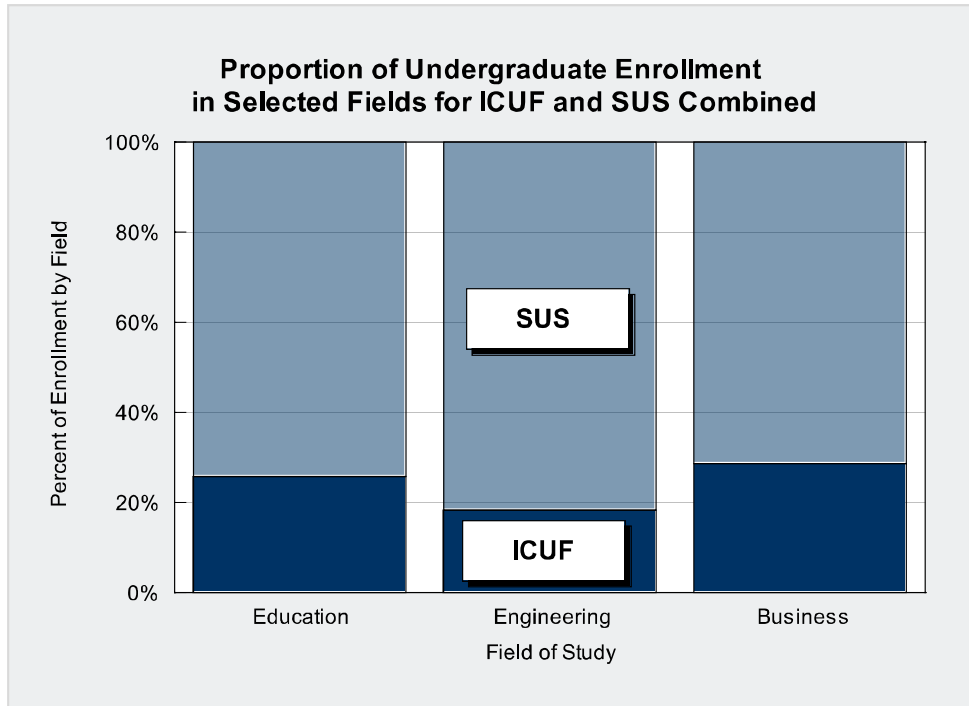

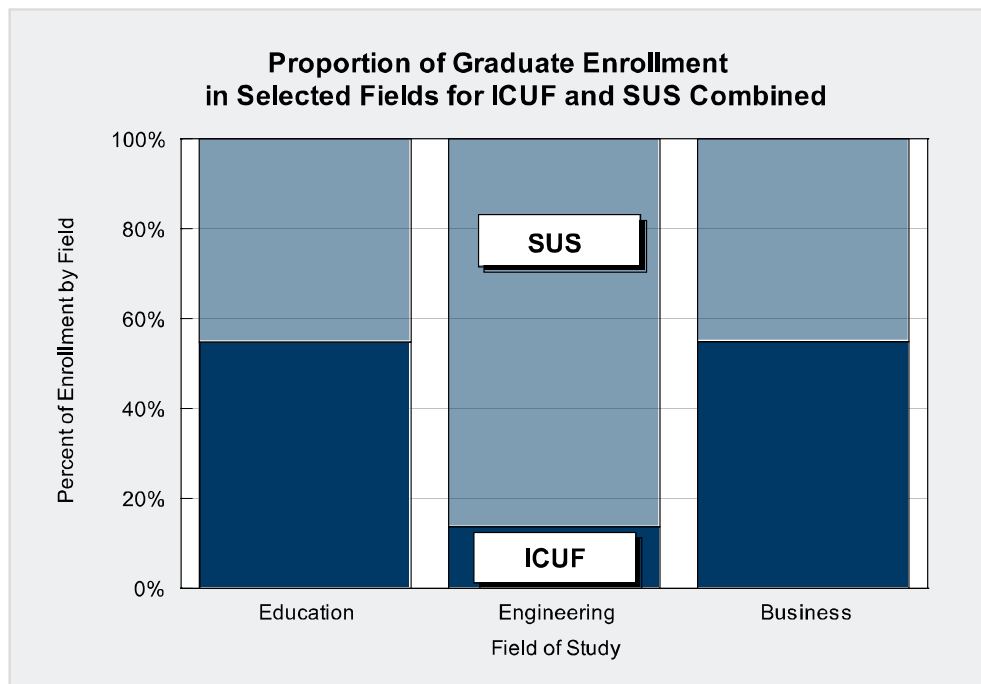

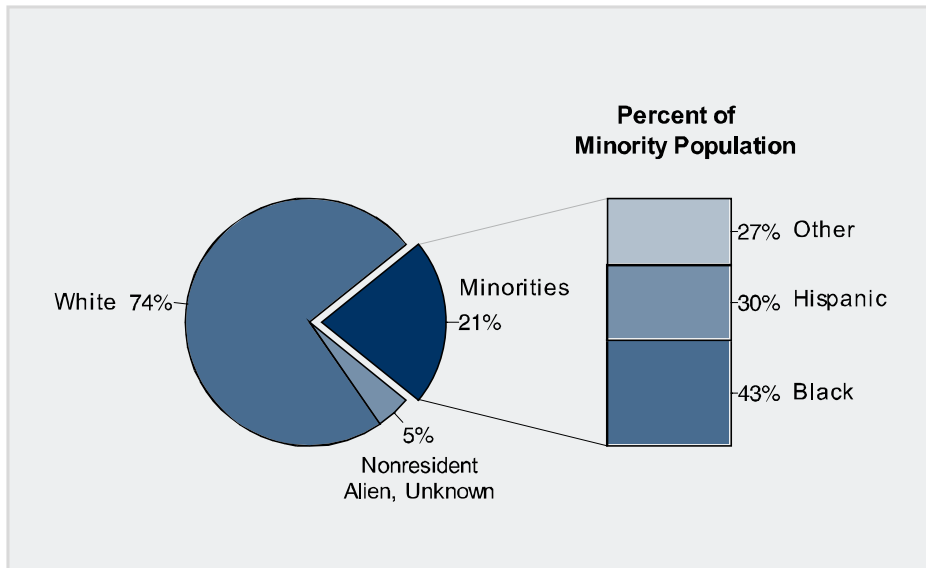

Fall 2005 Full-Time Faculty Undergraduate Teaching Loads

- > 67 percent of full-time faculty at ICUF institutions had undergraduate teaching loads of nine or more credits.
- > Approximately 81 percent of faculty at institutions offering the Master's as the highest degree taught course loads of nine or more credits.
- > Doctoral institutions had lower proportions of faculty with undergraduate teaching loads of nine or more credits (55 percent). Except for the University of Miami, institutions did not indicate whether these faculty also taught graduate courses or were engaged in research as part of their load. At the University of Miami, faculty teaching undergraduate courses may also teach graduate courses and do research.

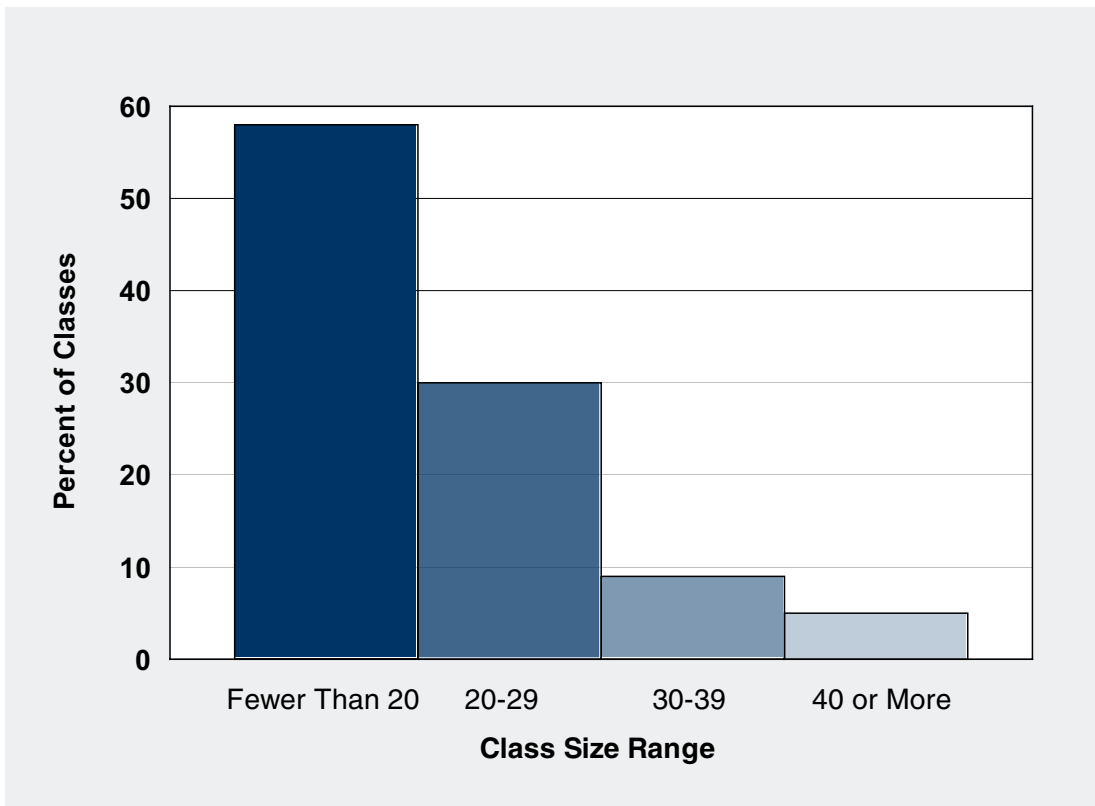
Undergraduate Class Size

One of the strengths and value-added benefits offered by ICUF institutions is small class sizes.

- > 58 percent of all undergraduate classes offered at ICUF institutions had fewer than 20 students.

- > 88 percent of all classes had fewer than 30 students and only five percent contained 40 or more students.

- > The three largest lower level undergraduate sections among all ICUF institutions contained 251, 343, and 412 students, respectively.

- > The single largest lower level undergraduate section at individual ICUF institutions ranged in size from 14-412 students. The median of the largest sections was 64 students. However, note that “large sections” represent a very small proportion of undergraduate classes at ICUF institutions.

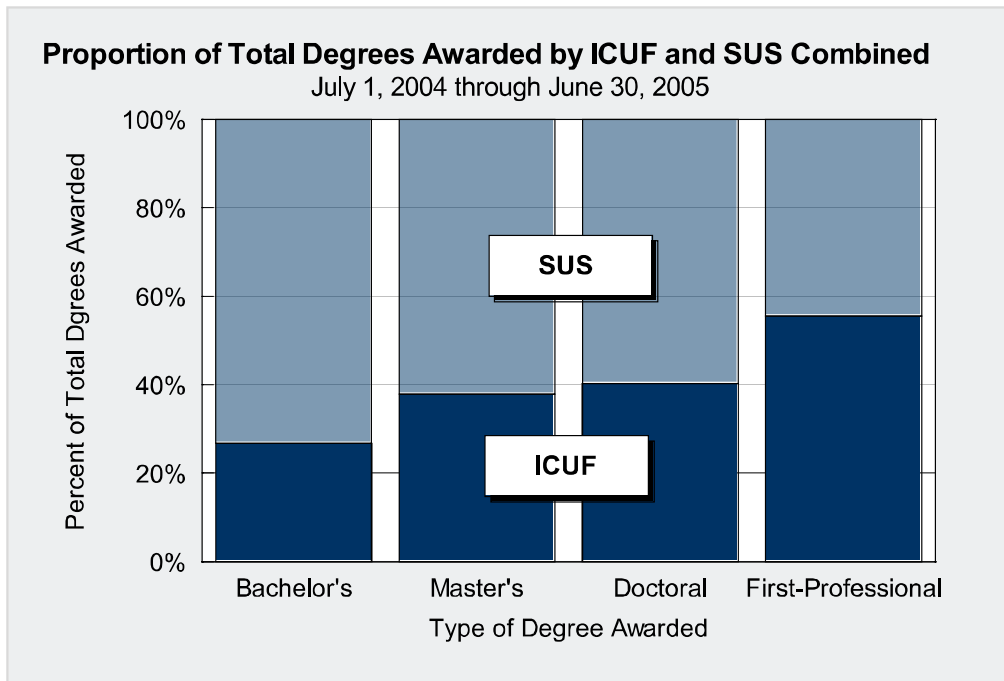
Proportion of Total Degrees Awarded by ICUF and the SUS



The ICUF institutions awarded approximately 29,000 degrees at all levels compared to approximately 60,000 degrees awarded by the SUS. The ICUF institutions awarded approximately 1,291 associate's degrees, 15,975 bachelor's degrees, and approximately 11,644 graduate and first-professional degrees during the period July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005.

This represents 27 percent of the total number of bachelor's degrees, 38 percent of the master's degrees, 40 percent of the doctoral degrees, and 55 percent of the first-professional degrees awarded by the SUS and ICUF *combined* (see Figure 10 below). Furthermore, bachelor's degrees in education awarded by ICUF institutions represented 25 percent of all such degrees awarded by ICUF and the SUS combined.

Also noteworthy is the fact that ICUF institutions awarded 25 percent more first-professional degrees than the entire SUS, and 55 percent of the first-professional degrees awarded annually by ICUF and the SUS combined. In addition, ICUF institutions offer first-professional degrees in a broader range of fields than the SUS. The latter offers professional degrees in medicine, pharmacy, dentistry, veterinary medicine, and law, while ICUF offers degrees in medicine, pharmacy, dentistry, optometry, podiatry, law, and ministry (D. Min.).

> ICUF institutions awarded approximately 29,000 degrees in 2004-2005, including 1,291 associate's, 15,975 bachelor's, 8,151 master's, 1,023 doctoral, and 1,973 first-professional degrees. In addition, five institutions awarded approximately 497 specialist degrees.

> 59 percent of all degrees awarded were undergraduate degrees. However, ICUF institutions also make an important contribution in awarding large numbers of graduate and first-professional degrees. For example, ICUF institutions awarded 25 percent more first-professional degrees than the entire SUS.

- > On average, students graduated with only eight credits (range 0-17 credits) in excess of the mean number needed to complete requirements.
- > Analysis of the student population that graduated within six years after entry revealed that students graduated in a mean of 4.2 years. The range of mean years to graduate was 3.5 to 6.0 years

Graduation and Persistence Rates for First-Time in College Full-Time Freshmen

The two tables that follow describe the racial/ethnic composition and rates of graduation and persistence for cohorts of first-time in college full-time freshmen that entered college in the fall 1999. Data were taken from the IPEDS Graduation Rate Survey.

It is difficult to make valid comparisons of the graduation rates of individual institutions. In order to do so, one must be able to identify institutions with very similar institutional and student characteristics. The ICUF member institutions and the SUS institutions vary considerably in their missions, the types of students served, racial/ethnic diversity, selectivity (i.e., admissions standards and requirements), the availability of remedial and/or academic support services, etc. Therefore, the reader should be cautious in attempting to evaluate the performance of a particular institution, or to compare institutions without this essential contextual information. The term “private” (independent) college or university sometimes elicits in the public visions of elite universities, such as Harvard, Yale, Princeton, etc. It is sometimes assumed that all or most “private” institutions are highly selective, elite institutions. In fact, the highly selective institutions are only a small percentage of the independent institutions nationally.

Generally speaking, institutions with the highest or most selective admissions standards/requirements will have the highest rates of graduation. For example, students with high SAT scores and high school GPAs usually are the best prepared to attend college and succeed. Therefore, a college that admits primarily high achieving students will likely have high rates of graduation.

In contrast, institutions with more liberal admission criteria place the emphasis on access and opportunity, and tend to have lower rates of graduation compared to their more selective counterparts. Typically, entering students with lower levels of achievement in high school require a lot of academic support services to succeed in college.

Aggregate rates of graduation and retention for ICUF institutions were compared with SUS institutions, using data from the Florida Department of Education. Data at the *sector-level* may to some extent normalize for variance among individual institutions due to differences in student and institutional characteristics described above.

As noted in the table, ICUF institutions as a group had a six-year graduation rate of 52 percent versus a six-year rate for the SUS of 63 percent for students seeking a bachelor’s degree. As a group, the minimum requirements for admission concerning high school GPA and SAT scores are higher for the SUS than they are for ICUF institutions as a whole.

Data concerning the proportion of freshmen that were first-time in college students was included to illustrate that graduation rates for first-time in college often do not represent the overall productivity of an institution’s undergraduate programs. First-time in college full-time freshmen represented 65 percent of all freshmen at ICUF institutions; therefore, their rates of completion are not a comprehensive measure of the rate of graduation of undergraduates in general.

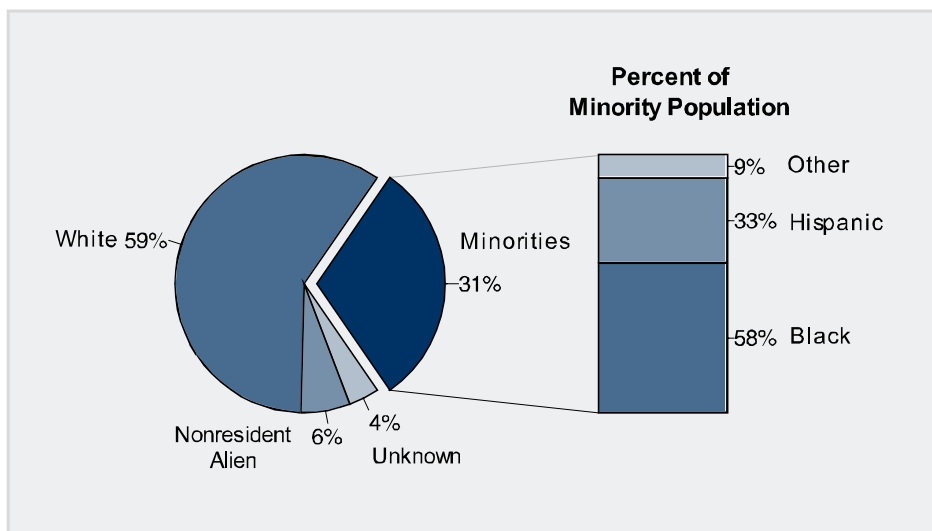
Moreover, rates of graduation of small circumscribed cohorts of undergraduates might suggest that ICUF institutions produce small numbers of bachelor’s degree recipients. In fact, overall

productivity on an annual basis is quite substantial. As an example, ICUF institutions awarded approximately 5,400 bachelor's degrees to members of the fall 1999 cohort of first-time in college full-time freshmen so far, but ICUF institutions award approximately 16,000 bachelor's degrees annually. Therefore, the total number of bachelor's degrees awarded during a 12-month period is a more comprehensive measure of productivity. These data are shown in tables below.

Finally, six-year graduation rates are not final rates for institutions with members of the cohort still enrolled. Thus, the completion rate will continue to increase until all students in the cohort have graduated or left the institution. For example, if all of the students in the 1999 cohort that are still enrolled ultimately graduate, then the final graduation rate for all ICUF institutions combined would be 54 percent.

**Six-Year Graduation and Persistence Rates

- > The aggregate six-year graduation rate for ICUF institutions was 52 percent versus the six-year aggregate graduation rate of 63 percent for the SUS for students seeking a bachelor's degree.
- > Twelve ICUF institutions had graduation rates greater than or equal to 50 percent. Only three SUS institutions had six-year graduation rates greater than 50 percent.
- > Overall, 54 percent of first-time in college freshmen at ICUF institutions had graduated or were still enrolled six years after entry.
- > In the aggregate, 65 percent of all fall 1999 freshmen at ICUF institutions were first-time in college full-time freshmen. At 18 institutions, more than two-thirds of all freshmen were first-time in college full-time freshmen. Only three institutions reported that less than one-third of all freshmen were first-time in college full-time freshmen.

Associate's Degree Transfer Students from Florida Community Colleges Three-Year Graduation Rates from ICUF Institutions

- > Nearly 100% of associate's degree transfer students from Florida Community Colleges were admitted into the program of their choice at ICUF institutions, thus providing access to programs either not available, or with limited access (space) at Florida public universities.
- > The ICUF aggregate three-year graduation rates for the 2000, 2001, and 2002 cohorts of full-time associate's degree transfer students were 61 percent, 71 percent, and 66 percent respectively. This compares favorably with three-year graduation rates of 60 percent for associate's degree transfer students entering the SUS.
- > Three-year graduation rates for associate's degree transfer students entering in fall 2002 ranged from 0 percent to 100 percent for individual ICUF institutions; 22 of 24 reporting institutions had rates greater than or equal to 60 percent. Completion rates for associate's transfer students at SUS institutions ranged from 41 percent to 70 percent and only three had rates greater than or equal to 60 percent.

- > The proportion of ICUF graduates from minority groups was considerably higher among Florida residents than for all graduates combined.
- > The proportion of degrees awarded to Florida residents from minorities at ICUF institutions was consistently higher than at SUS institutions.
- > The difference in proportion of awards to minorities by the two sectors was most marked for doctoral degrees: 37 percent to minorities in ICUF versus 16 percent in the SUS.
- > Not only did a higher proportion of degrees go to minorities in ICUF compared to the SUS, but the *number* of degrees awarded to Florida resident minorities in ICUF represented approximately 22 percent of the total degrees awarded to Florida resident minorities by ICUF and the SUS combined.

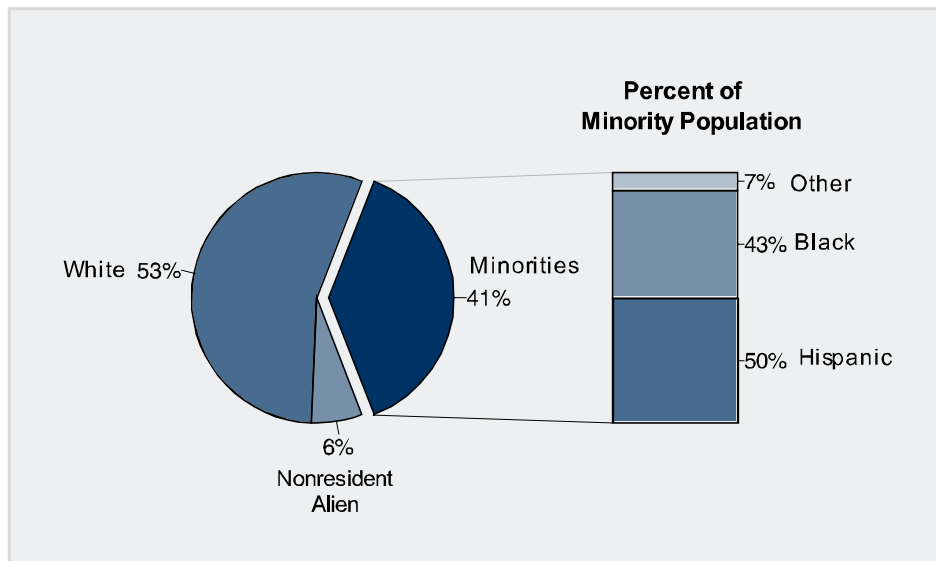

> ICUF institutions awarded a total of 9,716 bachelor's degrees to Florida residents during the period July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005.

> Overall, 41 percent of Florida resident bachelor's degree recipients at ICUF institutions were from racial/ethnic minorities. Approximately 33 percent of the students graduating with a bachelor's degree from SUS institutions were from minorities.

> At ICUF institutions, 64 percent of graduates were women, and 36 percent were men. Graduates at SUS institutions included 58 percent women and 42 percent men.

> As a group, institutions offering bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees awarded the highest proportion of bachelor's degrees to Florida resident minority graduates (53 percent).

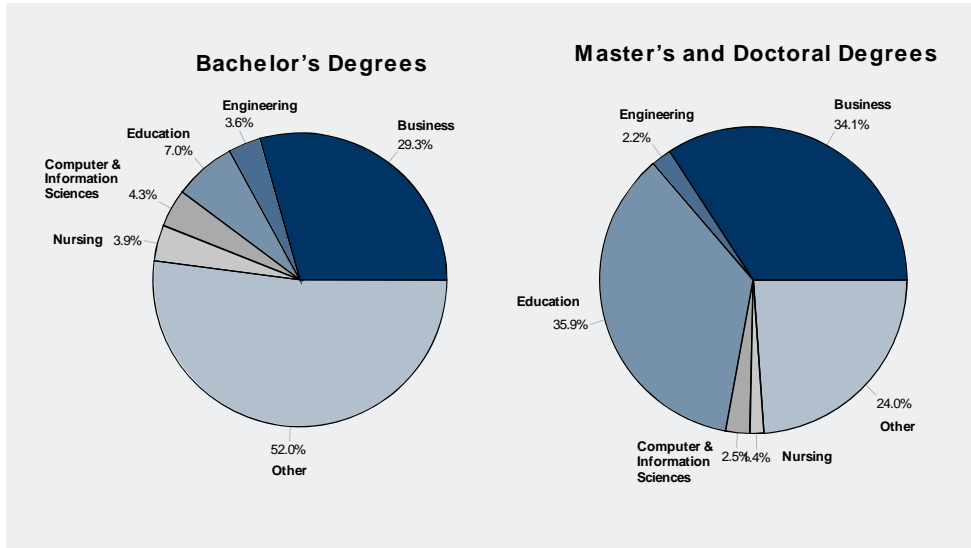

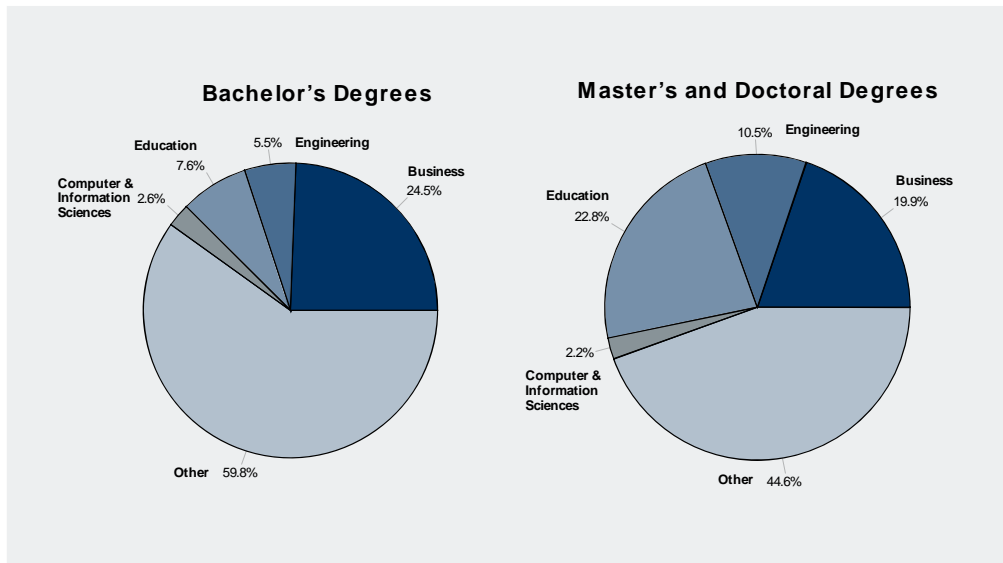
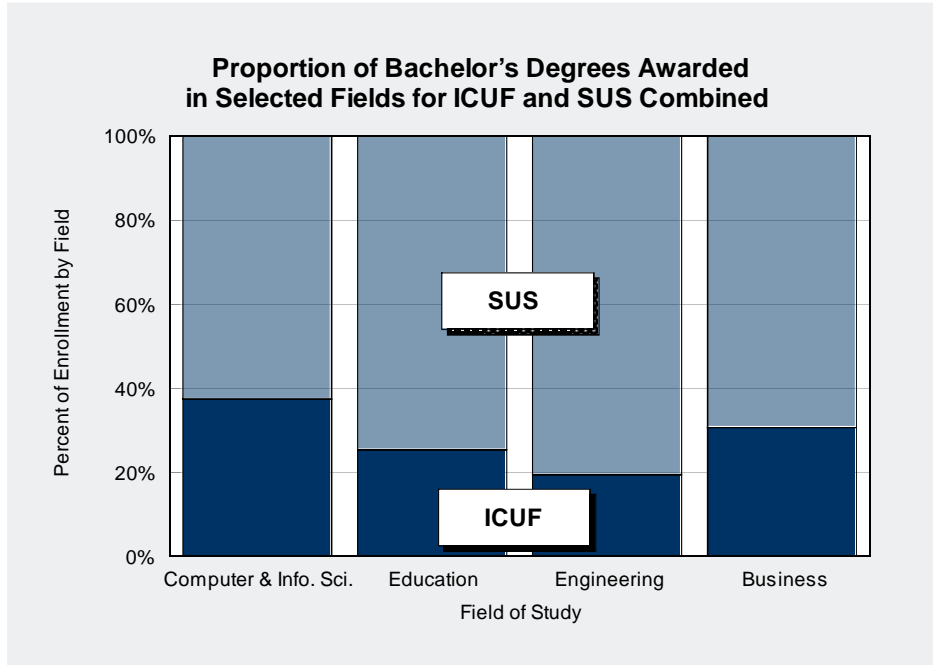


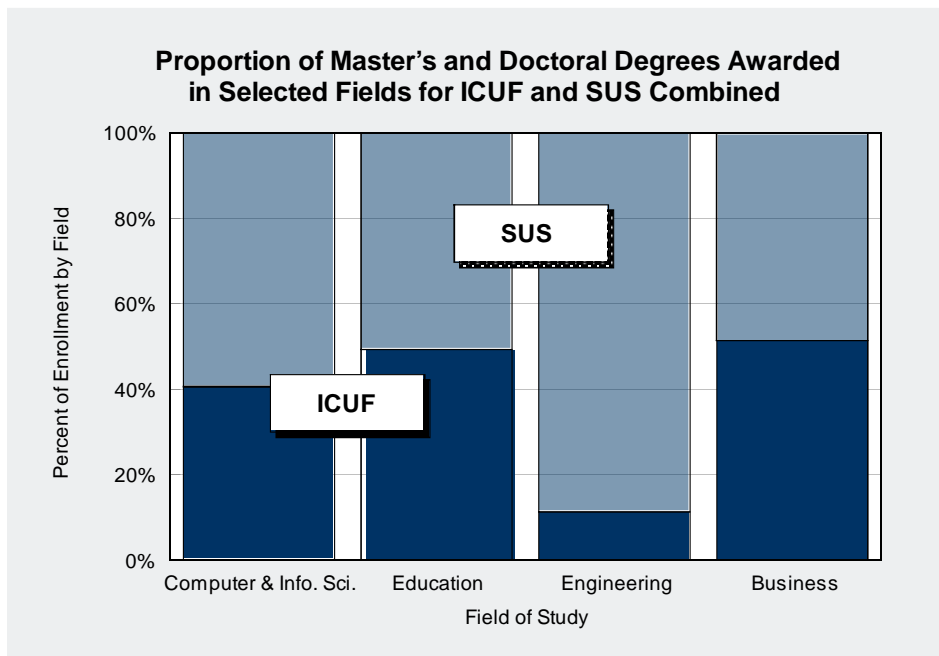
