To Whom It May Concern:

My experience with Vitalzym is a life changing experience. It started in April of this year; I went to my GP for my yearly physical, probably more like two years, and she sent me for an ultrasound (April 15th) as I was prone to



ovarian cysts. She also checked my blood, urine, did a pap smear and sent me for a mammogram. All the tests were fine except, of course, the ultrasound. The technician told me I had two cysts, one on each ovary and a fibroid in my uterus. I had no idea what a fibroid was and she said it was a growth in the uterus that could cause heavy bleeding and pain during menstruation. She also said that they could be “harmless”. The next week my GP’s office was on the phone to ask me to please make an appointment to see my doctor to discuss test results. When I saw her she was almost in a panic for me to see a gynecologist because the right cyst had grown and was now 5.8 centimeters. She told me it must “come out” because at my age (almost 50) there is certainly more risk.

My appointment with the gynecologist was May 20th; he was unbelievably young, and was educated in South Africa. He told me I needed to have a “total hysterectomy” to which I responded “That’s not going to happen!” I was taken by surprise, as I had not expected this kind of advice. He drew little diagrams of ovaries and uterus’s and brought my age up at least three times. I left the office after deciding to get a Ca125 test done (ovarian cancer test) as far as I was concerned this was one way for me to prove that I indeed did not have cancer. He had cautioned me, saying that this test was very unreliable and cysts and fibroids could throw off the results. However, I was very determined to get it done and hopefully then he’d quit talking about “total hysterectomies”.

Meanwhile, I had started my menstrual period on the 7th of June and it was the period from hell! I guess the fibroid had kicked in and the pain was excruciating plus really heavy bleeding that lasted about ten days. I went to see my GP, on the 9th of June because I was in so much pain; she was no help except that she could prescribe painkillers. I told her then I wasn’t very impressed with the gynecologist and I was rethinking getting the blood test done. She encouraged me to get the test done so I went on the 11th of June. I again called my GP on the 12th of June as I was becoming very frightened, she again prescribed painkillers.

My gynecologist went on a month’s holiday to South Africa (the month of June) and I got a call from his cohort to come to the office (June 26th) to discuss the blood test results. The blood test had backfired and was “slightly high”, meaning normal was 35 and my results were 160. The doctor then told me I should undergo a “total hysterectomy” including the ovaries, the uterus and even the appendix. My age was brought up again and he was adamant that the procedure should be complete, (not just taking the ovary that was affected.) He is even younger than my gynecologist and was also educated in South Africa. I let him know I thought that his line of thinking was very extreme. (But I must say I was beginning to believe that I was going to have to go under the knife). We left it saying I could discuss it with my original doctor when he returned from vacation.

The next time I was summoned to the doctor’s office it was the 8th of July; he discussed the blood test results saying almost anything could make this test go wonky. He wanted to discuss my case with his cohorts at the Tom Baker Cancer Centre and get their opinion. This was fine with me at the time but when I thought about it later I realized I would hear the same results because these “Specialists” were cut from the same cloth.

Meanwhile, my husband’s father had sent us a bottle of Vitälzým and had also included directions on how many to take. I never even questioned why, I just started taking them because to me the timing was uncanny. I would have done almost anything by this point.

I started on the 13th of June, taking six a day for two weeks. Around the 24th of June I upped the anti and started taking nine daily. Almost immediately my body started to drain, it was like a period except the fluid was almost clear and it went on for three or four days.



The next appointment I had was the 23rd of July; the doctor told me that his cohorts at the Tom Baker Cancer Centre totally agreed with his diagnosis. I asked him if I could have another ultrasound before we decide which way to go and he agreed. I told him I had been on Vitälzým for quite a while and wanted to see if they had done any good, especially with the fibroid, as my periods were back to normal. (Four to five days) He did not offer any kind of comment but agreed to the ultrasound.

I went for my ultrasound on the 21st of August and tried to pry information out of the technician. She wouldn't budge, no hints, no nothing. A week went by and I heard nothing; I decided to phone the doctors office (August 28th) and find out what happened with the results. My doctor phoned back, told me my ultrasound was normal; he was looking at it as we spoke and there were no cysts or fibroids. He asked me to have another blood test and I agreed. I went on the 28th of October to get the test redone and on the 26th of November they called me and asked that I go in for a follow-up. The blood count was 44 and the Dr. asked me if I would go back in the spring for another blood test just to keep an eye on it. He had no explanation for the results and seemed quite confused; the only thing I did was take the Vitälzým. I am still taking 9 a day for maintenance.
