The Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs, Millennium Park presents two lively concerts featuring famed Spanish flamenco guitarist Gerardo Núñez. On Saturday, July 28 at 6:30 pm, the Grant Park Music Festival presents the sizzling "Flamenco on Venetian Night" concert featuring guitar sensation Gerardo Núñez with the Grant Park Orchestra under Guest Conductor Joana Carneiro, and showcasing traditional gypsy dancer Carmen Cortés. On Sunday, July 29 at 6:30 pm, the popular *Music Without Borders* series features the Gerardo Núñez Flamenco Ensemble performing with oud and violin virtuoso Simon Shaheen and master sitar player Nishat Khan.



Flamenco guitarist **Gerardo Núñez** began his apprenticeship with the great Rafael el Águila, and was only fourteen years old when he was accompanying such great flamenco singers as Tío Gregorio el Borrico, Terremoto, Indio Gitano and many others. In his triple roles of composer, concert guitarist and accompanier, he has participated in some of the most diverse musical settings nationally and internationally. As a skilled guitarist he has experiences in jazz and many other genres and is a leader of integrating the "jondo" sound into other musical schemes, which has come to be known as fusion. He composes enormously rich and complex music, without losing the strength of the flamenco reference; and he performs with the technical capacity of a real virtuoso. Núñez has received the Flamenco Critics Award for Best Instrumental Album (*Cruce de Caminos*) and for Best Accompaniment (*Ramito de Locura*).

Núñez, who has collaborated with many artists in recordings and toured the world, including the United States, makes his Grant Park Music Festival debut on Saturday, July 28. The program includes five compositions by Núñez, himself, including *Templo del lucero, Solea, Sevilla, Bulerias,* and *Calima,* plus Falla's Suite No. 1 from *El sombrero de tres picos* ("The Three-Cornered Hat"), Rivero's *Andalusian Fire*, Bizet's Suite No. 1 *from Carmen*, and a traditional flamenco

Martinete. On Sunday, July 29, Núñez will perform with his own ensemble in addition to collaborating – for the first time ever – with Palestinian oud virtuoso Simon Shaheen and master sitar player Nishat Khan.

FEATURED ARTIST BIOS

FLAMENCO NIGHT (VENETIAN NIGHT): Saturday, July 28, 6:30 pm

A native of Lisbon, **Joana Carneiro** has attracted considerable attention as one of the outstanding young conductors working today. Currently an American Symphony Orchestra League Conducting Fellow, she serves as Assistant Conductor with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, working closely with Esa-Pekka Salonen. During the 2005-2006 Season, Carneiro began a position as Principal Guest Conductor of the Metropolitan Orchestra of Lisbon; in 2006-2007, she also became Official Guest Conductor of Lisbon's Gulbenkian Orchestra.

Carmen Cortés was born in Barcelona, where she began dancing flamenco. Today, Cortés directs her own dance company performing an interpretation of Garcia Lorcas's *Yerma* (with music by Gerardo Núñez) and Oscar Wilde's *Salomé*. She appears regularly in flamenco festivals from Japan to France, Germany and Belgium. Cortés was awarded the *Cabal al Baile* (*Perfecting the Dance*) in 1986, and now participates in the selection process for dancers for the National Ballet of Spain.

Simon Shaheen dazzles his listeners as he deftly leaps from traditional Arabic sounds to jazz and Western classical styles. His soaring technique, melodic ingenuity, and unparalleled grace have earned him international acclaim as a virtuoso on the oud and violin. Shaheen's work incorporates and reflects a legacy of Arabic music, and this unique contribution to the world of arts was recognized in 1994 when Shaheen was honored with the prestigious National Heritage Award at the White House. His concert credits are a veritable compendium of the world's greatest venues including Carnegie Hall, Kennedy Center, Cairo's Opera House, Theatre de la Ville in Beirut, and Belgium's Le Palais des Arts.



Undeniably the foremost virtuoso of the sitar, **Nishat Khan** transcends all musical barriers with his provocative emotional expression and supreme technical mastery. Heir to the 400-year old tradition of India's most renowned musical family, Khan flawlessly integrates the discipline and technique of his ancestors with his own distinctive musical approach. Having performed since the tender age of 7, his extraordinary command of the instrument is unequalled. In modern contexts Nishat Khan's virtuosity has been compared to such luminaries as "Jimi Hendrix" (Chicago Sun-Times) and "Bach" (Washington Times) because of the ingenious, very personal interpretation of his musical heritage.
