Membership Renewal for 2006 Members Begins February 13

Chicago's acclaimed Grant Park Music Festival will celebrate its 73rd annual season in its new home, the state-of-the-art Frank Gehry-designed Jay Pritzker Pavilion in Millennium Park. The season will begin on Wednesday, June 13 and conclude on Saturday, August 18. Concerts will generally take place on Wednesday and Friday evenings at 6:30pm, and Saturday evenings at 7:30pm. Full date and program information will be announced in mid-March.

All Grant Park Music Festival performances are free to the public. The lawn and general seating area of the Pavilion are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Season memberships, which include reserved seating or access to reserved sections for all concerts, are available for renewal by 2006 members on February 13. Memberships will go on sale to the general public in mid-March. New this summer is the **8's Series Membership**, featuring access to the reserved seating area for 8 concerts on Wednesday, Friday or Saturday evenings.
