## Virginia Signers of the Taxpayer Protection Pledge

- These candidates have pledged to protect Virginia's taxpayers -

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform (ATR) asks all candidates for federal and state office to sign the Taxpayer Protection Pledge and thus demonstrate their solidarity with the taxpayers of their entire state, and district if applicable. By signing the pledge, a candidate commits "to oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes."

Pledge signers are in good company: President Bush has signed the Pledge, and in so doing he joins 46 U.S. Senators, 222 Members of the U.S. House of Representatives, seven Governors, four Lieutenant Governors, one Attorney General, four Secretaries of State, three Treasurers, and more than 1240 state legislators.

"Signing the Pledge is the single most important step a candidate or incumbent can take to demonstrate his or her commitment to taxpayers' interests," said Grover Norquist, president of ATR. "I extend the invitation to sign the pledge to every incumbent and candidate running for office, in the hopes that more elected officials will dedicate themselves to taxpayers, rather than tax-and-spending."
