It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11-49.1-4 of the General Laws in Chapter 11-49.1 entitled

2 "Impersonation and Identity Fraud" is hereby amended to read as follows:

11-49.1-4. Penalties. - (a) Every person who violates the provisions of section 11-49.1-3 3

shall be imprisoned for not more than three (3) years and may be fined not more than five

thousand dollars (\$5,000), or both, for a first conviction.

(b) Every person who violates the provisions of section 11-49.1-3 may shall be 6

7 imprisoned for not less than three (3) years nor more than five (5) years and shall be fined not

more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or both, for a second conviction. 8

9 (c) Every person who violates the provisions of section 11-49.1-3 shall be imprisoned for

not less than five (5) years nor more than ten (10) years and shall be fined not less than fifteen

thousand dollars (\$15,000), or both, for a third or subsequent conviction.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL OFFENSES -- IMPERSONATION AND IDENTITY FRAUD

This act would mandate the specific penalties imposed for conviction of impersonation and identity fraud. A first conviction is imprisonment for not more than three (3) years and a fine of not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000). A second conviction would require the person would be imprisoned for not more than three (3) years nor more than five (5) years and would be fined not more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

This act would take effect upon passage.
