

Canebrake HORSE CAMP

DIRECTIONS: From Troy, travel on NC 109N for 10 miles and turn left onto Mullinix Road (NC 1154). Follow Mullinix Road for about 2 miles to a "T" intersection. Turn right at "T" and travel about one-quarter mile to the campground on the right.





Horse Sense

- Travel in small groups of six horses or less. Stay on the trail. Don't take shortcuts.
- Don't tie horses to trees, even temporarily.
 Tying horses to trees can gird and kill trees.
- Use hobbles, temporary corrals, or a rope stretched between two trees for securing horses outside the campground.
- Watch for approaching vehicles or bikes on Forest Service roads.
- To protect water quality, keep horses at least 100 feet from water.
- Clean the campsite and hitching post area before leaving.
- Make sure your site is animal proof. When food is not in use, store in a vehicle.
- Equestrians should ride only on designated horse trails.
- Be courteous and share trails and roads with other forest users.
- Practice other no-trace techniques for travel and camping.





Campsite features

Open year-round, Canebrake Horse Camp offers 29 sites with parking spurs for horse trailers. Five of these sites are double camp sites. Each site has a picnic table, grill, lantern post, and hitching post. Up to two vehicles are allowed at each site.

The camp also provides water spigots, showers, and flush toilets. All facilities are accessible. No electricity or water hookups are offered.

Horseback riders can choose from 25 trails that total about 32 miles. Trail names, mileages, and ratings are listed below.

CAMPGROUND FEE: \$12 per site, per night. Double sites are \$24 per night.
