Another successful academic year has ended at Drexel University. In 2007-2008 the Dragons earned three hard fought regular season Colonial Athletic Association championships (men's soccer, men's lacrosse, men's crew), three CAA Coach of the Year honors (men's soccer, men's lacrosse and diving), three All-Americans (Kate Hynes-diving, Bruce Bickfordlacrosse, Sarah Gostomski-field hockey), 39 studentathletes garnered All-CAA honors, including two CAA Player of the Year honors (Kate Hynes-diving, Bruce Bickford-lacrosse) and one CAA Rookie of the Year (Craig Podgurski-men's swimming), and women's lacrosse player Jessica Bill was honored by the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association as she was named the 2008 Division I Student-Athlete of the Year.

There were also a couple of firsts for the Dragons in 2007-2008. For the first time in school history a Drexel team cracked the top 10 in a national poll (men's lacrosse #10). Not only was the men's lacrosse team on television for the first time but they were televised on three separate occasions including the CAA Championship game in front of 2,000 fans at the Vidas Athletic Complex. Another first was the debut of the Bruiser Flint show on DUTV. The show was seen on Comcast Philadelphia in over 400,000 households and online on DUTV's website.

The departments mission is to generate Drexel Pride through athletic excellence. 





Drexel Athletics launched their current web site, DREXELDRAGONS.com in the beginning of the 2006-07 academic year.

Since then the web site has been visited over 1,200,000 times and averages 2,063 visits per day.

This past academic year 517,077 people visited the site at an average of 2010.87 per day. The most visits in one day this year was on February 17th with 4,207.

SIX DRAGONS NAMED TO PHILADEL-PHIA INOVIRER ACADEMIC ALL-AREA TEAMS

The Philadelphia Inquirer named six Drexel studentathletes to the Academic All-Area teams for their performance in competition and in the classroom during the 2008 spring sports season. Dragons that were honored are women's rower Katherine LaBarbera, men's lacrosse player Colin Ambler, women's lacrosse players Jessica Bill and Gwenna Johnson, and men's rowers Alan Fody and Michael Gartland.

The Academic All-Area honorees are nominated and selected by the Philadelphia Area Sports Information Directors Association in a partnership with the Philadelphia Inquirer to recognize outstanding studentathletes from each of the three sports seasons during the year. Drexel student-athletes have been named to

BICKFORD NAMED HONORABLE MEN-TION ALL-AMERICA BY USILA

Drexel senior lacrosse player Bruce Bickford was named an Honorable Mention All-America by the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association. Bickford, a goalkeeper from Providence, R.I., was named the Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year in 2008.

Bickford was fifth in the nation in save percentage (.629) and ninth in goals against average (6.99) heading into championship weekend. He led the CAA in both of those categories. He was also a First Team All-CAA pick as a junio and senior. Bickford led the Dragons to 24 wins over his final two seasons, the most wins in a two-year period for any goalkeeper in Drexel history. The Dragons won a share of the CAA regular-season championship for the second straight season.

Bickford's selection marks the second straight year a Drexel player has earned All-America status. Last season, defenseman Adam Crystal was selected for his outstanding play.

Along with Head Coach Chris Bates, Bickford was selected as finalists for the LaxPower.com second annual Fan Awards. These awards are designed to acknowledge excellence and achievement in the world of Division I men's and women's lacrosse according to LaxPower.com.

Three Division I senior men's and women's players were selected as finalists for each position as well as three freshmen for the Rookie of the Year award and three coaches for the Coach of the Year award. Bickford, was named the CAA's Player of the Year as he helped lead the Dragons to a share of the CAA regular season title and an appearance in the CAA Championship game.

Gostomski Named Third Team All-America

Drexel midfielder Sarah Gostomski was named Third Team All-America by the National Field Hockey Coaches Association. Gostomski becomes just the third player in Drexel field hockey history to be named an All-American. Former teammate Rachael Bloemker was also named to the third team in 2005 while Pamie Zukowski was selected to the All-America team in 2000 and 2001. Gostomski had already been named First Team All-Conference and All-Region and to the Colonial Athletic Association's All-Championship Team.

Gostomski tallied a career-high four goals and six assists in her senior season as she led the Dragons to their highest ever finish in the CAA and Drexel's first ever berth in the conference tournament. The four-year starter was selected to participate in the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Senior All-Star Game. She was a Second Team All-Region selection and an All-Philadelphia pick a season ago.
