This is a basic introduction to fair housing law: federal, state, and local. This course is designed especially for those who are new to fair housing or for those who would like a review of the law. The instructors, many of whom are from The John Marshall Law School Fair Housing Legal Support Center, will take participants through the basic elements of a fair housing action and discuss which persons are protected by the fair housing laws, what properties are covered by the law, what practices are prohibited by the law, and what remedies can be awarded to victims of housing discrimination. Saturday's sessions will delve more deeply into the special provisions providing accessibility to persons with disabilities, fair and predatory lending discrimination, and illegal land use practices, including discrimination through zoning, building, and occupancy restrictions.
