

A weekend of leadership growth






Give your capital stewardship effort an added boost with a



Lutheran Church Extension Fund's Capital Funding Services (CFS) is proud to make available a team of renowned and inspiring speakers from which partner congregations can choose for a weekend of leading, teaching, and preaching.

(Now included with most CFS Capital Stewardship Campaigns.)





FIRST, the selected speaker will provide a Saturday morning workshop touching on an area of ministry with which he has extensive experience, making it applicable to the congregation's situation. The audience for this workshop is the congregation's pastor(s) and leaders. The congregation could also invite pastors and leaders from nearby congregations to participate.

SECOND, the selected speaker will offer a Sunday morning Bible study to enlighten, edify, and inspire congregation members in support of their capital stewardship campaign.

THIRD, the selected speaker will preach the Good News of the Gospel in weekend services, giving special emphasis to the stewarding lifestyle and relating it to the congregation's capital stewardship effort.

Who Are the Available Speakers, and What Are Their Respective Workshop Titles?

The speakers and topics available to your congregation are listed in alphabetical order:

SPEAKER: Dr. Stephen J. Carter

TOPIC: Witness to the LIGHT: Opportunities and Approaches

for Outreach in Daily Life

Workshop content includes:

Opening your eyes to daily witness opportunities in family, neighborhood, place of work, and in the context of church

- Witnessing in natural settings using well-known Scripture and Confessions of Faith
- Developing and telling your faith story

■ Developing and implementing your personal mission

SCHEDULING: Any time during your capital campaign.

SPEAKER: Rev. John H. Kieschnick

TOPIC: How to Develop Excellence in Giving

Using models from the Old and New Testaments, participants will examine the methods and motives for pursuing excellence in sharing their financial resources for the greatest cause in the world—the cause of Christ and His church. Real-life stories and numerous practical applications abound!

SCHEDULING: Best used early in campaign or during Fulfillment Phase.

SPEAKER: Rev. Thomas P. Krause

TOPIC: Making a Difference: Keys to Moving a Ministry

to One of Significance

Using the principles found in Proverbs 3, and 2 Corinthians 8 and 9, Rev. Krause will challenge participants to use God's plan to move from the "ordinary" to the "extraordinary." These principles give clear direction to those desiring to move from success to significance, and are applicable both to individuals and congregations. SCHEDULING: Any time during your campaign.

SPEAKER: Rev. Randolph H. Raasch **TOPIC:** Finding Your Ministry Niche

Rev. Raasch will help your congregation members understand that the Lord has blessed them with unique abilities that can work for the Kingdom in effective ways. Rather than trying to adopt and/or adapt every new ministry fad that hits the market, unlock your congregation's DNA and enjoy the mission and ministry the Lord provides.

SCHEDULING: Best used week after the Commitment Event or week before Commitment Dedication Sunday.

SPEAKER: Rev. Stephen A. Wagner

TOPIC: Leading with Passion and Purpose

Rev. Wagner offers three options under the topic of church leadership from which congregations may pick two. Each could be done in a one-hour to a one-hour, 15-minute timeframe.

- Leadership in the Style of Jesus—sets the context for thinking of leadership through the life of Christ. Speaks to leading with a sense of vision and mission.
- The Context of Leadership Today—deals with the phenomena of leaders as focused on the future. Describes the dynamics of "managing from the future."
- Thinking Like a Leader—entails essentially a strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (SWOT) analysis in which each participant works through regarding his context for ministry.

SCHEDULING: Any time during your campaign.

DR. STEPHEN J. CARTER

A Stewardship Consultant and Pastor Coach with Lutheran Church Extension Fund's Capital Funding Services, St. Louis, Rev. John H. A graduate of Concordia Teachers' College (now Concordia University Chicago), River Forest, Ill., John served two years as teacher/principal/youth director before

REV. THOMAS P. KRAUSE

Rev. Thomas P. Krause of Overland Park, Kan., served in parish ministry for 36 years in Kansas and Texas before moving in August 2008 to serve other ministries. Tom and his wife, Miriam, were blessed to serve Lutheran parishes of all sizes, from a small congregation in East Texas, to a midsized congregation with a school on Galveston Island,

Tex., to large congregations in Austin, Tex., and Leawood, Kan. (Kansas City area). In addition, Tom helped birth three congregations, two as daughters and one as a church plant. Among his current ministries are travel (leading and arranging tours to Israel, Greece, Turkey, Jordan and Germany), supporting pastors in small towns and rural settings, and mission and pro-life ministries. Before his current position, Steve was senior pastor of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Carrollton, Tex., for 28 years. A 1973 graduate of Concordia Seminary, St.

Louis, he has completed additional graduate work at Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, Calif. Steve is the author of "Heart to Heart: Sharing Christ with a Friend" and "Great Commission Stewardship," and contributed to several other writings.
