Health Risk Assessment:

Concordia Health Plan members can know their personal health status in 15 minutes by taking the HealthQuotientTM Health Risk Assessment (HRA).

This secure, online questionnaire provides participants with an accurate assessment of their health risks. Once the risks are calculated, the results can be printed and discussed with their physician during the next visit.

If health risks are present, a CareAllies Health Advisor, which may be a Certified Health Education Specialist, Nurse, Behaviorist, or Nutritionist, will make a personal phone call to the participant to set up a program to help the participant succeed in making lifestyle changes to reduce or manage those health risks. This program is similar to having a personal coach.

A Health Advisor will normally contact workers with the following conditions:

- High blood pressure
- High cholesterol
- Pre-diabetes
- Stress
- Weight Management
- Tobacco use
