Chicago Tribune Holiday Giving is conducted by Chicago Tribune Charities, a McCormick Tribune Foundation Fund. With the funds raised through this campaign, Chicago Tribune Charities awards grants to help at-risk children and families, promote literacy and alleviate hunger. To serve the needs of the community, Chicago Tribune Charities accepts donations and provides grants to the community yearround.

In 2006, Chicago Tribune Charities, a McCormick Tribune Foundation Fund, awarded Holiday Giving grants totaling \$4,362,000 to more than 140 nonprofit organizations located in Chicago and the surrounding suburbs. The McCormick Tribune Foundation and the Chicago Tribune share all promotional and fundraising costs, so every dollar received from donors and events goes directly to programs to help people. In addition to every dollar received from the Chicagoland community, the Foundation provides a 50% match on donations.



Child and Family Development

Grants support disadvantaged children and families through housing, employment, and family strengthening programs that help people build productive lives. Also supported are employment programs for people with developmental disabilities.

Family Strengthening

Grants support individual and family counseling and home-visiting services to prevent child abuse and domestic violence, promote and teach positive parenting, and identify and support children at risk of developmental delays or with developmental disabilities.

There are 25 family strengthening grants totaling \$672,000.

early intervention program for children from birth to age three who are visually impaired or blind and family education to help the children reach individual developmental goals of learning

their caregivers or parents

educational and supportive services for pregnant and parenting teen mothers on the Northwest Side to reduce risk of abuse or neglect for their children

\$30,000 Community Crisis Center, Inc. (Elgin)

emergency and transitional housing, case management, counseling, and legal advocacy for women and children in Kane and Cook Counties impacted by domestic violence, sexual assault and poverty

Employment

Grants support vocational training and placement for lowincome individuals with families, technical assistance and advocacy efforts designed to improve vocational training and advocacy, and community employment for individuals with disabilities.

There are 34 employment grants totaling \$860,000.

Housing

Grants support prevention services, emergency and transitional shelters and affordable housing for families and youths who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Appropriate endeavors to alleviate homelessness through advocacy are also supported.

There are 34 housing grants totaling \$930,000.

Hunger

Grants support broad and community-based hunger relief nonprofits serving low-income families and other indigent groups with special needs such as children, the elderly and the severely ill. Priority is given to large food banks that distribute food and services to other food-based nonprofits that directly serve low-income clients. Other eligible programs include smaller scale agencies providing strategic services in high service needs. Appropriate endeavors to alleviate hunger through advocacy and training are also supported. There are 16 hunger grants totaling \$950,000.

- \$60,000 America's Second Harvest (Chicago) produce initiative that distributes more than 3.5 million pounds of fresh produce to its member network of food pantries and shelters and food stamp program to help 75,000 eligible people in the metropolitan area have access to food stamps
- \$35,000 Chicago Anti-Hunger Federation (Chicago) food distribution program in West Garfield Park for 200 member nonprofits throughout Chicago
- **\$20,000** Council for Jewish Elderly (Chicago) home-delivered meals and companionship for the elderly living in northern Chicago and the northern suburbs
- **\$20,000** Good News Community Kitchen (Chicago) comprehensive food distribution and hot meal services for families in the Howard area on the North Side
- \$250,000 Greater Chicago Food Depository (Chicago) the state's largest food bank that secures and distributes food to more than 600 hunger relief organizations in Cook County and Nourish for Knowledge, a weekend supply of food distributed to low-income children on Fridays so children have food for the weekend

network of five food pantries in Little Village with about 50 percent of its clients under 18

- \$225,000 Northern Illinois Food Bank (St. Charles) the state's second largest food bank that secures and distributes food to more than 520 member nonprofits in 13 counties and supports after-school programs to reach at-risk children for hunger
- \$30,000 Northwestern University Settlement (Chicago) network of food pantries serving children and adults in West Town

\$25,000 People's Resource Center (Wheaton) DuPage County's largest food pantry network composed of 40 food pantries

Literacy

Grants support reading and literacy programs for children and adults such as ABE (Adult Basic Education), ESL (English as a Second Language), GED (General Equivalency Diploma) preparation, family literacy, tutoring and pre-literacy, and book purchases. In-school and after-school programs are also considered. There are 32 literacy grants totaling \$950,000.
