2008-09: Attending his third Senators development camp. **2007-08:** Made his Senators and NHL debut in Ottawa's first game of the regular season on Oct. 3 at Toronto ... Recorded his first NHL goal (also his first NHL point) on Oct. 18 against Montreal ...
