Size and scope

Bristol Community College has an undergraduate population of 10,449 (unduplicated headcount of credit students for 2007-08) and 17,172 in noncredit enrollments.

Student costs

Annual in-state tuition and fees: \$3,192 Annual out-of-state tuition and fees: \$8,136

Per credit charge of \$126 plus additional program-specific charges as applicable.

Budget

Bristol Community College's operating budget for Fiscal Year 2009 is \$51 million, including state support of \$19.8 million and includes \$11.4 million in federal, state, and private grants.

This year's highlights...

Bristol Community College was awarded a \$1.9 million Title III grant entitled "The Connected College" which begins on October 1, 2008. The grant connects students with experiences of self-determination, engaged learning, and enhanced peer, faculty, and advisor relationships. The grant focuses on two goals: 1) Support students in assessing, defining, and achieving their goals and building strong connections to the College community; and 2) Prepare students with critical thinking skills and other general education skills they will need to thrive in a rapidly changing world.

As a leading resource for education and workforce development in southeastern Massachusetts, Bristol Community College provides programs that nurture the region's economic health and well-being and enable individuals to make productive life choices. These programs are characterized by a strong foundation in liberal arts and sciences; an emphasis on practical, employment-oriented education in allied health, engineering and technology, and business; and workforce development from adult literacy to advanced technology skills.
