## SEASON \& SERIES NOTES; CONNECTIONS

The Lakers lead their current season series with Oklahoma City 2-0 after sweeping last season's series with the Thunder (3-0) for the second straight year, having gone 4-0 against the Thunder in 2007-08. The Lakers have won each of the last four season series with the Thunder and have now won 11 straight overall against Oklahoma City. The two teams have met 216 times but just four times since the Thunder relocated to Oklahoma City prior to the 200809 season. Los Angeles leads the all-time series 133-83. The Lakers are 12-1 in their last 13 games against Oklahoma City and are winners of 11 straight against the Thunder. At home, the Lakers have gone 7-3 in their last 10 games against the Thunder and are 13-7 all-time against Oklahoma City at STAPLES Center. On the road against the Thunder, the Lakers have gone 8-2 in their last 10 overall and are 8-1 in their last nine games as the visitor. The Lakers have now played five times during the regular season at Ford Center in Oklahoma City, going 0-2 against the New Orleans Hornets while the team was temporarily relocated from 2005-07 but 3-0 against the Thunder. Under head coach Phil Jackson, the Lakers are 25-11 against the Thunder. In 2006-07, Kobe Bryant established a Lakers series record with 46 points 4/6/07 at KeyArena only to surpass it nine days later with 50 points $4 / 15 / 07$ at home against the Thunder. In those games, he surpassed the old mark of 45 points established by himself in January of 2003 and Jerry West in December of 1970. In 48 career games including 41 starts, Bryant is averaging 25.1 points against the Thunder.

Kobe Bryant led all scorers with 26 points, including a HORSE-style shot from behind the backboard and a running left hander to beat the first quarter buzzer, while Andrew Bynum posted 25 points on 9 -of-11 shooting as the Lakers, who trailed for just 36 seconds on the night before building a 19-point first quarter lead and extending it to as many as 28 in the fourth quarter, defeated the Oklahoma City Thunder 101-85 at STAPLES Center. Despite shooting just 40 percent from the field for the game, the Lakers defense limited the Thunder to 31 percent shooting in the first half, 37 percent shooting for the game and just 13 percent shooting from behind the arc on 23 attempts. Pau Gasol was the only other Laker in double figures with 15 points, seven rebounds and six assists. In addition to their scoring, Bryant handed out a game-high tying seven assists and Bynum posted team-highs in rebounds (9) and blocks (2). Kevin Durant led five Thunder in double-figures with 19 points on 8-of-20 shooting, Russell Westbrook posted 14 points ( $5-16 \mathrm{FG}$ ), seven rebounds and seven assists and Serge lbaka added 11 points and game-highs in rebounds (13) and blocks (5) in 32 minutes off the bench. With the victory, the Lakers (10-3) moved within a half game of the NBA's best record (11-3), currently held by Atlanta, Orlando and Phoenix.

## SEASON \& SERIES NOTES; CONNECTIONS

The Lakers swept last season's series with Cleveland 2-0. This will be the 96th meeting between the two teams with the Lakers holding a 57-38 series advantage. Last season, the Lakers snapped a 5game losing streak to the Cavaliers with a $105-88$ victory $1 / 19 / 09$. In their last 10 overall meetings, the Lakers are 4-6 against the Cavaliers. The Lakers are 8-2 all-time against the Cavaliers at STAPLES Center. In Cleveland, the Lakers have gone 5-5 in their last 10 games, most recently snapping a 4 game losing streak in Cleveland with a 101-91 victory 2/8/09. Under head coach Phil Jackson, the Lakers are 12-6 against Cleveland. In 24 games against the Cavaliers, including 21 starts, Kobe Bryant is averaging 22.0 points per game including a series record 47 points $1 / 30 / 01$ at Cleveland. In his last eight games against the Cavaliers, however, Bryant has averaged 28.5 points per game (228). In their most recent meeting (2/8/09), Bryant played through the effects of flu-like symptoms. In their prior meeting on 1/19/09, Bryant suffered a dislocated ring finger on his shooting hand but continued to play, marking the 3rd time Bryant has been injured against the Cavs. In 2004, Bryant suffered a sprained right shoulder that limited him to 17 minutes, five of which came after injuring his shoulder in the final seconds of the 1 st quarter ( $1 / 12 / 04$ ). Bryant tallied 10 points, 5 rebounds and 2 assists, playing five 2nd quarter minutes predominantly left handed. The following season, Bryant suffered a severely sprained right ankle when he landed on Ira Newble's right foot with 5:39 remaining in the first period (1/13/05) and did not return until the Lakers/Cavs next meeting that season. In two of his last five games against the Lakers, LeBron James has established new team Lakers/Cavs series scoring records, posting 38 points $2 / 15 / 07$ and then surpassing that with 41 points $1 / 27 / 08$. In 12 career games against the Lakers, James is averaging 27.3 points per game (327) with his team posting a 6-6 record in those contests. In Bryant and Shaquille O'Neal's EIGHT career head-to-head meetings, Bryant is averaging 34.8 points (278), 6.1 rebounds (49) and 4.0 assists (32) while O'Neal is averaging 20.0 points ( 160 ), 10.3 rebounds ( 82 ) and 1.50 blocks (12). Bryant's Lakers have won their 4 -of-their-last-5 games in which O'Neal has played and are 4-4 overall in their eight meetings. O'Neal played eight seasons with the Lakers, averaging 27.0 points, 11.8 rebounds and 2.49 blocked shots, and ranks among franchise leaders in points (7th/13,895), rebounds (5th/6,090), blocked shots (2nd/1,278) and field goal percentage (2nd/.575). Last season, Bryant and O'Neal shared MVP honors at the 2009 NBA All-Star Game in Phoenix, AZ.

With Kobe Bryant suffering the effects of flu-like symptoms and the Lakers trailing by 10 at the half, Lamar Odom's 15 -point, 10 -rebound third quarter sparked a 15 -point swing as Los Angeles took an 82-77 lead into the final period and never allowed Cleveland within four points the rest of the way, holding the Cavaliers to just 30 second half points while handing them their first home loss of the season with a 101-91 victory at Quicken Loans Arena. With the win, the Lakers became the first team in NBA history to win back-to-back games, both on the road, against teams with an .800 -plus win percentage at least 40 games into the season while finishing a perfect $6-0$ on their sixgame trip. Odom led four Lakers in double-figures and all scorers with 28 points on 13 -of-19 shooting and a season-high 17 rebounds in 38 minutes. Bryant scored 19 points despite being under the weather with Pau Gasol (18 points, 12 rebounds, team-high 6 assists) and Derek Fisher ( 13 points, 3 assists, 3 steals) rounding out the Lakers in double-figures. Zydrunas llgauskas led four Cavaliers in double-figures with 22 points and a team-high nine rebounds. Mo Williams scored 19 points but just two after halftime while LeBron James was limited to 16 points on 5 -of-20 shooting, eight rebounds and a game-high 12 assists. Wally Szczerbiak added 16 points including 4-of-5 shooting from behind the arc in the loss. With the victory, the Lakers swept their season series with the Cavaliers and snapped a 4 -game losing streak in Cleveland.

Kobe Bryant scored a game-high 28 points to go with five steals while Ron Artest added 14 points, five rebounds and game-highs in assists (9) and steals (6) as the Lakers built an 18-point halftime lead, extended it to 21 through three quarters and despite only scoring 10 points in the fourth, held on down the stretch to defeat the Detroit Pistons 93-81 at the Palace of Auburn Hills. With the victory, the Lakers won in Detroit for just the second time in their last 11 games (including playoffs) dating back to 2003. In addition to Bryant and Artest, Andrew Bynum totaled 16 points on 7 -of- 8 shooting, seven rebounds and a game-high three blocks, Pau Gasol posted a doubledouble with 13 points and a game-high 11 rebounds and Lamar Odom came off the bench to add seven points and 10 rebounds in 24 minutes. After outscoring the Nets reserves 42-12 the night before, the Lakers bench was outscored by Detroit's reserves 34-15. Rodney Stuckey led Detroit with 16 points ( $6-14$ FG). Jonas Jerebko ( 15 points) and Austin Daye (10 points) rounded out the Pistons in double-figures while Ben Wallace grabbed a team-high 10 rebounds in the loss.

## LAKERS UPDALES

## BRYANT NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR 26th TIME, PASSES JORDAN FOR MOST POW AWARDS ALL-TIME

After three Western Conference Player of the Week awards in each of the past two seasons, Kobe Bryant earned his SECOND WC Player of the week award this season for games played Monday, December 14 through Sunday, December 20. The award is the 26th of Bryant's career ( 24 Western Conference POW, 2 NBA POW), tying Michael Jordan ( 23 NBA POW, 2 Eastern Conference POW) for the most Player of the Week Awards all-time while further surpassing Magic Johnson's 18 NBA POW awards as the franchise's all-time leader. Jordan and Johnson, however, earned the majority/all of their Player of the Week nods before the award was separated by Conference prior to the 2001-02 season. Since the Player of the Week was separated by Conference, Bryant's 24 awards rank first among all players, three ahead of LeBron James (21).
Bryant led the Lakers to a 4-0 week, which included wins over the Bulls, Bucks, Nets and Pistons, averaging 34.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.50 steals. During the week, Bryant recorded his 5th 40-point game of the season with 42 points $12 / 15$ at Chicago, scored 39 points including a game-winning buzzer beater in overtime $12 / 16$ at Milwaukee, posted a double-double with 29 points, 10 rebounds and five assists $12 / 19$ at New Jersey and totaled 28 points, four assists and five steals $12 / 20$ at Detroit; all while playing with an avulsion fracture to his right index finger.
This is the 24th time Bryant has earned Player of the Week honors (11/4/01, $1 / 20 / 02,11 / 3 / 02,12 / 8 / 02,1 / 12 / 03,2 / 2 / 03,2 / 23 / 03,2 / 17 / 04,3 / 22 / 04,11 / 13 / 05,12 / 18 / 05$, 12/25/05, 1/22/06, 4/16/06, 3/18/07, 3/25/07, 1/13/08, 3/2/08, 4/6/08, 12/28/08, 1/11/09, 3/15/09, 11/22/09, 12/20/09) since the award was separated by Conference. He has twice earned NBA Player of the Week honors (4/16/00, 12/24/00), giving him 26 total career POW awards. The NBA began the Player of the Week award in 1979-80.

## GASOL CRASHING THE BOARDS

With seven double-doubles and 115 rebounds over his last seven games, Pau Gasol is currently enjoying the best rebounding stretch of his career. Entering the season with a career-high 19 rebounds $4 / 9 / 09$ vs. Denver, Gasol has bettered his career-high three times during this run ( 20 reb. $12 / 11$ vs. Minnesota, 20 reb. $12 / 12$ at Utah, 22 reb. 12/16 at Milwaukee). With 26 points and a career-high 22 rebounds 12/16 at Milwaukee, Gasol became the first Laker to record a 20pt/20reb game since Lamar Odom posted 23 points and 21 rebounds 3/24/08 at Golden State. Prior to that, the most recent Lakers player to record a 20/20 game was Shaquille O'Neal in 2004.
Additionally, with 20 rebounds 12/12/09 at Utah and 20 rebounds 12/11/09 vs. Minnesota, Gasol became the first Laker to record 20 rebounds in consecutive games since Lamar Odom posted 22 rebounds $3 / 23 / 08$ vs. Golden State and 21 rebounds $3 / 24 / 08$ at Golden State. The only other Laker to record back-to-back 20-plus rebounds in the past 30 years is Vlade Divac, who did so $2 / 24 / 95$ vs. Charlotte ( 24 rebounds) and $2 / 25 / 95$ vs. Los Angeles Clippers ( 20 rebounds). Prior to that, the most recent Lakers player to post consecutive 20 rebound games was Kareem Abdul-Jabbar ( 20 rebounds 1/24/78 vs. Philadelphia, 21 rebounds 1/27/78 vs. Milwaukee).

## 40-POINT GAMES

Kobe Bryant scored 42 points 12/15/09 at Chicago, marking the 101st time in his career that he has scored $40+$ points in a game and the 5th time this season, surpassing his total for all of last season (4). Bryant's 46 points February 1, 2008 at Toronto moved him past Elgin Baylor ( 88 40+ games) for 3rd all-time and into 1st in Lakers franchise history. In the history of the NBA, only two players have more career 40-point games: Wilt Chamberlain (271) and Michael Jordan (173). The Lakers are now 7031 all-time in games that Bryant scores $40+$ points and are 5-0 in such games this season. Bryant holds the Lakers franchise record for 40 -point games in a single season, recording 27 during the 2005-06 campaign. Bryant also holds the franchise record for most consecutive 40-point games (9), established during the 2002-03 season, which is tied for the fourth longest such streak in NBA history (Michael Jordan) behind Wilt Chamberlain, who twice posted streaks of 14 and once had a 10-game streak.

## LAKERS RECENT 11-GAME WIN STREAK TIES FOR 9TH LONGEST IN TEAM HISTORY

The Lakers saw their recent 11-game win streak come to and end in a 102-94 loss in Utah on 12/12. With their victory over the Timberwolves December 11th, the Lakers won for the 11th straight time, further surpassing their longest win streak from a season ago when the Lakers strung together 7-straight victories on three occasions, most recently from 1/30/09-2/10/09. The Lakers victory over the Jazz December 9th marked the 24th time in franchise history that the team has put together a $10+$ game win streak ( 20 in Los Angeles, 4 in Minneapolis). The Lakers last 11-game win streak came during the 2003-04 season from March 13-April 2, 2004. The Lakers have not won 12 straight games since a streak of 19 consecutive victories from February 4 - March 13, 2000, part of a 19-game streak that ranks as the 2nd longest in team history.

## ARTEST REACHES 10,000 CAREER POINTS AND 2,000 CAREER ASSISTS

With 16 points and one assist December 12 at Utah, Ron Artest scored his 10,000th career point and dished his 2,000th career assist. Furthermore, the Lakers now have four players with over 10,000 career points (Kobe Bryant, Pau Gasol, Lamar Odom, Ron Artest). The only other teams in the league with four or more players with 10,000 career points are San Antonio with five players (Tim Duncan, Michael Finley, Antonio McDyess, Tony Parker, Richard Jefferson), Dallas with four players (Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Kidd, Shawn Marion, Jason Terry) and Boston with four players (Kevin Garnett, Ray Allen, Paul Pierce, Rasheed Wallace).

## DOUBLE-DOUBLES FOR EVERYONE

In the Lakers 103-84 victory December 19 at New Jersey, Kobe Bryant ( 29 points, 10 rebounds), Pau Gasol (14 points, 14 rebounds) and Lamar Odom ( 14 points, 12 rebounds) all posted double-doubles, marking the first time since the 2007-08 season that three Lakers have posted double-doubles in the same game. In the 2007-08 season, three Lakers posted double-doubles in the same game three times, most recently March 4, 2008 at Sacramento (Bryant ( 34 points, 10 rebounds), Gasol ( 31 points, 10 rebounds) and Odom (19 points, 12 rebounds)). Earlier that season, Bryant ( 24 points, 11 assists), Odom ( 22 points, 12 rebounds) and Kwame Brown ( 10 points, 11 rebounds) each posted double-doubles January 29, 2008 vs. New York, while Andrew Bynum (10 points, 10 rebounds), Chris Mihm (10 points, 10 rebounds) and Odom (18 points, 10 rebounds) all recorded double-doubles November 9,2007 . Prior to the 2007-08 season, three Lakers had not posted double-doubles in the same game since March 27, 2005 vs. Philadelphia (Bryant (34 points, 10 rebounds), Mihm (17 points, 11 rebounds), Caron Butler (13 points, 10 rebounds)).

## BACK-TO-BACK

This season, the Lakers are 6-0 in the first game and 4-2 in the second game of back-to-backs. On the year, the Lakers will play 20 sets of back-to-back games, the most the team has played in a single season since playing 22 sets of back-to-backs during the 1999-00 campaign. Last year, the Lakers played 19 sets of back-to-backs, going $14-5$ in the first game and $14-5$ in the second as well. Charlotte, Detroit and Milwaukee lead the league with 23 back-to-backs each in 2009-10 while New Orleans (15) and San Antonio (17) will play the fewest sets this season.

## JUST ADD GASOL

Since Pau Gasol made his season debut 11/19 vs. Chicago, the Lakers are now $14-1$ while defeating teams by an average of 12.9 points per game (194). Additionally, with Gasol's return, all five starters have scored in double-figures four times whereas in the previous 11 games without him in the lineup, not once did that occur. In games played without Gasol since he joined the Lakers, Los Angeles is 15-7 overall ( $6-4$ in 2007-08, 1-0 in 2008-09 and 8-3 in 2009-10). With Gasol in the lineup, the Lakers are 100-23 (.813) in the regular season since he joined the team in February of 2008 (22-5 in 2007-08, 64-17 in 2008-09 and 14-1 in 2009-10) and 30-14 (.682) in the playoffs.

## LAKERS PLAY STINGIEST DEFENSIVE 4TH QUARTER IN FRANCHISE HISTORY [SHOT CLOCK ERA]

Leading by two entering the 4th quarter of their December 9th contest with Utah, the Lakers played the best defensive 4th quarter in franchise history (shot clock era), holding the Jazz to the third fewest 4th quarter points (6) in the NBA's shot clock era. During the period, the Lakers forced nine turnovers, including three shot clock violations in a three minute span, while limiting the Jazz to just 2 -of-18 shooting from the field. Only the Warriors ( 2 points, 2/8/04) and the Trail Blazers ( 5 points, $3 / 15 / 06$ ) have scored fewer points in a 4th quarter than what the Lakers limited the Jazz to (7th time a team has scored six 4th quarter points). Overall, the Jazz's six fourth quarter points were the fewest points in any quarter the Lakers have surrendered since holding the Los Angeles Clippers to three points in the second quarter of 95-68 victory $12 / 14 / 99$. The franchise record for fewest points allowed in any quarter is two, established in the third quarter of the Lakers $87-80$ victory vs. Dallas 4/6/97.

## 3-TIME ALL STAR GAME MVP KOBE BRYANT LEADS ALL PLAYERS AFTER 1st ROUND OF ALL-STAR BALLOTING

On December 10th, the NBA announced its FIRST returns of 2010 NBA All-Star balloting with Kobe Bryant $(692,518)$ LEADING all players in All-Star voting, ahead of Miami's Dwyane Wade $(672,227)$ and Cleveland's LeBron James $(649,327)$. In the West, Denver's Carmelo Anthony $(588,958)$ and Dallas' Dirk Nowitzki $(366,300)$ are the top two vote-getters at forward, Bryant and Houston's Tracy McGrady $(281,545)$ lead the guard voting and Phoenix's Amar'e Stoudemire $(447,776)$ leads the center voting. In the East, James and Boston's Kevin Garnett $(533,187)$ lead the forward voting, Wade and Orlando's Vince Carter $(292,002)$ are the top two vote-getters at guard and Dwight Howard $(625,279)$ least all Eastern Conference centers in balloting.
Pau Gasol $(280,758)$, who made his second All-Star team last season as a reserve and became the 27 th Laker in franchise history to be name an All-Star, ranks 3rd in balloting among West forwards behind Anthony and Nowitzki but ahead of San Antonio's Tim Duncan $(271,321)$ and Oklahoma City's Kevin Durant $(177,205)$ while Andrew Bynum $(299,484)$ ranks 2nd among West centers behind Stoudemire but ahead of Denver's Nene $(90,439)$.

In each of the last two seasons, Bryant has led the Western Conference in all-star balloting. Last season, he accumulated 2,805,397 votes, finishing third in overall balloting behind Dwight Howard ( $3,150,181$ ) and LeBron James ( $2,940,823$ ). In 2007-08, Bryant garnered 2,004,940 votes to finish fourth in overall voting behind Kevin Garnett $(2,399,148)$, James $(2,108,831)$ and Howard $(2,066,991)$. In 2006-07, when he earned his second All-Star MVP, Bryant finished third overall in balloting behind James and Yao Ming. A three-time All-Star MVP (2002 Philadelphia, 2007 Las Vegas, 2009 Phoenix), Bryant is an 11-time All-Star and has started 11 consecutive All-Star games. Bryant, who was the youngest All-Star in NBA history in 1998, led all players in NBA All-Star balloting in 2003.

## WIRE-TO-WIRE

With their 108-88 victory over Phoenix December 6th, the Lakers posted their 3rd wire-to-wire victory of the season. The Lakers recorded their first wire-to-wire victory of the year with a 104-88 win 11/8 vs. NO and their second with a 130-97 win 11/28 @ GS. Last season, the Lakers claimed nine wire-to-wire victories (games in which they never trailed) during the regular season, tied for 3rd most in the league (Phoenix) behind Cleveland (14) and Orlando (13). The Lakers also won in wire-to-wire fashion twice during the 2009 Playoffs (4/29 vs. Utah and $5 / 17 \mathrm{vs}$. Houston). Additionally, the Lakers were one of only two teams last season (Cleveland) to never lose in wire-towire fashion during the regular season. In the playoffs, however, the Lakers played two games in which they never led, falling twice to Houston in the Conference Semifinals ( $5 / 10 / 09$ at HOU and $5 / 14 / 09$ at HOU ). In the regular season, the Lakers have not lost in wire-to-wire fashion since $1 / 17 / 08 \mathrm{vs}$. PHX.

## WITH LAKERS, IT'S HOW YOU START

Through 26 games this season, the Lakers currently hold the best record in the NBA at 22-4 while ranking in the league's top 10 in scoring ( 7 th/ 103.3 ppg ) and defense ( 5 th/94.5 ppg). Last season, the Lakers finished 3rd in scoring offense and 13th in scoring defense, winning by an average margin of 7.6 points per game. This season, the Lakers are defeating teams by an average of 8.8 points per game, but it's how they're getting to that point that is different from seasons past. Through three quarters, this year's edition of the Lakers is more dominant than the 2009 Championship team, averaging a 9.7 point lead entering the fourth quarter in comparison to last season's 6.4 point lead through three periods. On average, the Lakers are jumping out to a 6.6 point lead at the half this year in contrast to a 3.2 point lead a year ago. In the second half, the Lakers are outscoring opponents by 2.0 points whereas a year ago, Los Angeles outscored its opponents by another 4.4 points in the final two quarters. Overall, the Lakers most dominant quarter is the opening period, where Los Angeles is outscoring its opponents this season by a 5.3 point margin.

## BRYANT MOVES PAST ABDUL-JABBAR ON LAKERS ALL-TIME FRANCHISE SCORING LIST

With his free throw at the 6:07 mark of the third quarter November 19th vs. Chicago, Kobe Bryant moved past Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (24,176) for 2nd on the Lakers all-time franchise scoring list. While only Jerry West $(\mathbf{2 5 , 1 9 2})$ has scored more points with the Lakers than Bryant $(\mathbf{2 4 , 5 7 0})$, at his current scoring average ( 28.8 ppg ), Bryant would surpass West approximately 22 games from now $1 / 31 / 10$ at Boston. Earlier this month, with 41 points November 6th against Memphis, Bryant moved past Allen Iverson for 16th on the NBA's all-time scoring list. Bryant has been steadily moving up the list the last few years and last season alone, moved past Charles Barkley (23,757) for 17 th, Robert Parish $(23,334)$ for 18th, Adrian Dantley $(23,177)$ for 19th, Elgin Baylor $(23,149)$ for 20th, Clyde Drexler $(22,195)$ for 21 st, Gary Payton $(21,813)$ for 22 nd and Larry Bird $(21,791)$ for 23 rd. Next on the NBA's all-time list ahead of Bryant $(24,570)$ are Patrick Ewing $(24,815)$ and Jerry West $(25,192)$.

## POINTS IN THE PAINT

In their 121-102 victory over Phoenix November 12, the Lakers converted 39-of-57 shots in the paint for a total of 78 points, outscoring the Suns by 30 down low and posting their highest total in the paint since scoring 80 points in a $109-106$ victory over Sacramento March 12,2000 at STAPLES Center. Additionally, the Lakers $78-$ point total was the highest amount of points in the paint league-wide to date this season and the most in the NBA since Phoenix posted a 90-point total 2/27/09 vs. Toronto.

## JACKSON PASSES LARRY BROWN FOR 5th ON THE ALL-TIME COACHING VICTORIES LIST

A season after earning his record 10th NBA Championship as a head coach, Phil Jackson $(1,063)$ moved past Charlotte Bobcats head coach Larry Brown for 5th on the NBA's all-time coaching win list with a victory over the Detroit Pistons on November 17th. The only coach in league history to win better than 70 percent of his games (.707), Jackson ranks 12 th in all-time regular season games coached and 1st in playoff games coached (300), won (209) and playoff winning percentage (.697). Last season, Jackson became the fastest coach in NBA history to reach 1,000 career victories, needing 1,423 games to reach the mark. Earning induction in his first year of consideration, on September 7, 2007, Jackson was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Only Jerry Sloan (4th), Pat Riley (3rd), Don Nelson (2nd) and Lenny Wilkens (1st) have more career victories than Brown and Jackson while of the top six, Jackson has coached 1,000+ fewer games than Wilkens, 800+ fewer games than Nelson, nearly 500 fewer games than Riley and roughly 400 fewer games than Sloan and Brown.

## THIRD TIME'S A CHARM

With a victory over Detroit on November 17, the Lakers snapped their FIRST two-game losing streak of the season. Last season, the Lakers suffered just FOUR two-game losing streaks all season, a mark which was historically good. According to Philadelphia 76ers stats guru Harvey Pollack, no team has gone through a season without a single two-game losing streak; six teams have had just one two-game skid, 13 teams (including the 1949-50 and 1986-87 Lakers) have had two two-game losing streaks, 11 (including the 1971-72, 1989-90 and 1999-00 Lakers) have had three two-game streaks and five teams, including last season's 2008-09 Lakers championship squad, went through a season with four two-game losing streaks total.
Since the acquisition of Pau Gasol on February 1, 2008, however, the Lakers have yet to lose three consecutive games. Los Angeles has now lost two-straight games NINE times overall since acquiring Gasol (7 regular season, 2 playoff streaks). Of those nine two-game losing skids, the Lakers have played the third game of the streak without Gasol three times, snapping two-game losing streaks with victories $3 / 18 / 08$ at Dallas, $3 / 30 / 08$ vs. Washington in overtime and $11 / 17 / 09$ vs. Detroit. The Lakers last three-game losing streak came just a week before the trade, with consecutive losses at San Antonio, at Dallas and vs. Cleveland from 1/23/08 through 1/27/08.

## VUJACIC COMPLETES 6TH FOUR-POINT PLAY OF CAREER, 28th IN FRANCHISE HISTORY

In the fourth quarter of the Lakers November 8th victory over New Orleans, Sasha Vujacic converted the 28th four-point play in Lakers franchise history (regular season and playoffs included). With his three-pointer and free throw, Vujacic is now responsible for six of the team's 23 regular season four-point plays and 28 overall. Kobe Bryant owns the most four-point plays in team history with 10 overall (7 regular season, 3 postseason), followed by Vujacic (6), Derek Fisher (5) and Eddie Jones (2).

## BRYANT YOUNGEST IN NBA HISTORY TO 24,000 CAREER POINTS; 17th EVER TO REACH MILESTONE

With a second-quarter basket November 6th against the Grizzlies, Kobe Bryant (31 years, 75 days) became the youngest player in NBA history to score 24,000 points, reaching the milestone ahead of Wilt Chamberlain (31 years, 113 days). In terms of games, of the 17 players to now have scored 24,000 points, Bryant is the 9 th fastest to do so in terms of games (954). Wilt Chamberlain was the fastest in league history to score 24,000 points, doing so in just 653 games.

Last season, with 34 points February 10 vs. Oklahoma City, Bryant became the youngest player in NBA history to score 23,000 points ( 30 years, 171 days), reaching the milestone FIVE days younger than Wilt Chamberlain ( 30 years, 176 days). In terms of games, of the 21 players to score 23,000 points, Bryant was the 11th fastest to do so, reaching the mark in 917 games. Earlier in the year, with 28 points December 2 at Indiana, Bryant became the 22nd player in NBA history to score 22,000 points and in doing so, became the 2nd youngest player ever to 22,000 points ( 30 years, 101 days), one day older than Wilt Chamberlain ( 30 years, 100 days) who scored his 22,000 th point on $11 / 26 / 66$. The youngest player in league history to accumulate $14,000-20,000$ and $23,000-24,000$ points, Bryant became the 12 th fastest to 22,000 points in terms of games, reaching the mark in 881 career games. Through his career, Bryant has been 29th fastest to 15,000, 22nd fastest to 16,000, 20th fastest to 17,000, 16th fastest to 18,000 , 15th fastest to 19,000 , 15th fastest to 20,000 , 12th fastest to 21,000 , 12th fastest to 22,000 and 11th fastest to 23,000 points in terms of games.

## OFFSEASON CHANGES

The 2009-10 Lakers preseason roster includes 12 players from last season's NBA Championship team, one more than in 2008-09 when the Lakers brought back 11 players from the Western Conference Championship squad. This will be the 4th consecutive season in which the Lakers have returned at least 11 players, having brought back 12 players to start the 2007-08 season and 11 to start the 2006-07 campaign. However, only Kobe Bryant and Derek Fisher remain from the Lakers 2000-02 title runs with Fisher rejoining the team prior to the 2007-08 season after spending the previous three years in Golden State and Utah. The longest tenured Laker after Bryant and Fisher is Luke Walton, who joined the team as a rookie in 2003-04. Shannon Brown, Andrew Bynum, Jordan Farmar, Pau Gasol, DJ Mbenga, Adam Morrison, Lamar Odom, Josh Powell \& Sasha Vujacic all return from a year ago while Ron Artest is the lone new addition to the Lakers roster.

## GASOL LEADS SPAIN TO EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIP, NAMED TOURNAMENT MVP

On Sunday, September 20, Pau Gasol posted 18 points, 11 rebounds and three blocked shots in leading Spain to an 85-63 victory over Serbia at the final of the 2009 European basketball championship in Poland. Gasol, who was named tournament MVP, helped Spain earn its first European title after six runner-up finishes. With the victory, Gasol is currently a member of the reigning NBA Champions, the reigning FIBA World Champions (led Spain to the 2006 FIBA World Championship while earning tournament MVP honors) and the reigning European Champions. Additionally, last summer, the highly decorated Spaniard helped his country to a silver medal in the 2008 Olympics in Beijing as well, coming up just short with a loss to a United States team led by Lakers teammate Kobe Bryant in the Olympic finals.

Kleiza has scored in double figures in seven straight Euroleage games and Childress had a career high 18 points in the last match-up with Lietuvos Rytas.
