## Last Game: Sunday, Dec. 20 - Boston 122, Minnesota 104

Paul Pierce scored 29 points, tying a club record by hitting all six of his 3-point attempts, and Rajon Rondo added 13 points and 15 assists as Boston coasted to a 122-104 win over the Timberwolves on Sunday night at the TD Garden. Pierce's jumper started an 8-0 blitz that put the Celtics in front to stay midway through the first quarter, and Rasheed Wallace beat the buzzer to extend the lead to 34-19. Pierce had 14 points in the second quarter as Boston opened the margin to 66-41 by halftime, outshooting Minnesota 63 percent to 31 percent from the floor. The lead crested at 26 on Pierce's fifth long-range strike of the night with 5:41 left in the third quarter, but Jonny Flynn keyed an 11-2 rally that helped the Wolves cut their deficit to 17. Kevin Love's dunk capped a run of nine straight Minnesota points early in the fourth, and the lead dwindled to 106-94 on a Flynn layup with 5:14 to play, but the comeback stalled at that point as Boston pulled away. Flynn's 21 points led the Wolves while Love (15 points, 11 rebounds) and Al Jefferson (20 points, 11 rebounds) contributed double-doubles and Damien Wilkins chipped in 18 points and six assists.

## Previous Game: Friday, Dec. 18 – Minnesota 112, Sacramento 96

Kevin Love totaled 20 points and 16 rebounds, and Corey Brewer also scored 20 points as the Timberwolves posted a 112-96 victory over Sacramento on Friday night at Target Center. Minnesota never trailed, holding the Kings to 33 percent shooting in the opening quarter en route to a 27-22 lead. Sacramento used a 12-1 burst midway through the second period to pull within one, but Brewer closed the first-half scoring with a breakaway dunk to rebuild the Wolves' lead to 52-45. Brewer and Love teamed up to score 15 of Minnesota's first 19 points of the second half as the margin swelled to 14. Beno Udrih beat the third-quarter buzzer with a long 3-pointer to get the Kings within 87-76, and baskets by Udrih and Omri Casspi shaved the Wolves' lead to seven a minute into the fourth. However, Al Jefferson's jumper was followed by a three-point play from Damien Wilkins, and Sacramento could get no closer than 11 the rest of the way. Jefferson and Wilkins finished with 16 points apiece for Minnesota. Casspi's 21 points led the Kings, with Udrih and Jason Thompson scoring 18 points each and Tyreke Evans handing out eight assists.

WOLF TRACKS: Boston completed a sweep of its two-game season set with the Wolves by notching a 122-104 victory on Sunday at the TD Garden... The final 18-point spread marks the Celtics' biggest win over Minnesota since a 115-82 ambush in the teams' final Boston Garden meeting (Feb. 5, 1995)... Minnesota won for the second time in three games with last Friday's 112-96 decision over Sacramento, avenging a 120-100 loss to the Kings six nights earlier at ARCO Arena... The 16-point victory represents the Wolves' first double-digit win of the season; their first four wins were by a combined 17 points... The Clippers recorded their third win of the season vs. Minnesota with last Wednesday's 120-95 verdict; the final 25-point spread ties L.A.'s biggest victory ever in the series... That defeat is one of seven times the Wolves have permitted 120+ points, and is their seventh loss by 20 or more; a year ago, Minnesota allowed 120 points on four occasions and suffered 10 losses by 20+... The Wolves snapped a four-game losing streak with the 110-108 triumph at Utah on Dec. 14, their second win over the Jazz in a 10-day span... Minnesota posted a 108-101 victory on Dec. 5 at Target Center, and has won three in a row vs. Utah; the teams meet again on Dec. 30... Monday's win salvaged the finale of the Wolves' first three-game road trip of the year; they opened with a 104-92 loss to the Lakers on Dec. 11, before falling 120-100 at Sacramento one night later... The Wolves halted their 15-game losing streak with the 106-100 victory at Denver on Nov. 29; it was their first win since the last-second 95-93 triumph over New Jersey on Opening Night (Oct. 28) at Target Center...

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** Last Friday's win over Sacramento ended a string of six consecutive games vs. the West; <u>starting with Sunday's game in Boston, the Wolves play four in a row (and eight of their next 11) vs. Eastern teams</u>...The Dec. 12 loss at Sacramento wrapped up the sixth of 20 sets of back-to-back outings scheduled in 2009-10 for Minnesota... They're 1-5 on the tail end of back-to-backs, the lone win coming Dec. 5 vs. Utah... The Dec. 12 game at ARCO also capped the Wolves' first four-games-in-five-nights set this season; Minnesota has three such groupings slated in 2009-10, up from one a year ago... The Dec. 8 outing at Toronto ended a string of 14 consecutive vs. Western foes, and represented the Timberwolves' first road game vs. an Eastern Conference opponent this season...

**FINDING THE RANGE:** Minnesota shot 57.1% in the Dec. 5 win over Utah, their highest percentage since hitting 59.0% vs. Phoenix on Jan. 29, 2007 (a 121-112 victory)... <u>The Wolves have cleared 50% in five of their past 12 starts</u>, including the 54.7% effort in Friday's win over Sacramento; they'd hit 50%+ just once in their first 16 outings (52.0% vs. Boston, Nov. 2)... A year ago, Minnesota put together back-to-back 50%+ nights twice; the last time they topped that mark in three straight games was Mar. 14-15-17, 2008... The Wolves shot a season-low 32.6% vs. Dallas on Nov. 13, one of six sub-40% outings to date; a year ago, they finished below 40% on 11 occasions, finishing 0-11... The last time Minnesota won a game when shooting below 40% from the floor was Mar. 19, 2008 vs. Memphis (39.3% in a 98-94 victory)... <u>The Wolves currently stand 24th in FG accuracy (44.3%) and 26th in scoring (94.4 ppg)</u>...

ALL YOU NEED IS...: The Wolves outboarded Sacramento 47-37 last Friday, their fourth double-digit cushion this month (fifth overall); they piled up a 49-29 edge Dec. 9 vs. New Orleans... Minnesota has held the board edge in seven of its last 12 starts, compiling a +3.8 rpg (45.8-42.0) margin in that span; the Wolves had come up short in nine of their previous 11 appearances... Phoenix outrebounded Minnesota 45-35 on Nov. 27, the seventh time they've faced a double-digit deficit... The Wolves collected three offensive rebounds vs. Portland on Nov. 11, tying a club record low (ninth time total, most recently Nov. 26, 2007 at New Orleans)... Minnesota ranks 15th in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (.271) and 17th in total rebound percentage (.500), after finishing 10th and 3rd, respectively, a season ago... The Wolves swiped 15 steals Oct. 28 vs. New Jersey, the 15th time in club history (second in the last six years) they've come up with 15+; the franchise single-game mark is 17, set most recently at New Jersey on Mar. 24, 2000... Minnesota currently ranks 7th in steals (8.11 spg); however, they're last in blocked shots (3.25 bpg) and 28th in turnovers (16.3 per game)...

NO FREE LUNCH: Toronto's 40-for-48 effort on Dec. 8 marks the most prolific night by a Wolves opponent in nearly 10 years (since Phoenix went 43-for-49 on Mar. 14, 2000) and just the 9th time an opponent has converted 40+ FTs vs. Minnesota... At the other end, the Wolves have boosted their frequency to 24.8 attempts per game over the past 14, after averaging just 18.2 in their first 14 starts... Minnesota sank all 18 of its FT attempts Nov. 21 at Portland, the 17th perfect night in franchise annals; the club record for most FTs made without a miss is 24 (at Phoenix, Apr. 5, 2003)... The Wolves were a season-low 6-for-9 from the FT line Nov. 14 at Memphis... Overall, Minnesota is receiving 16.5% of its scoring (437 of 2642) from free throws during the regular season (ranking 26th; league average is 18.9%)... That figure was an NBA-best 29.8% (240 of 805) in eight preseason starts... The Wolves are 27th in FT accuracy (72.6%) and 28th in FTs attempted (21.5 per game); a year ago, they ranked 15th (76.9%) and 19th (23.9 per game), respectively...

**LONG-RANGE PLANS:** The Wolves went 7-for-14 from three-point distance Dec. 4 at New Orleans, tying season bests for both treys made and accuracy... <u>They've improved their percentage to 34.7% (42-for-121) in 11 December starts</u>, after converting on just 26.0% from beyond the arc through November... Meanwhile, Phoenix finished 14-for-26 on Nov. 1, equaling the 6th-highest total of three-pointers ever allowed by Minnesota; the Suns have also authored two of the top five (16, Mar. 20, 2007; 15, Jan. 29, 2007)... Through the season's first 28 games, <u>the Wolves are 29th in three-point accuracy (28.9%) and 27th in treys made (3.68 per game)</u>... Meanwhile, they're limiting the opposition to a combined 34.8% from beyond the arc, good for 14th in the NBA...

**DOUBLING DOWN:** The Dec. 9 loss vs. New Orleans marked the third time in 11 December outings that Minnesota has let a double-digit lead slip away, having squandered 11-point advantages vs. Memphis (a 97-95 loss on Dec. 2) and at New Orleans (a 98-89 defeat on Dec. 4)... On the flipside, the Wolves have rallied from deficits of at least 11 points in four of their five victories this season... The Nuggets led by as many as 17 points and enjoyed a 64-50 halftime cushion before the Wolves rallied on Nov. 29; that equals the largest halftime deficit Minnesota has overcome since beating the Lakers 113-108 on Dec. 2, 2005 at Staples Center (trailed 60-45 at the break)... Seven of Minnesota's past 12 games have been decided by single-digit margins (including five by six points or less); that's on the heels of an 11-game stretch that saw the Wolves suffer 10 double-figure losses (five by 20+)...

**OPENING ACT:** The Wolves began the 2009-10 regular season by slipping past New Jersey, 95-93, on Oct. 28... New Jersey built a 19-point lead (72-53) midway through the third period before Minnesota rallied; *it's the 8th-biggest comeback in franchise history*, and the largest 2nd-half deficit the Wolves have overcome since spotting Dallas a 24-point advantage before roaring back to win 113-110 in overtime on Jan. 17, 1998 at Reunion Arena... They've now won 14 of their past 15 home openers, having a 12-game winning streak in that category snapped with a 99-91 loss to Denver on Nov. 2, 2007... All-time, Minnesota improves to 13-8 on Opening Night, *having* started 12 of the past 14 seasons with wins (also losing 100-95 in 1999 vs. Sacramento in Tokyo); they're 15-6 in home openers...

**ONE FOR THE BOOKS:** Golden State's 146-point explosion on Nov. 9 equaled the top single-game total ever by a Wolves opponent; the Warriors posted a 146-109 victory on Apr. 1, 1994 in Oakland... The final 41-point spread also matches the biggest losing margin in club history; Minnesota suffered a 113-72 defeat at Miami on Mar. 5, 1996... The Wolves committed 28 turnovers at Golden State, one short of the franchise single-game record; they coughed it up 29 times at New Jersey on Nov. 4, 2002... Meanwhile, <u>the Warriors' 22 steals on Nov. 9 mark the highest total in an NBA game in over 12 years</u>, since Atlanta swiped 23 at Philadelphia on Apr. 9, 1997...

**BOARD PRODIGY:** Timberwolves forward Kevin Love finished 2008-09 as only the fifth rookie in NBA history to collect in excess of 20 percent of all rebounds available during his minutes on the floor. According to <u>Basketball-Reference.com</u>, Love's Rebound Percentage of 21.0% is the 7th-most-prolific single-season NBA figure ever among players 22 or younger (min. 50 Games Played):

The current absence matches Charlotte and New York for the longest active playoff drought; Portland had sat out five straight years before qualifying last spring... Minnesota opened 4-15 before Randy Wittman was relieved of his coaching duties on Dec. 8, then went 20-43 under Kevin McHale... Originally chosen by New York in the 3rd round (58th overall) of the 1980 NBA Draft, he played the 1980-81 season in Greece before signing with the Lakers as a free agent in 1981...
