

The Royal Agriculture and Forestry College was established in 1860. The town of Križevci and the College have always enjoyed close links, since the College beginnings to the present day.






- First agriculture and forestry college in the South-East Europe

- First agriculture and forestry manuals and textbooks in Croatian


- 1885 introduction of first Simmental cattle in Croatia
- 1887 first Simmental cattle, a bull and two cows were bought in Switzerland for the Royal Agriculture and Forestry College
- 1888 nine Simmental cattle, 1 bull, 1 heifer, one cow and 6 calves at the College
- 1898 first Simmental Herd Books were formed for the College herd
- 1909 first winter farm school in Sv. Ivan Žabno




Education Record Book for the first five years, 1865

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




Education at Križevci College of Agriculture



Objectives:

- Prepare graduates to work in
 - Agricultural production
 - Services (processing, marketing, trade, input supplies)
 - Extension / advisory services
 - Rural development organisations

Professional study courses in agriculture (180 ECTS, 3 years)



Course structure Lectures 39 % Demonstrations and seminars 35 % Practical work on College farm and other agricultural estates 26 %

Course description

- Each semester includes 30 ECTS, academic year includes 60 ECTS
- 1 credit equals 15 hours of teaching
- Each semester has 7 modules, and one of the modules is practical training in specific field
- The principle of 60: 40 in favour of exercises and practical training to lectures was respected
- The relationship between compulsory and optional modules is 75:25

Practical training

- □ In Semester 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, apart from theoretical instruction/direct contact hours, students have practical training related to professional modules, mainly at the College farm
- □ In Semester 6 in March students study Agricultural Policy module (2 ECTS) and are prepared for Practical Training (Work Placement) of 420 hours (28 ECTS) on outstanding farms and agricultural estates/companies in Croatia and abroad

Number of modules

The three courses of the Professional Study Course comprise 104 modules:

14 modules at Course Foundation level (Year 1, two semesters, 60 ECTS) 30 modules at specific study courses (Year 2 and 3, Semester 3, 4, 5 and 6, 120 ECTS)

The College staff module coordinators

The College highly qualified staff coordinates
101 modules or 97.12%,
while only 3 modules or 2.88% are coordinated
by the staff from other higher education institutions

On completion of the study course and successful defending of final thesis a student is awarded the title of:

- Farm Management

Job opportunities

SPECIALIST GRADUTE PROFESSIONAL COURSE SUSTAINABLE AND ORGANIC AGRICULTURE

Length: 2 years (120 ECTS)

Semester 1 Course foundations (30 ECTS)
All modules compulsory

Semester 2 and 3 (60 ECTS)
Students study two compulsory and three optional modules

Semester 4 (30 ECTS)

Specialist professional practical training in outstanding companies and enterprises and other land-related industries






College qualified staff coordinate 16 modules or 73 % Only 6 modules or 27 % are coordinated by the staff from other Higher Education institutions

Short courses and specialist seminars

- Uprgrade knowledge of professional workers in landbased industries
- Train entrepreneurs in agribusiness
- Duration: around two months (up to 70 hours)
- Delivery: over weekend (Saturday and Sunday)
- Theory + specialist practical training
- Teaching staff: KCA, Faculty of Agriculture (Zagreb), Agricultural Faculty (Osijek), Croatian Agricultural Extention Institute, Croatian Livestock Centre, Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Water Management




















