Did you know?

- Fewer than half of our states currently license direct entry midwives, and few such midwives practice in states where they are not legal.
- Certified nurse-midwives practice legally in every state, but are almost always hampered at least to some degree by medical model of care restrictions over their practices, primarily due to requirements to have a practice agreement with a physician (requirements vary from state to state).
- Midwives practicing outside of hospitals have been subjected to investigations and felony prosecutions, just for practicing midwifery.
- Many health insurance or HMO policies do not cover midwife-attended births and/or out-of-hospital births, even though these are safe and cost-effective and preferred by many mothers and families.
- The American Medical Association and the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists work actively to restrict the scope of practice of mid-level health care providers, including midwives. Increasingly, some state level medical associations are working aggressively to oppose licensing legislation for direct entry midwives, the specialists in home birth.

Citizens for Midwifery works across the country to promote the Midwives Model of Care and provide tools and information to help expectant parents and midwifery advocates bring about changes in maternity care, including increased legal access to midwives, in and out of the hospital.
