SEASON NOTES

CONNECTIONS: Mavericks guard J.J. Barea played his college ball at Northeastern in Boston...Mavericks guard Jason Kidd and Celtics forward Brian Scalabrine played together with the Nets from 2001-05...Mavericks coach Rick Carlisle played for the Celtics for three seasons and was a member of the 1986 World Championship team...Celtics guard Marquis Daniels played for the Mavericks from 2003-2006 and was a member of the Mavericks Western Conference Championship squad...Mavericks forward Shawn Marion and Celtics guard Eddie House played in Phoenix together from 2005-2006...Mavericks guard Matt Carroll and Celtics center Rasheed Wallace played in Portland together from 2003-2004.

FYI:

- Since at MIL 11/16, the Mavericks have won 18 of 20 games when scoring 97+ points and have lost 9 of 10 games when scoring 96-or-less (only win vs. NO, 12/14)
- Dallas forced 11 steals vs. OKC (1/15) and improved to 9-1 when recorded 10+ steals
- Over the last 3 games, Dirk Nowitzki is averaging 27.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 39.2 minutes while shooting 52.7% (29-55 FGs)...he has shot at least 50% FG in each of his last 3 games
- Dallas improved to 11-2 in games after a loss vs. OKC (1/15) – the best mark in the NBA
- Jason Kidd recorded his 11th double-double (2nd consecutive) of the season vs. OKC (1/15) with 11 points (4-8 FGs, 2-5 3FGs, 1-3 FTs), 4 rebounds, 11 assists and 4 steals in 38 minutes...the double-double was his 8th with points-assists
- Dallas won in DEN (12/27) for the 1st time since 12/31/06 – in those nearly 3 years, Dallas had lost 4 consecutive regular season games and 3 more postseason contests. The drought was the Mavs' longest on the road. With the win at Pepsi Center out of the way, Dallas will look to win in BOS for the 1st time since 3/23/07 and the 1st time against the Hornets since 3/27/07 (in Okla. City)
- Jason Kidd is 1 of 7 players to have 8+ points-assists double-doubles this season (PHO Nash leads league with 24 followed by NO Paul 18, BOS Rondo 17, UTA Williams 16, LAC Davis 11, CLE James 9)
- Dallas is 16-2 when outrebounding the opposition (recently: L, 45-41 vs. UTA, 1/9)
- Dirk Nowitzki has now played 878 games as a Maverick, the 2nd-most in franchise history (passed Derek Harper vs. DET 1/5). Nowitzki trails only Brad Davis (883)
- The Mavericks captured their 13th road victory at SA (1/8)...a season ago, Dallas won just 18 total road games
- The Mavericks will next be in action at home on 1/26 when they host Brandon Jennings and the Milwaukee Bucks at 7:30 p.m. on FSSW

30TH ANNIVERSARY: The Dallas Mavericks celebrate their 30th season this year. In 29 seasons, the Mavericks have enjoyed 11 50-win seasons, 15 playoff appearances (nine consecutive), three Western Conference Finals berths and one trip to the NBA Finals.

SAVE A TREE: The Mavericks announced on Oct. 5 that their digital media guide is now available for download at mavs.com. For the first time in team history, the team opted not to print a media guide in order to conserve natural resources. REMARKABLE STREAK: The Mavericks' 99-98 win vs. OKC (1/15) was their 8th consecutive win in a 1-point game, dating back to Jan., 2007. That's tied for the 3rd-longest streak in NBA history. The St. Louis Hawks won 10 straight 1-point games from 1959 to 1960 and the Sacramento Kings had a 9-game streak from 2002 to 2005. (Many other teams have won 8 straight games decided by 1 point.)

HIS PLACE IN HISTORY: Dirk Nowitzki became the 34th player in NBA history to score 20,000 career points with a 30-point night vs. LAL (1/13) and now ranks 33rd all-time on the NBA's scoring list. He scored his 20,000th and 20,001st points at the 10:57 mark of the 4th quarter on a 14-foot jumper over Lamar Odom. He now has 20,065 career points. Nowitzki, the Mavericks' leading scorer, is 2nd player to reach the 20,000-point plateau this season joining BOS Ray Allen who accomplished the feat at WAS (12/10/09). Nowitzki passed Tom Chambers (20,049) for 33rd position with 19 points at TOR (1/17). He now trails BOS's Ray Allen and Mitch Raymond (20,497). Nowitzki ranks 6th among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Kobe Bryant, Allen Iverson, Kevin Garnett and Allen. Nowitzki is followed by Tim Duncan (19,964) and Paul Pierce (19,211).

MORE ON DIRK'S FEAT: Dirk Nowitzki is the 4th player born outside the U.S. (1st European) to score 20,000 career points. He joins Patrick Ewing (Jamaica, 24,815), Hakeem Olajuwon (Nigeria, 26,946) and Dominique Wilkins (France, 26,668). Of the 33 players who reach the 20,000-point plateau before Nowitzki, all of them who were eligible to be in the Hall of Fame have done so aside from Mitch Raymond (20,497) and Tom Chambers (20,049).

GOODEN PLENTY: Drew Gooden shot a perfect 8-8 FGs in a win at DEN (12/27) en route to game-high 19 points with 10 rebounds and 27 minutes off the bench. (The previous night, Dallas' other center Erick Dampier had gone 6-6 FGs on his way to a 13-point, 10-rebound double-double.) The double-double was Gooden's 6th of the season. The game was the 5th of his 7-plus season career in which he was perfect from the floor. In the previous 4 games, Gooden had never scored more than 8 points. In fact, he had made 9 total shots and scored 19 total points in his 4 other 100% shooting games. His 8 makes without a miss match the Mavericks franchise mark. His is 1 of 13 games (12 players) in the NBA this season in which a player scored 15+ points and shot 100% FG.

PROTECTING WHAT'S THEIRS: Dallas committed just 6 turnovers and allowed only 6 points off those turnovers in a win vs. CLE (12/20). For the season, there have been just 7 teams (9 times) that have committed 6 turnovers or less. Dallas had an NBA season-low 5 turns vs. SA (11/18) and is one of only 2 teams (UTA) to have multiple games with 6 or fewer giveaways. Dallas 13.0 turnovers per game are the 3rd-lowest committed in the NBA along with NO (behind ATL 12.2 and MIA 12.8).

GOOD NIGHT FROM THE FIELD: The Mavericks shot 45.0% (36-80 FGs, 5-15 3FGs) from the field at TOR (1/17). The game was the 19th of the season (14-5 record) in which the Mavs shot at least 45% FG.

LOTS OF HELP: Dallas recorded 25 assists on 41 made field goals at DEN (12/27) led by Jason Kidd's 9 and 5 from Jason Terry. Dallas improved to 14-1 when dishing 25+ assists. Dallas is 12-3 when Kidd dishes 10+ assists. The Mavericks rank T-5th in the league at 22.7 apg.

DIFFERENT KIND OF DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Jason Kidd recorded his 3rd rebounds-assists double-double (2nd in an OT game) of the season with a season-high tying 11 rebounds (11 DR) and 10 assists with 8 points and 4 steals in 43 minutes vs. HOU (12/18). He is the only player in the NBA this season to record a double-double of this variety. Since 2006-07, there have been 18 rebounds-assists double-doubles with Kidd owning 11 of them.

DIRK GOES FOR 30/10 AGAIN: Dirk Nowitzki turned out his 5th 30-point/10-rebound effort of the season with game-highs of 30 points (11-22 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 7-7 FTs) and 16 rebounds in 43 minutes vs. LAL (1/13). Dallas is 4-1 in those games. In the 2009 calendar year, Nowitzki had the 4th-most 30/10 games in the NBA and he currently has the 3rd-most in the 2009-10 season.

NOWITZKI EFFICIENCY: Dirk Nowitzki's 35 points at OKC (12/16) came on a very efficient 72.2% (13-18 FGs, 2-2 3FGs) from the floor. The game was the 2nd of the season for Nowitzki in which he scored at least 30 while shooting at least 71% FG (also 31, 10-14 FGs, .714 at IND 11/27). Nowitzki, GS Maggette and POR Roy are the only players in the league to have multiple games of 30 points on 70% FG. There have been 18 such games total this season. Nowitzki and MIL's Andrew Bogut are the only players this season to record a double-double in games with 30 points and 70% FG.

ANOTHER NIGHT OF 90: For the 7th time this season, the Mavericks shot 90% from the free throw vs. DET (1/5). Dallas made 17 of their 18 attempts (.944). Shawn Marion (8-8 FTs) led the Mavericks while their only miss came from Jason Terry (3-4). The Mavs are 5-2 when shooting such a high percentage from the line and have the most games at 90+ percent. NY (2-3), POR (3-1), HOU (2-2) and IND (2-1) are the only other teams to have 3+ such games.

LUCKY #13: Jason Kidd dished 13 assists in a game for the 3rd time this season vs. NO (12/14). Kidd is 1 of 4 players to record 3 13-assist games this season.

CLOSE CALL: Dallas is 11-4 (.733) in games decided by 5 points or less. Recently, the Mavs defeated OKC (1/15) 99-98. Since naming Rick Carlisle head coach, the Mavericks are 29-9 (.763) in games decided by that margin.

PLETHORA OF POINTS: Dirk Nowitzki has scored 981 points through 38 games this season. Nowitzki, who owns the NBA's 7th-highest scoring average, poured in his 11th 30-point game of the season vs. OKC (1/15). Nowitzki scored a game-high 32 points (9-18 FGs, 0-1 3FGs, 14-15 FTs) including 20 in the 2nd half. A season ago, Nowitzki had 26 30-point games, tying his career high (also 2005-06). He is on pace for around 23 30-point games this season.

NEARLY-FAULTLESS 4TH: Dirk Nowitzki has missed 1 free throw in the 4th quarter and overtime (3 games). Nowitzki is 81-82 from the line (4-4 in OT) down the stretch. Between the late 4th quarter vs. NO (4/10/09) and the 2:02 mark of the 4th vs. POR (12/22), Nowitzki had made 66 consecutive FTs down the stretch. Since late in the 4th quarter of the POR game, Nowitzki has started another streak and has now made 24 straight FTs in the 4th and OT.

PRISTINE 15: Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 25th 15-point half of the season vs. OKC (1/15) with 20 points in 21 2nd half minutes. For the season, Nowitzki has 8 20-point performances in a half – all of which have come after halftime. In halves when Nowitzki scores 15+, he shoots a combined 53.3% (163-306 FGs) from the floor, 55.6% (15-27 3FGs) from 3 and 92.6% (126-136 FTs) from the line.

BOUNCING BACK: Since the 2000-01 season (1st of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have suffered just 55 losses (in 778 games) of 15+ points. Five of those losses have come this season (88-110 at TOR, 1/17). What's more impressive though, is that the Mavs have won 39 of the games following their 15-point losses (39-15, .722). This season, Dallas is 2-2 in games following 15-point losses. Dallas has lost back-to-back by at least 15 just once in that span (2001-02 season).

HOT SHOT: Dallas poured in another great shooting effort at DEN (12/27). The Mavericks, for the game, shot 50.0% (41-82 FGs) from the floor for the game. Dallas now owns 3 of the top 15 shooting games of the season, including the 2 of the 3 highest. The Mavs shot 65.5% (55-84 FGs) from the floor at HOU (11/25), 62.4% in a win vs. TOR (11/7) and 58.7% (44-75 FGs) in another win at NJ (12/2). A season ago, DAL just reached the 60% mark at MIA on 1/31/09 (.603). The last the time Mavs had shot that high a clip was when they went 67.7% vs. San Diego Clippers in 1983. The Mavericks are 8-0 when shooting at least 50% FG.

JET & COMPANY: The Mavericks reserves rank 5th in the NBA in points per game (37.7). Jason Terry contributed his 11th 20-point game off the bench vs. OKC (1/15) and has single-handedly outscored the opposing bench 6 times this season (3-3 record, recently: 23-14 vs. MEM, 12/26). JET is 1 of 3 reserves to have at least 10 20-point games off the bench this season (HOU Landry 15, ATL Crawford 16, NY Harrington 11). Terry has scored the 3rd-most points of any player off the bench (645) and his 16.6 ppg ranks 3rd among all reserves. Terry (5th, 3.7) also ranks in the top 10 assists leaders off the bench.

TOP 40: Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 2nd 40-point game of the season (14th of career, Mavs 10-4 record) vs. SA (11/18). He finished the OT thriller with a season-high 41 points (15-29 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 10-12 FTs) in 45 minutes. Nowitzki is 1 of 9 players in the NBA to have multiple 40-point games. There have been 42 40-point outings this season.

IN SPITE OF THE RIM: The Mavericks are 7-9 when shooting less than 44% FG (recently, L vs. LAL, 1/13). A season ago, Dallas was 6-24 when shooting less than 44%. Dallas also has an NBA-best 4 wins when shooting 40% or less FG (4-6 overall; L at LAL, 1/3). Dallas won just 1 of 13 games last season when shooting 40% or worse.

MOVING UP THE RANKS: Jason Terry now has 7,092 points as a Maverick and has moved into 7th place all-time among Mavs, passing Sam Perkins (6,766) with 18 points at NJ (12/2). Terry now trails Mavericks player development coach Brad Davis, one of only two players to have his jersey retired by the franchise, for 6th place. If JET sustains his 16.6 points per game pace, look for him to overtake Davis (7,623) by the end of the season.

CRASHING THE BOARDS: Erick Dampier had a monster night on the boards vs. HOU (11/10), coming down with 20 rebounds and a career-high 17 defensive rebounds. The game marked the 8th of his career (2nd with the Mavs) with 20+ rebounds. He has 33 14-rebound performances (6 this season) since joining the Mavs in 2004-05 (recently: 15 vs. POR, 12/22). Dallas is 22-11 when he has 14+ rebounds. Dampier had 6 games with 14+ a season ago.

IRON ERICK: Erick Dampier recorded his 7th double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 rebounds in 35 minutes vs. MEM (12/26). In 2008-09, Dampier had 6 double-doubles for the entire season. When Damp scores 10+ points, odds usually favor the Mavs. Since his arrival in Dallas (2004-05 season), Dampier has recorded 50 double-doubles (39-11 record, .780). When the center scores 10+ points, Dallas is 77-19 (.802). Over the past 4 seasons, Dampier has missed 18 regular season games – including the 10 this season.

DIRK and KIDD FOR 3: For his career, Dirk Nowitzki has 1,107 3-pointers and ranks T-42nd all-time among NBA players (needs 17 3s to overtake David Wesley for 41st). In fact, Nowitzki (7,487 rebounds) and teammate Jason Kidd (1,561 3FGs, 7,616 rebs) are 2 of only 3 players in the NBA to have at least 1,000 3s and 7,000 rebounds (also BOS Rasheed Wallace, 1,034 3s and 7,154 rebounds).

CLUTCH: Dirk Nowitzki was once again the hero for the Mavericks vs. CHA (12/12) as he boosted them in overtime. Despite struggling from the field throughout the game, the German scored a 6-0 run over the last 1:20 of regulation to force the extra 5:00. Then, with 1.7 seconds remaining in OT, Nowitzki hit a 10-foot fade away to secure the win. The game-winner is Nowitzki's 2nd of the season (also in OT at MIL, 11/16) and the 8th of his career when there are less than 5 seconds remaining. Since 2005-06, Nowitzki owns the most game-winners (put team ahead for good in final 2 seconds) of any player in the NBA.

TOE THE LINE: The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, are shooting 80.0% (738-922 FTs) from the line and lead the league in FT%. Since the 2000-01 season (first of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.3% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 4 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08) and have finished in at least the top 6 each year. In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 87.8% FT (7th in NBA) and has hit 4,610 FTs (4th).

WHAT A FLIRT: Jason Kidd is flirting with his 1st triple-double of the season (currently he has 103 for career trailing Oscar Robertson's 181 and Magic Johnson's 138). The point guard has 11 double-doubles and has fallen just short of a triple-double in 6 contests.

ALL ALONE IN SECOND PLACE: Jason Kidd now ranks 2nd all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders (10,555 assists). With 7 assists at HOU (11/25/09), he passed Mark Jackson (10,334) for 2nd position. More specifically, Kidd dished his 10,335th assists on an alley-oop lob to rookie Rodrigue Beaubois with 10:52 to play in the 3rd quarter of the HOU game. Kidd now trails only John Stockton (15,806). For the season, the guard averages 8.9 assists (5th among NBA leaders).

STOLE THE SHOW: With 2,264 steals, Jason Kidd now ranks 6th on the NBA's all-time steals list. With 2 steals at SA (11/11/09), Kidd surpassed Clyde Drexler (2,207). The point guard is 44 steals away from taking 5th position from Scottie Pippen (2,307).

TOP 10 LIST: Jason Kidd hit 2 3-pointers at TOR (1/17) to move into 5th place all-time on the NBA's 3-point field goals made list with 1,561 (surpassing Glen Rich, 1,559 3FGs). For his career, Kidd has 1,561 3-pointers. Kidd now trails NO's Peja Stojakovic and Dale Ellis (1,719 3FGs). He can be found on several other NBA Top 10 lists (2nd at 10,555 career assists, 6th at 9.2 apg; 3rd with 103 triple-doubles; 6th with 2,264 steals).

A STRING OF STARTS: Jason Kidd has the 7th-most starts in NBA history and has started 98.9% (1134-1147) of the games he has played. Only 2 other players with 1,000 career games have started a higher percentage than Kidd (Karl Malone: 99.7%, 1471-1476; Shaquille O'Neal: 99.2%, 1143-1152). Kidd ranks 35th in career games.

BACK-TO-BACK IT UP: Dallas finishes the 12th of 20 back-to-backs at BOS (1/18). The Mavericks have 4 more back-to-backs than last year. Seven begin on the road and conclude at home, seven are on the road and six are home-away. Twelve of Dallas' back-to-backs occur in the first half of the season. Dallas is 9-3 (.750) in the first game of a back-to-back and 5-5 (.500) in the second game.

HOW THE MAVS WERE BUILT: Of the 14 players currently on the roster, nine are former first round draft picks (Erick Dampier, Drew Gooden, Josh Howard, Jason Kidd, Shawn Marion, Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Terry, Tim Thomas, Rodrigue Beaubois). Seven were top 10 picks (Dampier, Gooden, Kidd, Marion, Nowitzki, Terry, Thomas). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994). Eduardo Najera is the only Maverick to be drafted in the second round. Four Mavericks were undrafted (J.J. Barea, Matt Carroll, Quinton Ross, James Singleton).

EVERYTHING IS BIGGER IN TEXAS: On 10/30/08, Dallas was awarded the 2010 NBA All-Star Game (Feb. 14, 2010). In a joint venture between Mavericks owner Mark Cuban and Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones, and following the mantra that "everything is bigger in Texas," the All-Star Game will be played at the new Dallas Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, which will have a seating capacity of over 80,000 fans. This collaboration between the NBA, and the ownership groups of the Mavericks and Cowboys, will afford Mavericks season ticket holders a chance to partake in the NBA All-Star Game. The T-Mobile Rookie Challenge and NBA All-Star Saturday Night will take place at American Airlines Center. Dallas last hosted All-Star festivities in 1986.

ELITE COMPANY: The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers 12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics 10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)
- San Antonio Spurs 10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics 9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)
- Dallas Mavericks 9 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

JUST THE TWO OF US: The Mavericks and Spurs are the only two teams to have won 50+ games in each of the past nine seasons. Here's a look at the records of the Mavericks and Spurs over the past nine seasons:

20,000 MANIAACS: The Mavericks have sold out 337 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 277-71 (.796). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Regular Season Coaching Record: 357-257 (.581); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-37 (.486)

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
