The mission of the Virginia
Tech Foundation is to advance
the academic, outreach, and
research programs of Virginia
Tech by providing financial
support from nongovernmental sources and by undertaking
strategic initiatives as request-

ed by the university.

During a year of challenging financial markets and economic conditions, the foundation has preserved its assets and increased its financial support of Virginia Tech despite international stock and debt market turmoil. Private contributions to the foundation in support of the university's programs reached an all-time high of \$91.6 million as The Campaign for Virginia Tech: Invent the Future crossed the \$683 million mark. The endowment increased slightly to \$527.6 million despite declines in the broad investment market, providing \$29.1 million to university programs.

Advancement of major university initiatives, both on and off campus, continued with the site acquisition for a major research facility proximate to federal research centers in Arlington, authorization by the General Assembly for transfer of property by the university to the foundation for the second phase of the Virginia Tech Corporate Research Center, groundbreaking for the new basketball practice facility adjacent to Cassell Coliseum, and construction of the Integrated Life Sciences Building in the Virginia Tech Corporate Research Center.

As a corporate citizen, the Virginia Tech Foundation has engaged in community development and enhanced economic capacity in the region. It's responsible practices led to the designation of its Arlington research facility as a LEED-silver building, the use of geothermal heating in two new buildings at the Corporate Research Center, and stream-bank restoration on the Heth Farm property.

It is the financial support and engagement of our donors that make possible the Virginia Tech Foundation's significant contribution to advancing the university. Together, we touch the lives of thousands of students, support cutting-edge research, and improve the quality of life within our region and around the world. Thank you for joining with us in this exciting endeavor.

FROM THE COO: Raymond D. Smoot Jr. | Chief Operating Officer and Secretary-Treasurer



Despite challenging economic markets, the Virginia Tech Foundation maintained strong financial support of the university and received record contributions during the past year. Concurrently, new real estate developments were initiated to

support university strategic initiatives.

Financial support of university programs totaled \$95.3 million as compared to \$77.9 million in the previous year. Revenues and investment activity for the year totaled \$145.7 million, a decrease of 28 percent compared to the previous year. Total assets decreased to \$926.0 million from \$940.9 million for the previous year. Net assets increased to \$722 million to \$707.3 million. The value of the Virginia Tech endowment was \$527.6 million at the end of the fiscal year. The consolidated endowment earned -0.7 percent, considerably in excess of the domestic and international equity markets.

Real estate development to support strategic initiatives of the university moved forward with several projects. All governmental approvals were obtained and construction will soon begin on a university research center in Arlington, proximate to federal research agencies that support substantial components of the university's research agenda. Armada Hoffler and Bruce Smith Enterprise began redevelopment of the former Red Lion Inn property, which will generate income to the foundation through a land-lease and carried interest. Two buildings neared completion in the Virginia Tech Corporate Research Center, which will provide facilities for university research centers, while construction began on two additional buildings for private company tenants. A \$7 million interior upgrade at Hotel Roanoke was completed. Construction started on a clubhouse for the Pete Dye River Course, home of the university's intercollegiate gold team.


The foundation continues to engage in the regional community in ways that contribute to the advancement of the university. Financial support was provided for preliminary work on behalf of the proposed Virginia Tech Carilion School of Medicine and Research Institute. The foundation participated in the consortium providing debt financing for construction of the Taubman Museum of Art in Roanoke, Virginia. Investment was made through the NewVa Investment Fund in four early-stage companies. Planning was initiated for Phase II of the Virginia Tech Corporate Research Center, which will provide space for additional companies and research centers. Foundation employees received the United Way's Special Achievement Award and volunteered their time and talent to other community service organizations.

The impact of private support is felt daily in the lives of Virginia Tech students and faculty. Financial aid of \$18.4 million was provided, which enabled capable, deserving students to begin or continue their education. More than \$35.7 million went to academic programs, faculty support, and university facilities. The significance of private support is felt across the university and by those it serves throughout the state, nation, and world.

The mission of the Virginia Tech Foundation is to support the programs of Virginia Tech. The foundation does this by generating funding from private sources and aggressively managing its assets to supplement state appropriations. The foundation provides additional operating support to colleges and departments, assists in the funding of major building projects, provides seed capital for new university initiatives, and initiates major projects as requested by the university.

The foundation manages Virginia Tech's endowment, through which donors to the university make a significant difference to the faculty and students. This year, Virginia Tech donors created 123 endowments, including ones for undergraduate scholarships, graduate student fellowships, faculty support, athletic scholarships, the Center for the Arts, and other initiatives.

The foundation is also a responsible corporate citizen. As such, the foundation deploys capital in ways that serve the interests not only of the university, but also of Blacksburg and Southwest Virginia.



FACULTY AND RESEARCH SUPPORT

The foundation is a vital part of faculty and research support for Virginia Tech. It provides funding for faculty research and salaries through the endowment and owns property throughout the commonwealth that enables the university to expand its graduate offerings, develop collaborations with a variety of organizations. and support a number of research projects.

THE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION

Because the foundation owns and is currently developing property in the National Capital Region, Virginia Tech is able to offer a wide range of graduate programs, workshops, and customized educational programs there. The university also boasts a number of nationally recognized research centers in the area, such as the Center for Energy and the Global Environment, the Institute for Policy and Governance, and the Marion duPont Scott Equine Medical Center. Virginia Tech's presence there has also enabled the university to establish collaborations and partnerships with local and federal agencies, nonprofit research organizations, businesses, and other institutions of higher education.

Virginia Tech's presence in the National Capital Region is continually expanding. Current locations include Alexandria, Arlington, Falls Church, Leesburg, Manassas, and Middleburg.

In June, the Virginia Tech Foundation announced that it will build a major research center in the Ballston area of Arlington, with occupancy planned for early 2011. The highly visible, state-of-the-art facility will further the university's mission to expand its research



portfolio in a region that offers great opportunity for partnerships with corporate research entities and close proximity to government agencies and other public and private-sector organizations.

The seven-floor, 144,000-square-foot building, designed by Cooper Carry to meet the Silver U.S. Green Building Council's LEED Building Rating Systems, will be located in the 800-900 block of North Glebe Road. The inte-

rior will include computational laboratories, offices, and conference space to accommodate executive programs, training programs, and workshops. A number of already established Virginia Tech research centers, currently located throughout the Northern Virginia area, will move to the Ballston facility, which will have secure highperformance information technology systems that address national security issues. That portion of the building not occupied by Virginia Tech will be available for commercial lease.

THE VIRGINIA TECH CORPORATE **RESEARCH CENTER**

The Virginia Tech Corporate Research Center (CRC), a for-profit subsidiary of the Virginia Tech Foundation. continues to expand. Currently, more than 130 research and development businesses and research centers are

located at the park and total employment exceeds 2,000. The success of the tenants in the park has been due in part to advantages offered by the CRC, including a comprehensive business assistance program, a low-cost telecommunications infrastructure, a financial assistance package, training opportunities, and personnel assistance.

The park consists of 23 buildings containing more than 775,000 square feet, but the master plan calls for a total build-out of 1 million square feet in the 120-acre park.



As of June 2008, there were three buildings under construction:

- > The 77,000-square-foot Integrated Life Sciences Building (Research Building 24) is the result of a collaborative effort of Virginia Tech's colleges of Agriculture and Life Sciences, Science, Natural Resources, and Veterinary Medicine. This building was scheduled for completion in August 2008.
- > The 45,000-square-foot **Research Building 25** will house a large biomechanics research lab that is a collaboration between the Edward Via Virginia College of Osteopathic Medicine and Virginia Tech. In addition, approximately half of the building will support classified government research. This building will be complete in early 2009.
- > **Research Building 26**, 45,000 square feet, will house private company research projects primarily in the materials area. This building will be complete in late fall 2008.

In addition, the CRC has started designing Phase II of its campus. Phase II will nearly double the current acreage of the park and provide a growth path for the CRC for many years to come. The transfer of land from Virginia Tech to the foundation is in process and has been approved by the General Assembly and the governor. The master plan anticipates an additional 23 buildings in Phase II.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

The foundation has a profound influence on academics at Virginia Tech. In part, that is because nearly 50 percent of the endowment is dedicated to scholarship support. In addition, many endowment accounts are created by donors to support specific academic programs, from departments to research centers.

But the foundation also has a direct relationship with the students in SEED and BASIS who manage some of the foundation's portfolio. The foundation also owns the Center for European Studies and Architecture (CESA) in Riva San Vitale, Switzerland, which offers Virginia Tech students the opportunity to study abroad.

CENTER FOR EUROPEAN STUDIES AND ARCHITECTURE

CESA is the university's European campus. The center's location in Ticino, the Italian-speaking canton of Switzerland, is also close to major northern Italian cities, such as Milan. A wide variety of semester-long and summer study-abroad programs provide diverse learning experiences for undergraduates and graduate students. The residential learning communities at CESA go far beyond the traditional classroom experience and take advantage of Ticino's strategic location. With spectacular natural beauty, varied educa-



tional opportunities, and rich cultural and historical heritage in the area, CESA offers the potential for a unique international experience. While many CESA programs are tailored for the educational and research development of Virginia Tech faculty members and students, there is also an important focus on collaboration with nearby institutions to arrange faculty and student exchanges.





The foundation has committed a small portion of its endowment assets to enhance educational opportunities by funding two student-managed investment portfolios. Each program combines a highly competitive selection process with tailored course work to form 20 to 25 person teams. The programs provide a unique



SEED (Student-Managed Endowment for Educational Development) was founded in 1991 through the Pamplin College of Business and manages a \$5 million large-cap domestic equity portfolio benchmarked to the S&P 500 Index. Over the years, SEED has performed well relative to its benchmark. Investment performance during the program's 2007-2008 fiscal year outperformed the S&P 500 Index by 3.2 percent in an extremely volatile market. This performance ranked in the top 36th percentile of the large-cap domestic equity managers in the Cambridge Associates universe, which means that the SEED students outperformed 64 percent of professional



BASIS (Bond and Securities Investing by Students) is Pamplin's most recently formed student program. It manages a \$5 million portfolio of fixed income securities. The funding of BASIS was initiated in October 2006 and program refinements during the year included changing its benchmark, adding fixed income EFT's to better manage market exposure, and refocusing on the management of interest rate risk. Investment performance for the program's 2007-2008 fiscal year outperformed the LB Gov/Credit Index by 1.8 percent and ranked in the top 5 percent of all fixed income managers in the Cambridge Associates universe. During a difficult year due to a realignment of risk premiums, BASIS increased its focus on credit analysis and risk exposure, which enabled them to avoid some of the major losses in the financial sector. The students and graduates have achieved early success in summer internships and the job market within the structured products and fixed income area at such firms as Goldman Sachs, Freddie Mac, Wachovia Securities, and Bank of America. Faculty advisors overseeing BASIS are finance professors George E. Morgan and Raman Kumar.

The foundation is currently allowing the Center for Total Maximum Daily Load and Watershed Studies at Virginia Tech to conduct research on their property at Heth Farm in order to determine how Stroubles Creek is affected by the town of Blacksburg and the Virginia Tech campus. Parts of the creek have been determined by the Commonwealth of Virginia to be impaired.



The center's research will help reduce the hydrologic and water quality impacts of stormwater runoff from Blacksburg and Virginia Tech and will ultimately improve the health of the creek for the wildlife that lives in and around it.

NEWVA FUND

The NewVa Fund is a private equity/venture capital fund founded in 2004 by the Virginia Tech Foundation, Carilion Clinic, and Third Security LLC. It was created to make investments in companies that are considering initiating operations in, currently operating in, or willing to relocate all or a significant portion of their business to, the NewVa region of southwestern Virginia. Within its geographic focus, the fund seeks to invest in unique business opportunities presented by entrepreneurs who have a clear plan for their company to achieve a leading position in its target market. The fund does not



limit its investments to any specific industry or development stage, but seeks investment opportunities in companies with a clear focus and significant competitive advantage.

The NewVa region of southwestern Virginia encompasses the Roanoke Valley, the New River Valley, and the Alleghany Highlands. Investments have been made in five regional companies.

REYNOLDS HOMESTEAD

The Reynolds Homestead is an outreach facility of Virginia Tech located in Patrick County, Va. The Homestead features the fully restored Rock Spring Plantation House, which is the birthplace and boyhood home of tobacco manufacturer R.J. Reynolds.

Built in 1843, the two-story brick home has been restored to its 19th century state and includes many of the original family furnishings. The house is a registered state and national landmark and is open for tours. The Reynolds Homestead also has a continuing education center, which hosts a wide variety of programs and classes for all ages and interests. Music, art classes, lectures, discussions, children's activities, fitness programs, and movies are just some of the many events. All are open to the public and many are free. Both the historic home and the continuing education center are operated by Outreach and International Affairs.

Surrounding the Rock Spring Plantation and the continuing education center is the Reynolds Homestead Forest Resources Research



Center (FRRC). The FRRC was created in 1969 to study forest biology, including genetics, physiology, and soils. Specific projects include harvesting to increase forest health and productivity, site preparation, forest fertilization, loblolly pine physiology, and forest herbicide testing.

The Reynolds Homestead was recently expanded when the foundation purchased two adjacent and contiguous parcels of land totaling 60 acres. The

Reynolds Homestead is now comprised of 784.46 total acres. The two parcels were purchased to help serve as a buffer from encroachment and provide additional road frontage. In time, it is expected that the new property will be able to produce saleable timber.


Funding for the purchase was provided by the Richard S. Reynolds Foundation and from timber sale proceeds.

HOTEL ROANOKE — CELEBRATING 125 YEARS OF TRADITION

The Hotel Roanoke celebrated its 125th anniversary in December 2007. During the past year, the hotel completed the last phase of a \$6.5 million renovation that transformed the guest rooms and corridors, blending fresh and elegant new offerings with historic ambiance (www.hotelroanoke.com/rooms/). The renovation involved 180 guest rooms/suites and corridors, including the property's executive level. This year also saw the replacement of dated and aging equipment in the kitchen, the cooling tower, public area lighting system, and a multiyear project to replace questroom windows.

Despite having many rooms out of inventory during the remodeling, the hotel's financial performance goals were exceeded, including record-high gross revenues, average daily rate, and revenues per available room. Total operating revenues for the Hotel Roanoke in fiscal year 2008 were \$19.71 million, compared to \$19.06 million in 2007. The hotel's occupancy rate for 2008 was 73.2 percent, compared to 72.8 percent in 2007. The average daily rate was \$132.29 in fiscal year 2008, compared to \$121.44 in 2007.

The Regency Dining Room once again won the DiRoNA award, which is presented to fewer than 800 restaurants in North America. This prestigious award reflects the quality and service provided by the Regency.

The Hotel Roanoke is well established as a valuable asset for Virginia Tech's outreach mission and enhances the university's public image among the thousands who visit the hotel and conference center each year. Virginia Tech's colleges, alumni groups, and continuing education programs consistently use the facility for events. In fiscal year 2008, the university functions represented 7,908 group room nights, or 21.4 percent of total group room volume. The hotel's group business included 37,020 total room nights, or 41.7 percent of its total business.

SMITH'S LANDING GETTING SET TO OPEN

In 2007, the Virginia Tech Foundation entered into agreement with Bruce Smith Enterprise LLC and Armada Hoffler to redevelop the former Red Lion site.

The Smith Armada Hoffler team is building a \$50 million multi-use complex on the 13-acre site owned by the Virginia Tech Foundation. This dynamic, multi-functioning complex will include a 140-key Hilton Garden Inn, 284 upscale apartment units within five buildings and 5,000 square feet of commercial retail space. The first apartments opened in the summer of 2008 and the hotel is scheduled to open in 2009.

Bruce Smith, a 1985 alumnus of Virginia Tech, is the lead developer on the project. Known as "The Sack Man" of Virginia Tech football, Smith finished his college career in 1984 as the most honored player in Hokie history at the time.

The goal of the Virginia Tech Foundation at Red Lion site is a high-quality development that meets the needs of the university and town communities

while providing income to support Virginia Tech and tax revenue to assist the town and county.

The foundation has signed a 60-year land lease agreement with Smith and Armada Hoffler. The leases are expected to bring more than \$200,000 a year to the foundation, which can also benefit from the financial performance of the development.


THE PETE DYE RIVER COURSE OF VIRGINIA TECH

Building on the world-class design of Pete Dye, the enthusiasm of golfing alumni and friends, its recognition by *Golf Digest* magazine, the support of the Virginia Tech Foundation, and the focused leadership of the professional staff, the past year has seen significant progress at The Pete Dye River Course toward the ultimate goal of being the finest, friendliest golfing venue in the region.

Playing conditions progressed from post-construction to tournament-ready. During December and January, an aggressive program of aerification and top dressing was undertaken for the fairways, greens, and tees. The golf course superintendent is building a mutually beneficial partnership with that the university's turf grass program. Students from the program are employed in positions that enhance their education, while at the same time their knowledge improves the golf course. Faculty utilize the course in various research endeavors ranging from disease control to the evaluation of seed varieties.

This year saw increases in rounds of play (more than 16,000), and membership approaching 150 (40 percent faculty, staff, and students). Growing demand for golfing events by businesses, civic and social organizations, and alumni groups resulted in 60 events with more than 3,000 participants. James Bowen ('08 Finance) was named first assistant professional and began the PGA Apprentice Program.



Promotional and marketing activities accelerated during the year through partnerships with various media and ISP Sports to develop and deliver a marketing plan that assures awareness of The River Course among golfers throughout the region.

The tournament-ready goal was put to the test when the Tarheel Tour held its first Pete Dye Classic in mid-June. The

54-hole event attracted 112 aspiring golfers competing for a purse of almost \$100,000. Duke University graduate and 2005 ACC Individual Champion Ryan Blaum won the tournament and \$16,000 purse. Tournament officials and players were highly complimentary of the course and expressed a desire to return next year.

Construction on the long-awaited \$5.25 million clubhouse began and is expected to be completed in the third quarter of 2009. Made possible by a \$2 million lead gift from the Williams-Berry Charitable Trust, trustees Jane Sheffy and James Long, and Hokie golf supporters, the clubhouse will provide the traditional amenities while offering dramatic vistas of the golf course and the New River from its 4000-square-foot elevated patio. Additionally, the clubhouse is expected to become a popular location for dinners, receptions, small conferences, and other university and community events.

Financial and economic uncertainty, a political system under stress and facing a watershed presidential election, new technologies reshaping media usage and distribution — these and other challenges make the need for civil discourse, intelligent dialog, and substantive and in-depth reporting essential for maintaining a dynamic and successful democratic society.



By being aware of and meeting these needs, WVTF has become a valuable resource and a vital link to understanding and facing the challenges of our future for the thousands of listeners who rely on the station's programming every day.

WVTF is rising to those challenges in a number of ways. For example, a few program changes this past year have given the weekend lineup some new and fresh content, which, judging by early response, seems to be well received. In addition, WVTF's news and talk service, RADIO IQ, added three new productions.

In addition to new programming, alternate digital methods of delivering the station's programming took a giant stride this past year. Listeners can now use PDAs and cell phones to access WVTF and NPR-produced regional news and features. WVTF also began offering podcasts of its information programs in response to the audience's growing need for more control and choice in how they

This fiscal year also saw the station continue its multiyear project to add HD (digital) broadcasts to all of its transmission sites. By September 2008, all seven transmitters throughout the state were able to broadcast in HD. HD radio broadcasts allow WVTF to offer more than one program stream on the same frequency. For example, WVTF from Roanoke on 89.1 FM offers a standard schedule on channel HD1. Plus, on the same frequency, listeners can hear


The Miller Center Forum airs Saturday and Sundays at 7:00 p.m. on RADIO IQ. at 3:00 p.m. on WVTF. RADIO IQ news and information programming on channel HD2, and special contemporary album music on HD3.

Both WVTF and RADIO IQ continue to show strong audience figures as reported by Arbitron Inc. Nationwide, for the fall 2007 rating period, WVTF remained in the list of top 30 public radio stations in the Metro Share and Metro Cume categories.

Although gas prices, the banking and mortgage crisis, and a general slow-growth economy brought a cloud of uncertainty to our revenue forecasts for the year, overall "listener sensitive revenue" for fiscal year 2008 reached an all-time high, surpassing \$2 million. Individual donations once again topped \$1 million, hitting just over \$1.3 million, and underwriting revenue collected over \$700,000, setting a record for corporate donations.

WVTF Revenue FY 08 (estimated)






REVENUES, GAINS, AND OTHER SUPPORT

CONSOLIDATED ENDOWMENT PERFORMANCE | ANNUALIZED





ENDOWMENT HIGHLIGHTS

As of June 30, 2008, the market value of all endowments held by the Virginia Tech Foundation Inc., including pledges to endowments, totaled \$527.6 million. Of the total endowment, \$487.8 million is invested in the foundation's pooled consolidated endowment fund, while \$39.8 million is held separately in real estate partnerships, notes, deeds of trust, and contributions receivable, as well as other corporate securities. Endowment value per FTE student was at \$18,216 for the same time frame.

The June 30 allocation of the foundation's pooled endowment fund consisted of 20.4 percent domestic equity, 19.9 percent foreign equity, 8.8 percent real assets, 27.6 percent marketable alternative assets, 13.0 percent non-marketable alternative assets, 10.1 percent U.S. bonds, and 0.2 percent cash and cash equivalents. The fund achieved a return of -0.7 percent for the year ending June 30, and an annualized return of 10.9 percent over the trailing five-year period.

The overriding principle of the foundation's consolidated endowment program is simple: funds should be managed so that a gift today will fund a donor's objective in perpetuity. For example, if a benefactor wants to endow a scholarship, the money is managed to maintain the real value of the endowment and keep pace with inflation.

Each gift entering the consolidated endowment fund purchases units analogous to shares in a mutual fund, and a payout-per-unit (or dividend) is paid quarterly. In an effort to maintain the endowment's purchasing power, the payout rate is adjusted annually to reflect the change in the Consumer Price Index over the preceding calendar year. Historical investment return data are used to determine upper and lower boundaries for total spending. A three-year average is used to smooth out the unit values when determining if spending falls between the upper and lower boundaries. Without this moving average, funding might dramatically rise in one year,

then fall drastically the next, leaving the beneficiaries of the endowments vulnerable to increased volatility in the capital markets.

Decisions on how to manage the foundation's consolidated endowment pool are made by its investment committee, whose main focus is the asset allocation of the fund. More than 80 percent of a fund's return is determined by its asset allocation versus individual money managers. An endowment consultant is retained to assist the investment committee and foundation staff with asset allocation decisions, the selection and retention of managers, performance monitoring, and related endowment policy issues. To completely diversify its portfolio, management of the fund is allocated among more than 80 management firms, partnerships, and direct equity investments offering a wide variety of asset classes and investment styles.

For the second year in a row, Virginia Tech has broken its own fundraising record. Private giving to the university in fiscal year 2007-2008 reached \$91.1 million. That represents an increase of 8.7 percent over the past year.



Once again, individual donors came through for the university, contributing \$61.4 million, or 67 percent of total giving. It is also worth noting that friends of the university, or those who are not alumni, parents, or employees, accounted for more than 20 percent of total giving, showing once again that Virginia Tech touches the lives of many people — not just those who went to school here.

Three-quarters of our fundraising units saw an increase in dollars raised over last year. In particular, the Virginia-Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine nearly tripled last year's total, raising \$5,452,074 this year. Several other units deserve recognition for their fundraising efforts, including Fine and Performing Arts, which saw a 150 percent increase; the Graduate School, which saw a 183 percent increase; the Honors Program, which had an increase of 574 percent, and the W.E. Skelton 4-H Center at Smith Mountain Lake, with an increase of 467 percent.

Fiscal year 2007-2008 was exciting, not just for the money raised, but also because it was also the first year of the public phase of The Campaign for Virginia Tech: Invent the Future. At the end of the first year of the public phase of the campaign, we had raised \$683,490,574, or 68.35 percent of the \$1 billion goal. Alumni continue to be critical to our fundraising success, accounting for more than 46 percent of total giving to the campaign.

We are already seeing dramatic and tangible evidence of the effect that private philanthropy is having on campus as a number of new facilities are coming online, like Bishop-Favrao Hall and the Institute for Critical Technologies and Advanced Sciences (ICTAS)

I. Bishop-Favrao Hall, which opened this spring, houses the Department of Building Construction and the new Myers-Lawson School of Construction. The facility also provides state-of-the-art laboratory spaces, include testing labs, wet labs, material handling, tool and welding labs, and workshops for assembly of construction systems. ICTAS I is almost ready for occupancy and will provide space for offices, research, and most importantly, a permanent

home for the institute, which supports and promotes cutting-edge research at the intersection of engineering, science and medicine. Support for new facilities like these is important as we continue to strive to create learning and research opportunities for faculty and students alike.

Another facility, the experimental theatre currently under construction on College Avenue, reflects our focus on providing enriched cultural prospects for students, faculty, and members of the community. Soon, with the help of private philanthropy, our campus will be home to a new arts complex, of which the new theatre is but a part. The complex will also include a performance hall and a visual arts gallery that promotes partnerships with arts organizations. A renovated Shultz Hall will also be part of the complex.

Also for the second year in a row, scholarship giving nearly doubled, proving once again that our friends and alumni know the value of a Virginia Tech education. Clearly, a strong scholarship program is an important component of our mission to educate and it is our desire to remove financial barriers to all students who meet the admission requirements for the university. Private philanthropy continues to help us meet that goal.

Our corporate and foundation partners have also stepped up this year, increasing their support for the university. Several of these gifts are noteworthy.

- > Fujitsu Computer Products of America Inc. gave a gift of equipment valued at more than \$800,000 to the College of Engineering's Office of Distance Learning and Computing.
- > **GE FANUC Automation North America** gave \$325,000 in support of the electrical and computer engineering department and the College of Engineering endowed funds.
- > **The Sigrid Rupp Trust** donated \$340,240 to support the Women's Archives in Architecture.
- > The Invitrogen Corporation donated a mass spectrometer to the College of Science and the Virginia Bioinformatics Institute valued at \$215,000.

Private philanthropy continues to make a difference at Virginia Tech — whether that support comes from alumni, friends of the university, or our corporate partners. It is your support that allows us to provide an exceptional education to our students, to support the extraordinary research of our faculty, and to offer our knowledge to the world.





THE UT PROSIM SOCIETY

Lifetime membership in the Ut Prosim Society, Virginia Tech's most distinguished recognition society, is available on an individual or joint basis to alumni and friends whose lifetime giving totals \$100,000 or more. The society has four levels of membership based on lifetime giving totals: Benefactor (beginning at \$100,000), Senior Benefactor (beginning at \$250,000), Distinguished Benefactor (beginning at \$500,000), and President's Circle (\$1 million or more).

In its first year, 127 household memberships were recognized as Ut Prosim Society charter members. That number has grown over the past 21 years to more than 1,000 household memberships, and the society's members have become a major philanthropic force for Virginia Tech.

THE PRESIDENT'S CIRCLE

The President's Circle, the highest level of membership within the Ut Prosim Society, is reserved for a select group of individuals whose exceptional contributions to Virginia Tech total \$1 million or more. The President's Circle charter members (denoted in maroon below) were the first Ut Prosim members to be recognized for reaching this level of qiving in 2002. The President's Circle members have more than doubled over the past six years, growing from 33 household memberships in 2002 to 76 this year.

CALDWELL SOCIETY

In 2002 Virginia Tech created the Caldwell Society, named for William Addison Caldwell, the first student to enroll in Virginia Tech. The Caldwell Society recognizes alumni and friends who have made, either as individuals or couples, lifetime contributions of \$50,000 or more to the university. Caldwell Society members whose giving reaches the \$100,000 or more level advance into the Ut Prosim Society.

In its first year, 58 household memberships were recognized as Caldwell Society charter members. The number of members continues to grow each year, and during the 2007-2008 fiscal year the society grew by more than 20 percent from the previous fiscal year, reaching 392 household memberships, with 38 household memberships advancing from the Caldwell Society to the Ut Prosim Society.


