Accessible Areas and Services - BC Place

We are committed to providing meaningful access and participation for people with a disability and welcome spectators with a disability to enjoy the 2010 Winter Games. Below are the accessible features available on the venue.

INFORMATION
All merchandise kiosks and concessions will feature counter heights that are wheelchair accessible.
The closest accessible transportation drop-off area is located on Nelson St. between Expo and Pacific Blvds. It is accessed traveling northbound on Nelson St.
All spectators with wheelchair-accessible seats should enter through Gate J. To proceed through the security screening area people with mobility impairments or those who need additional assistance will be directed to an accessible lane.
Accessible toilets are available and located on Levels 2, 3 and 4. Unisex/family toilets are located at Sections 203, 230, 408 and 421.
Wheelchair-accessible seating is available and is integrated within Levels 2, 3 and 4 of the seating bowl. Accessible seats are available for purchase through the ticketing process.
Assistive hearing devices will be available for loan at the Information Booths located outside Sections 234 and 446.
Live audio description services will be provided in English and in French for the Paralympic Opening Ceremony for spectators with visual impairments. Receivers will be available for loan at the Information Booths located outside Sections 234 and 446.
A limited number of wheelchairs are available at the Information Booths located outside Sections 234 and 446.
All pathways in and around the venue will be a paved surface cleared of snow. Most pathway grades will not exceed 5% with appropriate signage directing spectators with a disability towards the most accessible route.
Reference copies (in English and French) of the <i>Spectator Guide</i> will be available at the Information Booths in large print and in Braille formats.
Assistance/guide dogs are welcome in the venue. A dog relief area has been identified at the corner of Terry Fox Way and Pacific Blvd.
