OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

What Lazy Days of Summer?: The Thunder was the only NBA team to participate in multiple summer leagues this past off-season. Seven players currently on the Thunder roster saw action in the Orlando Pro Summer League (July 5-10) and the NBA Summer League in Las Vegas (July 10-19). Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook and OKC Rookie James Harden were both named to the 2009 Orlando Pro All-Summer League First-Team. In addition, Thunder forward D.J. White received second-team honors for his performance in Orlando. In four Orlando Summer League contests Westbrook posted averages of 22.3 points (.519 FG%), 3.5 rebounds and 7.8 assists in 32.3 minutes per game. Harden, the No. 3 overall selection in this past summer's NBA draft participated in a total of nine summer league contests and recorded averages of 14.7 points (.506 FG%), 3.3 rebounds and 2.4 assists in 27.9 minutes per game.

Country First: The OKC trio of Kevin Durant, Jeff Green and Russell Westbrook were all invited to participate in the 2009 USA Basketball Men's National Team mini-camp held in Las Vegas this past July. In preparation for the 2010 World Championships and the 2012 Olympic Games in London, USA basketball hosted the three-day event which included an intra-squad Blue vs. White scrimmage on the final day. Thunder Head Athletic Trainer, Joe Sharpe was also invited to participate in the Team USA event.

Summer Oversees: Both Nenad Krstic (Serbia) and Thabo Sefolosha (Switzerland) spent the summer months representing their counties as they competed in the 2009 EuroBasket Championships held in Poland. While Sefolosha and Switzerland participated in the Division B bracket, Krstic helped lead the Serbia team to the Championship Game vs. Spain in the upper Division A bracket. In nine EuroBasket contests, Krstic posted averages of 13.4 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 23.4 minutes per game. Meanwhile, Sefolosha played in four games for the Swiss team and compiled averages of 15.8 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists in 37.3 minutes per contest.

Brooks at the Helm: On Wednesday April 15th, just prior to OKC's final game of the 2008-09 season versus the Los Angeles Clippers, Thunder General Manager, Sam Presti made the announcement that the organization had decided to retain Head Coach, Scott Brooks, thereby waiving the once interim status attached to his title.

Coach Brooks took the Thunder helm on November 22nd of last year after a disappointing 1-12 start to the season under then head coach, P.J. Carlesimo. After taking the reigns from Carlesimo, the Thunder showed marked improvement in a number of statistical categories including, field-goal percentage (5.1%), assists (4.2) and points per game (9.6).

Under Brooks, the Thunder posted a 22-47 (.319%) record, including a 15-17 (.469%) stretch from late December through early March. This preseason will mark Brooks' first as an NBA head coach.

Durant Dazzles: Through his first two NBA seasons, Kevin Durant has already proven that he is one of the elite scorers in the game. Durant, the NBA's 6th leading scorer last season, averaged 25.3 points in just his second season removed from the University of Texas. He became the NBA's 5th second-year player in the last 20 years to average better than 25 points per game.

Sophomore Studs: At the end of last season, second year players Kevin Durant and Jeff Green combined to average 41.8 points per game. The last pair of second year teammates to average a higher total was Allen Iverson and Jerry Stackhouse for the Philadelphia 76ers who more than a decade ago combined to average 44.2 points per game during the 1996-97 season.

Technically Speaking: During the 2008-09 season, the Thunder committed 31 technical fouls (includes individual and defensive technicals) which tied for the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio). In addition, it represents the fewest "T's" committed in the NBA since the 1997-98 season (Golden State; 22). On the year, 11 individual technicals (excludes defensive technicals) were called on Thunder players and coaches. This total was the fewest awarded to any NBA team during the season.

Not "Two" Shabby: After two seasons in the NBA, Kevin Durant boasts a 22.7 scoring average, the fifth highest career average for any second year player in the modern era (dating back to 1989). Only Shaquille O'Neal (26.4), David Robinson (25.0), LeBron James (24.1) and Vince Carter (22.9) posted higher career scoring averages after their first two NBA seasons.

Young Guns: During the 2008-09 season, the Thunder registered a majority of their scoring from either first or second year players. In fact, OKC rookies and second year players combined to score 4,780 of the 7,952 total Thunder points. This total represents 60.1% of the OKC points scored, the highest percent of any team in the NBA during the 2008-09 season. The last team with a higher percentage of points coming from rookies and second year players occurred during the 1997-98 season when the Boston Celtics received 68.7% of their scoring from a young team which included the likes of Antoine Walker, Ron Mercer, and Walter McCarty.

Filling up the Ford: Fans from near and far flocked to Oklahoma City last season to witness Thunder basketball. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC, the Ford Center recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder's average attendance topped the 18,700 mark (11th best in the NBA), accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%.

Race to 3,000... and Beyond: During the Thunder game in Phoenix on February 20th, Kevin Durant etched his name into the NBA record books by becoming the second youngest player (behind only LeBron James) to record 3,000 points in league history. With his 35 points versus the Suns, Durant reached the 3,000-point plateau in only 134 games. Durant will look to surpass the 5,000 point mark during the upcoming 2009-10 NBA season as he enters the year with 3,495 career points scored.

Russell Rules: During his rookie season, Russell Westbrook burst onto the NBA landscape and immediately made his presence known. Westbrook, the T-Mobile Rookie of the month in both December and February was one of just three rookies (O.J. Mayo, Marc Gasol) to rank in the top-10 in points, rebounds and assists. Westbrook went onto recorded 10 double-doubles last season, which was tops among the rookie class. His accomplishments were recognized by the league after the season when Westbrook joined Derrick Rose, O.J. Mayo, Brook Lopez and Michael Beasley in being named to the NBA's All-Rookie First-Team.

More Westbrook: Last season, Russell was one of just 15 players and the lone rookie to average at least 15 points, four rebounds and four assists. On March 2nd versus Dallas, he became the first rookie to record a triple double since Chris Paul accomplished the feat during the 2005-06 season. Lastly, by converting 20 made free-throws February 1st as Sacramento, Westbrook became just the 3rd rookie in NBA history to score 20 FT's in a single game.

Stripe Happy: On January 23rd versus the Los Angeles Clippers, Kevin Durant received plenty of charity from the free throw stripe. On the night, Durant calmly converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set an NBA season-high for most FT's made in a game this year. KD becomes one of only four players over the last 20 years to make 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

New Year's Resolution: Last season, the Thunder held true to one of their New Year's resolutions... free-throw shooting. In the 33 games played during calendar year 2008 the Thunder ranked 26th in the NBA from the free-throw line, shooting 74.5%. In 2009 however, the Thunder displayed material improvement from the charity stripe. In the 49 games played during 2009, the Thunder shot 81.1% from the line, representing a 6.6% improvement. In games played after January 1st the Thunder ranked 5th in the NBA in free-throw shooting percentage.

Lots of Big Nights: In his second NBA season, Kevin Durant filled-up the scoring column with regularity. At the end of the 2008-09 NBA season, Durant recorded 20 or more points 57 times including 30 or more points on 21 occasions. These totals place KD among some elite NBA company.

KD En Fuego: Last year, prior to his injury 2/27 at Dallas, Kevin Durant found himself on a red-hot scoring tear seldom witnessed by a second year NBA player. In the 17 games prior to his injury (1/16 vs. DET through 2/24 vs. LAL), Durant posted a scoring average of 32.3 points per game. During this five-week long span, Durant led the NBA in scoring by a 2.4 point per game margin (LeBron James; 29.9 ppg). To highlight the rarity of such a blistering stretch, it has been 35 years since a second year player last averaged 32+ points across a 17-game span (Bob McAdoo; 34.7 ppg during the 1974 season).

Worth Noting: In Kevin Durant's rookie season, he became the youngest player to record 18 made field goals in a single game. This season, Durant set a career-high with 47 points on February 17th vs. New Orleans. Durant is the youngest player to score 47+ points since LeBron James recorded 56 points during the 2004-05 season.

2008-09 Thunder Quick Facts

- In the last 15 games in which the Thunder held their opponent to fewer than 100 points, OKC boasts a 14-1 record.
- In 19 of the Thunder 23 wins last season, OKC outrebounded their opponent.
- In the 23 Thunder wins, OKC averaged 53.7 rebounds per contest. Had the Thunder maintained such a clip throughout the entire course of the season, they would lead the NBA in rebounding.
- The Thunder concluded the year ranked 6th in the NBA in rebounding, 8th in fast break points and 7th for points in the paint.
- At the outset of the 2008-09 NBA season, the Thunder were the fourth youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 70 days (OKC trailed only Golden State, Portland and Memphis).
- The Thunder finished their season with a 126-85 victory versus the Los Angeles Clippers in the season finale. The 41-point margin of victory is the largest OKC lead at any point during the season.

Sam Presti

Executive Vice President & General Manager

The 2009-10 season marks the third year for Sam Presti as the Executive Vice President and General Manager of the Oklahoma City Thunder. Professional Basketball Club Chairman Clayton Bennett appointed Presti to his current position on June 7, 2007.

During his tenure with the Thunder, Presti has assembled the building blocks for long-term success both on and off the court. Commencing with the 2007 draft, Presti selected Kevin Durant, the University of Texas standout with the team's No. 2 overall pick. Since then, Durant has gone on to win the NBA's Rookie Of The Year award while posting a career scoring average of 22.7 points per game, the fifth highest total for any second year player since 1989.

Through the NBA draft, Presti has continued to add the pieces needed to achieve the organization's singular focus of sustaining success on the floor and in the community. Most notably, Presti selected forward Jeff Green (No. 5 overall) on draft night 2007 through a trade with the Boston Celtics and UCLA guard Russell Westbrook with the team's No. 4 overall selection in 2008.

This past summer, Presti nabbed Arizona State guard James Harden with the No. 3 overall selection while also acquiring the rights to Ohio State center Byron Mullens (No. 24 overall) and Robert Vaden (No. 54 overall) in the 2009 NBA draft.

Since moving to Oklahoma City in July of 2008, Presti has stressed the importance of community involvement for both Thunder players and staff. Under his leadership, the Thunder went on to make the second most community relations appearances in the NBA this past season.

Prior to joining the Thunder, the 32 year old Presti held a variety of roles with the San Antonio Spurs from 2000 to 2007. Most recently, he served as the team's assistant general manager from September of 2005 - June of 2007. Presti led the design and implementation of the Spurs scouting database, a system that is now being used by numerous teams throughout the NBA. From 2003 - 2005, he served as the director of player personnel. Prior to that role, Presti was the assistant director of scouting in 2002 and 2003. He joined the Spurs organization as an intern in the summer of 2000 before being promoted to special assistant in the summer of 2001.

Presti earned his bachelor's degree in 2000 in communications, politics and law from Emerson College in Boston, where he was the first Rhodes Scholar nominee in school history. The Concord, Mass. native served as team captain of the Emerson College basketball team during both his junior and senior seasons. In addition, Presti earned All-Academic honors two times and was also twice selected to the Great Northeast Athletic Conference All-Tournament team. He was honored with the Emerson College Young Alumnus Award in 2005.

An accomplished drummer, Presti has produced three music CDs with all proceeds benefiting the Extra Ordinary Needs Fund at Children's Hospital in Boston.

Rich Cho

Assistant General Manager

Rich Cho enters his 12th season with the organization and his ninth as assistant general manager. Cho is responsible for contract negotiations, salary cap and Collective Bargaining Agreement matters, player contracts and all player personnel issues.

Cho has also served as the team's director of basketball affairs (1997-2000) and vice president of legal (2005-07). As an attorney with experience on both the team and agent sides of professional sports, Cho calls upon his diverse skill set to aide the Thunder management staff. He also helped design and implement one of the NBA's most advanced and comprehensive college and professional player-evaluation systems.

A member of the Washington State Bar, Cho is a graduate of the Pepperdine University School of Law with an emphasis in sports law, contract negotiations and dispute resolution.

Prior to attending law school, Cho earned his engineering degree from Washington State University and worked as an engineer at Boeing in Seattle for five years. He began his work with the team as an intern in May of 1995. He continued in that role until his graduation from law school in May of 1997 when he was hired as a part-time consultant.

Troy Weaver

Assistant General Manager

Troy Weaver begins his second season as the club's assistant general manager after joining the Thunder in May of 2008. Weaver assists General Manager Sam Presti with roster development and day-to-day basketball operations. In addition, he coordinates the team's player personnel matters including NBA Draft preparation, player free agency and summer league roster.

Weaver held the position of director of player personnel for the Utah Jazz in 2007-08. He spent three seasons (2004-07) as head scout for the Jazz before his promotion to director of player personnel.

Prior to joining the Jazz, Weaver was an assistant coach at Syracuse University for four seasons (2000-04). The Orangemen won the 2003 NCAA National Championship led by Weaver recruit Carmelo Anthony. In addition to his experience at Syracuse, Weaver spent time as an assistant coach at New Mexico (1999-2000) and Pittsburgh (1996-99).

Before his collegiate coaching days, Weaver amassed an 85-17 record as an AAU coach in Washington, D.C. He guided DC Assault to the 1996 AAU Tournament of Champions. Weaver graduated with an associate's degree from Prince George's Community College (MD) in 1991, where he also played one season of basketball.

Scott Brooks

Head Coach

NBA Head Coaching Experience: 2nd Season

Scott Brooks enters his first full season as head coach of the Thunder as he becomes the 16th head coach in franchise history. Brooks was named interim head coach 13 games into the 2008-09 season and was later named head coach on April 15, 2009 prior to the team's final game of the season. A day after being awarded his first NBA head coaching position, Brooks led the Thunder to their most lopsided victory of the year in the team's season finale, a 126-85 win versus the Los Angeles Clippers at STAPLES Center.

During the 2008-09 season under Brooks, the Thunder posted a 22-47 (.319%) record, including a 15-17 (.469%) stretch from late December through early March. After taking over as interim head coach in late November, the Thunder improved in a number of statistical categories including, field-goal percentage (5.1%), assists (4.2) and points per game (9.6).

Under Brooks, the Thunder showed marked improvement playing in front of the home-town Oklahoma City fans. In the final 25 home games of the 2008-09 season, the Thunder registered a 13-12 mark at the Ford Center.

Prior to his appointment as interim head coach on November 22, 2008 Brooks joined P.J. Carlisemo and the Thunder coaching staff at the start of the 2007-08 season.

Before joining the Thunder organization, Brooks spent the 2006-07 season working as an assistant coach with the Sacramento Kings. His NBA coaching career began with the Denver Nuggets, where he served as an assistant coach under George Karl from 2003-06. Brooks helped lead the Nuggets to the playoffs in each of his three seasons with the club. During his brief tenure with the Nuggets, Denver amassed a 136-110 (.560%) regular season record.

Brooks enjoyed an 11-year (1988-99) playing career in the NBA, appearing in 680 regular season games with Philadelphia, Minnesota, Houston, Dallas, New York, Cleveland and the Los Angeles Clippers. Brooks' teams advanced to the postseason six of his 11 NBA seasons, and in 1994, he was a member of the NBA Champion Houston Rockets. Brooks holds career averages of 4.9 points and 2.4 assists per game. He excelled from three-point range, shooting 37.2 percent (287-771) from behind the arc. He also played one year with the Albany Patroons (1988) in the Continental Basketball Association, and was named to the CBA's All-Rookie Team.

In 2000, Brooks was a player/assistant coach with the Los Angeles Stars of the ABA. The following season, he served as the head coach of the Southern California Surf of the ABA, guiding the club to a 23-14 record.

A native of Lathrop, California, Brooks began his collegiate career at Texas Christian University, where he played one season. He then transferred to San Joaquin Delta College for his sophomore season, before spending his final two years at UC Irvine, where he averaged 23.8 points per game as a senior.

Ron Adams

Assistant Coach

Ron Adams enters his first full season as a Thunder assistant coach after joining the team on December 31, 2008. Adams brings 17 years of NBA coaching and player personnel experience to Oklahoma City. Before joining the Thunder staff, he spent the previous six seasons with the Chicago Bulls as an assistant coach (2003-2008) and special assignments scout (2008). While in Chicago, Adams helped guide the Bulls to three consecutive playoff appearances (2004-07).

Adams spent five seasons as an assistant coach with the Milwaukee Bucks (1998-2003). Prior to Milwaukee, Ron spent time as an assistant coach with the San Antonio Spurs (1992-94) and the Philadelphia 76ers (1994-96). He was also a player personnel scout for the Portland Trail Blazers (1996-98).

Adams began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Fresno Pacific University in 1969 and was promoted to head coach in 1972. He also had assistant coaching stints at U.S. International, University of California Santa Barbara, Fresno State University and University of Nevada-Las Vegas. He was head coach at Fresno State during a second tour of duty from 1986-90.

He has coached professional basketball in Belgium, consulted and coached with the Canadian National basketball program, two Japanese professional basketball clubs and the Belgian Basketball Federation.

Adams graduated with a degree in history and political science from Fresno Pacific University in 1969 and received a master's degree in physical education from Fresno State in 1974

Maurice Cheeks

Assistant Coach

Cheeks enters his first campaign with Oklahoma City after spending three-plus seasons (2005-08) as head coach of the Philadelphia 76ers. With Philadelphia, Cheeks guided the 76ers to a 122-147 (.459) mark and a playoff berth during the 2007-08 season.

Cheeks brings 30 years of NBA experience to the Thunder bench including seven-plus seasons as a head coach with Portland and Philadelphia. As an NBA head coach, Cheeks compiled a 284-286 (.498) record.

Prior to joining the Sixers, Cheeks spent three-plus seasons as head coach of the Portland Trail Blazers (2001-05). During his time in Portland, he posted a 162-139 (.538) mark, accounting for the fourth-highest coaching win total in Blazers history. He helped the Blazers reach the NBA Playoffs twice, and his 2002-03 squad tied for second in the Pacific Division with a 50-32 record.

Before joining Portland in 2001, Cheeks spent seven seasons as an assistant coach for the Sixers, working under head coaches John Lucas (1994-96), Johnny Davis (1996-97), and Larry Brown (1997-2001). In 2000-01 under Brown, Cheeks helped guide the 76ers to a record of 56-26 (.683) and a spot in the NBA Finals.

Cheeks played 15 seasons in the NBA, the first 11 with Philadelphia, before stints with San Antonio, New York, Atlanta and New Jersey. He was selected to the NBA's All-Defensive Team five times (First Team: 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986; Second Team: 1987) and played in four All-Star games (1983, 1986, 1987, 1988). He was a member of 76ers 1983 World Championship team. In addition, Cheeks is one of seven former Sixers players to have his number retired by the club (No. 10).

As an NBA player, Cheeks compiled career averages of 11.1 ppg, 6.7 apg and 2.1 spg in 1,101 games over 15 seasons while shooting .523 from the field and .793 from the free throw line.

Rex Kalamian

Assistant Coach

Rex Kalamian joins the Thunder coaching staff after spending the previous two seasons with the Sacramento Kings (2007-09). Kalamian brings 15 years of NBA experience to Oklahoma City.

Prior to joining Sacramento, Kalamian spent the previous two seasons as an assistant coach with the Minnesota Timberwolves. Before his time in Minnesota, Kalamian spent a one-year stint (2004-05) with the Denver Nuggets working as assistant coach/player development. Kalamian also worked as a West Coast scout for the Philadelphia 76ers during the 2003-04 season prior to assuming his coaching duties in Denver.

The bulk of Kalamian's NBA experience was gained working for the Los Angeles Clippers for nine years in various capacities, starting as an assistant to the scouting department in 1992 before being promoted to assistant coach in 1995. In addition to his many responsibilities on the bench, Kalamian prepared scouting reports on upcoming opponents for coaches and players, as well as developing players' skills.

Prior to joining the Clippers, Kalamian was an assistant coach for his former team at East Los Angeles College for two seasons where he had played the previous two seasons. He led the South Coast Conference in three-point field goal percentage during the 1988-89 season and was team captain during his second year.

Kalamian graduated from Cal Poly Pomona in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in business management.

Mark Bryant

Assistant Coach

Mark Bryant enters his third season as a Thunder assistant coach in 2009-10. He served as an assistant coach/player development with the Orlando Magic from 2005-07. Additionally, he spent the 2004-05 season with the Dallas Mavericks as a member of its player development staff.

Bryant spent 15 seasons as a player in the NBA with 10 different teams from 1988-2003. Originally selected by Portland in the first round (21st pick overall) of the 1988 NBA Draft, Bryant helped the Blazers reach the NBA Finals in 1990 and 1992. He appeared in 797 regular season games during his NBA career with Portland, Houston, Phoenix, Chicago, Cleveland, Dallas, San Antonio, Philadelphia, Denver and Boston, averaging 5.4 ppg and 3.8 rpg in 16.9 mpg. Bryant also appeared in 79 career playoff games, averaging 3.5 ppg and 2.5 rpg in 12.2 mpg.

Bryant was a First Team All-Big East selection as a senior at Seton Hall in 1987-88, averaging 20.5 ppg and 9.1 rpg for the Pirates. The 6-9 forward led the school to its first-ever berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Brian Keefe

Assistant Coach

Brian Keefe enters his third season with the Thunder and his first season as assistant coach. During his previous two seasons with Oklahoma City, Keefe served as a player development coach.

From 2005-07, Keefe worked with the San Antonio Spurs as an assistant video coordinator. Prior to joining the Spurs, Keefe was an assistant coach at NCAA Division II Bryant University in Smithfield, R.I. for four seasons (2001-05), highlighted by a trip to the Division II Championship in 2005. He also served one season as a graduate assistant at the University of South Florida (2000-01).

Keefe began his collegiate playing career at UC Irvine, where he was appointed team captain as a sophomore and named All-Big West Second Team in 1995-96 after leading the team in scoring. After transferring to UNLV for his final two seasons, Keefe helped the Running Rebels win the Western Athletic Conference Tournament and earn an NCAA berth. He was named to the WAC All-Tournament Team after making a tournament-record 13 three-pointers. During his senior season in 1998-99, Keefe was named team captain and helped lead UNLV to an NIT appearance.
