Atlanta evened things up with 103-89 triumph on 1/22 thanks to Jamal Crawford's 24 points and Al Horford's 23 ... Wallace had 25 to lead the Bobcats ... Atlanta visits Charlotte on 4/6 to close-out the season series ... The Hawks have won five straight home games against the Bobcats.

Zaza Pachulia was a Bobcat for one day, as they selected him in the 2004 expansion draft on 6/22/04, then traded him to Milwaukee the next day ... **Marvin Williams**, along with Bobcats' **Raymond Felton**, led UNC to the collegiate national championship in 2004-05 ... **Mike Woodson** (Philadelphia, Detroit) and **Bob Bender** (Philadelphia) both served as assistants under **Larry Brown** ... **Boris Diaw** (drafted 21st overall by Atlanta in 2003), appeared in 142 games for the Hawks from 2003-05 ... **Nazr Mohammed** wore an Atlanta uniform from 2000-04, playing in 198 games ... **Stephen Jackson** (2003-04) also spent time with the Hawks ... **Herb Brown** is a former Hawks asst coach ... **Mike Woodson** and **Larry Drew** were teammates with Charlotte asst. coaches **LaSalle Thompson** and **Phil Ford** with the Kansas City/Sacramento Kings.

JOE SMITH REACHES MILESTONE: Joe Smith played in his 1000th career game on Wednesday in New Jersey ... The 15th-year veteran became the 11th active player to do so, and the 93rd player in league history to reach the milestone.

CONSISTENCY: The Hawks have gone 34 straight games without suffering a three-game losing streak, the second-longest current stretch in the league ... Denver has gone 36 games without a three-game skid.

SCHEDULE CHANGE: The NBA announced that the March 21 game vs. San Antonio will now be televised on ESPN (in addition to Fox Sports South HD) and will begin at 8 p.m.

BIG ON THE BOARDS: The Hawks grabbed 63 rebounds on 3/1 at Chicago, their most since recording 64 on 3/19/00 vs. Dallas ... Atlanta also had a season-high 22 offensive boards in the contest, and Josh Smith corralled a season-high 18 caroms.

CLOSERS: Despite losing a couple late leads in February, the Hawks have been pretty good this season when holding late advantages ... Atlanta is 38-4 when leading with five minutes or less ... The Hawks are 41-5 when leading with three minutes or less, with three losses coming in OT (@Chicago, @Cleveland and v/Dallas).

MR. VERSATILITY: Josh Smith is currently the only player in the league this season averaging at least 15.0 ppg, 8.0 rpg and 4.0 apg ... At 6-foot-9, he is the tallest player in the top 10 in steals in the NBA, and the shortest in the top 10 in blocks ... "J-Smoove" is putting up 15.8 ppg, 8.7 rpg and 4.3 apg, to go along with 2.1 bpg and 1.7 spg.

INJURIES: At the All-Star break, the Hawks led the league in least player games missed due to injury, at 14 total ... The next-closest team is Minnesota with 32 games missed ... Golden State (294) had missed the most, followed by Portland at 250.

JC FOR ... FOUR!: Jamal Crawford notched the 26th four-point play of his career on 3/8 @NY (and seventh of the season), extending his NBA career record ... Earlier this year, he surpassed Reggie Miller (24) ... Crawford's four-point plays this season -- on 12/26 @Ind, 1/8 v/Bos, 1/20 v/Sac, 1/27 @SA, 2/3 v/LAC, 3/6 @Mia and 3/8 @NY.

DON'T BRING THAT STUFF IN HERE: On 2/2 at OKC, Josh Smith (at age 24 years/59 days) became the youngest player in NBA history to reach the 1,000 career block plateau, topping Benoit Benjamin (25 years/128 days) ... He is 3rd in the NBA in bpg (2.09) and 3rd in total blocks (140) ... Earlier this season, he became the youngest player in NBA history to reach 900 rejections on 10/30 v/Wash.

THE DIFFERENCE: A leading candidate for the Sixth Man Award, Jamal Crawford ("The Difference") is 2nd on the team in ppg at 17.9 ppg (30th in the NBA), in 30.7 mpg ... He leads the league in scoring among players who haven't started a game this season ... Additionally, he is 23rd in the league in FT% (.846) and 7th in 3FGM (133).

MODERN DAY ROBIN HOOD: Josh Smith reached the 500 career steals mark on 1/22 vs. Charlotte, in the process moving past Spud Webb into 10th place on the Hawks career leaders list ... He now has 556, and sits in 9th place ... He also ranks 8th in the NBA in spg this season (1.72) ... He swiped a career-high 7 vs. Dallas (2/26).

OFFENSIVELY SPEAKING: Atlanta is 7th in the league in scoring (102.4 ppg), 10th in FG% (.467) and 16th in FT% (after finishing 28th last year) at .761, while committing only 11.9 turnovers per game (best in the NBA).

DELIVERING IN THE PAINT: The Hawks are the league's 6th-best team in the paint, delivering 45.0 points per game ... Atlanta is also 4th in fast break points at 16.6.

SHOWING IMPROVEMENT: The Hawks last season became the first team since Dallas (from 1999-2003) to surpass its previous season's record for four straight years ... Dallas won 19, 40, 53, 57, 60 games from 99-00 through 02-03, while Atlanta has won 13, 26, 30, 37 and 47 since 04-05 ... The 47 were Atlanta's most since 50 in 1997-98.

HIGHEST SCORING HOG: With his 12,093 career points, Joe Johnson has surpassed Sidney Moncrief (11,931) as the all-time NBA scoring leader among Arkansas Razorbacks ... He passed Moncrief with his 27-point night vs. Dallas (2/26).

Josh Smith has stepped up to cover six months of living expenses for the family of slain McEachern High School student athlete Rajaan Bennett ... Smith, who had the opportunity to meet Bennett last summer, also grew up in Powder Springs and attended McEachern ... Bennett was a star football player, owned a 3.8 grade point average, and had recently signed a letter of intent to play football for Vanderbilt University ... Bennett is survived by his mother, brother and sister.

Joe Smith hosted a Reading Timeout for students at Parkside Elementary School on 3/18. Smith read an excerpt from the book How to Train Your Dragon, before signing autographs and posing for pictures. The book has also been made into an animated motion picture which will open on March 26. The students will all receive free passes to the movie as well as promotional items. The event is part of the Read to Achieve program presented by Philips.

Jason Collins visited My Sister's House at Atlanta Union Mission 3/18. Collins' visit coincided with the facility's "Absolutely Incredible Kids Day" party for children. The Hawks center played games with approximately 100 children before signing autographs and posing for pictures. My Sister's House is a long-term intensive residential program for women and children who are seeking recovery from chemical dependency, domestic violence and other life-controlling problems.

HEAD COACH MIKE WOODSON

Overall NBA Coaching Record: 196-281 (sixth year)

2009-10 Record: 43-24

Entering his sixth year, Hawks head coach Mike Woodson has improved the team's record in each of the last four seasons, the only coach in the NBA to do so. Yet, after taking his team from a rocky 13-win campaign in his first year to 47 victories last season, Woodson wants more, and he is determined to keep his team amongst the NBA's elite.

With all of his starters back from a squad that reached the second round of the 2009 Playoffs and key off-season acquisitions to bolster the bench, Woodson has his most experienced team ever to challenge for the NBA Championship.

Last season, he guided the Hawks to their first winning season in a decade (47-35), as Atlanta reached the playoffs for the second straight year, reaching the second round of the postseason for the first time since 1996-97. Not since the Dallas Mavericks' teams from 1999-2003 had any NBA team improved its win total four consecutive years, but Atlanta's climb under Woodson duplicated that impressive mark.

Now the challenge for Woodson is to maintain and build on that level of success in a competitive Eastern Conference, where several teams made significant moves to remain strong, and continue to guide his young and maturing squad into a consistent threat each night.

Prior to becoming the Hawks head coach, Woodson reached the pinnacle of success during his days as an assistant with the Detroit Pistons. In 2004-05, the Pistons won the franchise's third NBA championship, defeating the heavily-favored Los Angeles Lakers, four games to one.

His days in Motown were the foundation for many of the coaching principles he attempts to instill within his players. Learning from Hall of Fame coach Larry Brown, Woodson has continued to stress "doing things the right way" – working hard, putting the team first and dedicating themselves to becoming the best players they can be, as they work together to build a winning organization, on-and-off the court.

The 10th head coach in Hawks' history, Woodson has a record of 196-281 (.411). For the fourth year in a row, he coached Atlanta to a better record than the previous season, improving by 10 wins in 2008-09. Atlanta built on that 13-victory inaugural season, to seasons of 26, 30, and 37, before recording 47 a year ago.

The 51-year-old Woodson has over two decades of NBA experience as a player and coach, and served three seasons as an assistant under Brown in both Philadelphia (2001-03) and Detroit. He also worked as an assistant coach with the Cleveland Cavaliers (1999-01) and the Milwaukee Bucks (1996-99).

One of the chief architects behind the Pistons' suffocating defensive effort during the 2003-04 season, Detroit held the opposition to 84.3 points per game that year, which equaled the league's best total defensively (along with San Antonio). In addition, the Pistons' point differential of +5.84 was the second-best in the NBA and they limited opponents to 41.4 field goal shooting, the league's third-best performance. During their 23 postseason games, Detroit intensified their efforts defensively, holding teams to 80.7 ppg and 39.2 FG shooting, and in the five-game Finals series against Los Angeles, the Pistons kept the Lakers more than 16 points under their regular season average and hounded them into shooting 41 percent from the floor.

The 11-year veteran and 6-5 guard played for seven teams in the NBA after he was selected in the first round of the 1980 Draft by the New York Knicks with the 12th overall pick. In 786 career games, Woodson averaged 14.0 points (10.981 career points), 2.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 25.5 minutes, enjoying his best season in 1982-83 when he played for the then-Kansas City Kings and posted 18.2 points per game.

In addition to the Knicks and Kings (both in Kansas City and Sacramento), Woodson also played with New Jersey, the Los Angeles Clippers, Houston and Cleveland, before retiring from the game in 1991. His teams advanced to the playoffs five times, where he averaged 12.2 ppg, 2.6 apg and 2.3 rpg.

Drafted out of Indiana University, Woodson, in his junior season, helped lead the Hoosiers to the 1979 National Invitational Tournament (NIT) championship with a 53-52 victory over conference rival Purdue and was named to the All-Tourney team.

During the summer of that year, he played for Bob Knight and captained the United States team that participated in the Pan American (Am) Games, joining teammates Isiah Thomas and Ray Tolbert in winning the gold medal.

A two-time All-American (1979 and 1980) and four-year letterman Woodson suffered a herniated disk in his back after five games (and a No. 1 ranking) into his senior campaign and had to undergo surgery. Upon losing Woodson, Indiana went 7-5 in the Big Ten, but once he returned, IU finished the conference season at 6-0 and captured the Big Ten title. Despite the limited action, Woodson took home the league's 1980 MVP award.

The fifth-leading scorer in IU history with 2,061 points, Woodson averaged 19.8 points and 5.6 rebounds in 104 games with the Hoosiers. He graduated with a degree in physical education.

Woodson, born March 24, 1958 in Indianapolis, IN, attended Broad Ripple High in Indianapolis. The high school, whose alumni include CBS' David Letterman and former Vice President Dan Quayle's wife Marilyn, retired his number in 2006. He and his wife Terri have two daughters, Alexis and Mariah, both very talented volleyball players. Alexis is a member of the Georgia Tech volleyball program, while Mariah is starting her freshman season at the University of Florida.
