Accessible Areas and Services - BC Place

We are committed to providing meaningful access and participation for people with a disability and welcome spectators with a disability to enjoy the 2010 Winter Games. Below are the accessible features available on the venue.

| Accessible Drop Off Location | The closest accessible transportation drop-off area is located on Nelson St. between Expo and Pacific Blvds. It is accessed traveling northbound on Nelson St. |
| Accessible Entry/Exit | All spectators with wheelchair-accessible seats should enter through Gate J. To proceed through the security screening area people with mobility impairments or those who need additional assistance will be directed to an accessible lane. |
| Accessible Shuttle | For the Opening Ceremony on March 12, a special accessible shuttle will be in place that will pick up on Davie Street, opposite Yaletown SkyTrain Station (Canada Line), and drop off on Pacific Boulevard near BC Place. The shuttle runs from 4:00 pm to 10:30 pm. |
| Accessible Transit Access | Take Canada Line SkyTrain to Yaletown Station, then the accessible shuttle (as above). If arriving on the Expo/Millenium Line, disembark at Stadium Station and take the elevator up to the top level. From there, take the Costco elevator down to Expo Boulevard and proceed to the spectator entry. |
| Accessible Amenities | All merchandise kiosks and concessions will feature counter heights that are wheelchair accessible. |
| Accessible Toilets | Accessible toilets are available and located on Levels 2, 3 and 4. Unisex/family toilets are located at Sections 203, 230, 408 and 421. |
| Accessible Seating | Wheelchair-accessible seating is available and is integrated within Levels 2, 3 and 4 of the seating bowl. Accessible seats are available for purchase through the ticketing process. |
| Assistive Hearing Devices | Assistive hearing devices will be available for loan at the Information Booths located outside Sections 234 and 446. |
| Audio Description Services | Live audio description services will be provided in English and in French for the Paralympic Opening Ceremony for spectators with visual impairments. Receivers will be available for loan at the Information Booths located outside Sections 234 and 446. |
| Wheelchair Loan | A limited number of wheelchairs are available at the Information Booths located outside Sections 234 and 446. |

| Wheelchair Access | All pathways in and around the venue will be a paved surface cleared of snow. Most pathway grades will not exceed 5% with appropriate signage directing spectators with a disability towards the most accessible route. |
