WNYW FOX 5 WWOR MY 9 TRAINING PROGRAMS

WNYW and WWOR maintain an on-going training program, which has been very successful in identifying qualified individuals. Minorities and women are encouraged to apply for positions in the program. Trainees work for a period of six months in a hands-on environment with professional staff. They are required to attend various seminars structured as an introduction to the various departments within the station. The object of the program is to develop individuals who have no or little experience in the broadcasting industry for entry-level positions.

Fox Stations Sales, an in-house sales organization, maintains a program to train new Account Executives. This program consists of both coursework and hands-on training. At the end of the program, individuals are assigned to Stations and sales offices throughout the United States.

TRANSITIONAL EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

WNYW participates in the on-going transitional employment program with Fountain House, an organization that works within the mental health community, in their transition back into the workplace. Individuals work for six to nine months within the station. The objective of the program is to break the negative stereotypes and debilitating stigma that surround the label of mental illness; in addition to helping those individuals regain their self-esteem, self-confidence and a sense of purpose in preparing them to pursue an outside paying job.

WNYW and WWOR provided internships to <u>35</u> students for college credit during the semesters from Spring 2009 through Fall 2009. The students interned in News, Sports, Good Day New York, Sales and Traffic. The interns included students from Cornell University, Rutgers University, Manhattan College, New Jersey City University, Fordham University, St. John's University, New York University, Pace University, William Patterson University, Montclair State University, Franklin Pierce University, Coldwell College, University of Florida; Fairleigh Dickerson College, Delaware State University, Boston College, Villanova University, University of Massachusetts, University, Colombia University.

News Corporation and WNYW/WWOR are national sponsor of *Groundhog Job Shadow Day*. WNYW & WWOR participated in the program by hosting students to shadow broadcasting professionals in major departments of the stations. News packages of the students were aired on FOX-5's Good Day New York program.

In addition to sending out job/internship opportunities, the Stations also participate regularly in career and job fairs at colleges and universities. Examples of such events during the period above include:

- ➤ One Hundred Blackmen The Stations and News Corporation are involved in an educational partnership with 2 local inner city high schools. As a result of WNYW & WWOR's participation in the program, students have developed hands-on training and skills for future employment opportunities.
- CUNY Career Fair Graduate Center The Stations manned a booth and interviewed students interested in job and intern opportunities from all NYC CUNY Schools
- ➤ New York University Fox Television Stations set up a fellowship program with NYU, providing scholarships and funding for programs to allow students to enhance opportunities with film and education
- ▶ Pencil Fellow Program Fox Television Stations is involved in an educational partnership with Pencil and the Department of Educations' Virtual Enterprises program. This program provides successful careerminded New York City public high school junior and seniors with dynamic experimental learning experiences through full-time paid summer internships.
