


Election day is Saturday 8 November 2008.

IF YOU CAN'T GET TO A POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY BECAUSE:

- of illness, infirmity, pregnancy, or recent childbirth; or
- you have a religious objection to attending a polling place on election day; or
- attending a polling place in your electorate would cause hardship or serious inconvenience

YOU MAY APPLY FOR A SPECIAL DECLARATION VOTE OR VOTE IN ADVANCE.



VOTING IN ADVANCE

If you're not going to be in your electorate or can't get to a polling place on election day, you can vote in advance from 22 October.

You will have to complete a form when you vote giving your reason for voting in advance.

From 16 October information about where, when and how to vote in advance will be available at:

This information will also be in your EasyVote information pack, which you should receive about a week before election day.

MAKING A SPECIAL VOTE

BEFORE ELECTION DAY you can choose to either:

- vote at an advance voting place; or
- complete and post the attached special declaration vote application form to your Returning Officer; or
- ask someone else to complete the application in this leaflet and take it to your Returning Officer or an advance voting place. They will then bring you back your voting papers; or
- apply by fax, e-mail or telephone to your Returning Officer.

ON ELECTION DAY you can ask another person to apply to collect your voting papers for you from your Returning Officer or a polling place.

- Ask someone else to complete the application form in this leaflet and take it to your Returning Officer or to a polling place. They will then bring back your voting papers to you.
- Your vote must be received by the Returning Officer or a polling place no later than 7pm on election day, Saturday 8 November.
