# Mansfield Cemetery & St. Peter's Catholic Cemetery Book Completed

After five years of work this major project is coming to a conclusion. In retrospect, in some ways it doesn't seem that long ago that we began planning for and working on this book. In other ways it seems as if it has taken forever. It certainly has been a labor of love.

When we started, it appeared to be a simple task. We'd just copy the records from microfilm. However, we found that not all the records were on microfilm. That meant hours at the cemetery office copying records. When all the records were copied, many more hours were spent transferring the information into the computer and later proofing the entries. Then we found another stumbling block. While walking the cemetery, I discovered that not everyone buried in the cemetery had their name recorded in the cemetery records. So, this required that the old section be walked and every tombstone checked.

When having enough time for the project became a problem for me, Missy Derrenberger, recently retired, graciously took over the project. Without her help we would still be in the working phase of this project. She spent all her spare time walking each section and becoming familiar with many families of people buried in the cemetery. I am sure she could have a job there if she wanted to come out of retirement.

Many volunteers worked on this project, but Missy Derrenberger, Nancy Hidinger, Sunda Peters, Maxine Smith, Jean Gerboc, Connie Smith, and Shirley Thompson were responsible for completing the majority of the work.

We hope you are as enthused about this work as we are. Quotes are in the mail. You will be notified when we have a publish date and the cost of the book.

# **Membership Information**

If you are interested in the pursuit of genealogical research you are welcome to join our society. Memberships are on a calendar year basis, January to December. Persons joining during the year receive back issues of the newsletter for the current year.

The Richland County Genealogical Society was organized in 1959 as The Ohio Genealogical Society. Members had been meeting for some five years. In 1964 it was reorganized as the Richland County Genealogical Society, the first chapter of The Ohio Genealogical Society. Meetings are normally held on the fourth Thursday of the month at 7:30 p.m. There is no July meeting. The August meeting is usually a picnic on a date to be set. The November and December meetings are combined on an evening early in December.

Any member of the Richland County Genealogical Society who is a direct descendant of an individual who lived before 1840 in the area, which was at that time encompassed by Richland County, may become a member of the First Families of Richland County upon the acceptance of an application with proof of such descent and the payment of a fee as set by the Board of Trustees. As a First Family member you will receive a certificate and a Richland County First Family pin.

The Pastfinder is published four times a year (February, May, August, and November). Members and non-members are encouraged to submit five generation charts and other family information, specifying their permission for the information to be published in the Pastfinder. Queries in the Pastfinder are free to both members and non-members.

The Richland County Genealogical Society has a volunteer research committee to answer mail inquiries related to Richland County. We will provide, as a benefit of membership, up to one hour of research free, once during the calendar year, using material in the OGS library. Patrons must pay for copies and postage. For all other requests there will be a fee of \$5.00. We will not, as a rule, do research at the Richland County Public Library, courthouse, or health department. The building is still standing and has been under the name of several banking companies over the years. No longer a bank., the current owner is Engwiller Properties, Inc. They are instrumental in the restoration of buildings in downtown Mansfield.

# St. Peter's German Church Marriage Records

St. Peter's German Church, sits at the top a large hill on German-Church Rd., Washington Tp, Richland Co. Founded in 1845 the first building was completed about 1847 and was made from logs. A second church was built after 1887. The third church built still stands, and is known as The Hilltop Community Church. This building has been enlarged, changing the original design. A cemetery sits beside the church. Records remain in the family of one of the past minister's, a copy of which is held by our Society and OGS. The early records are written in German. The following marriage records were located after our Society published the 1813-1861 Marriage Book. A comparison shows that not all of the marriages were recorded at the Mansfield Courthouse. All of the following marriages are from church records.

# 1836 Chattel Taxes continued from our last issue

This Chattel Tax list is for Auburn, Bloomfield, Congress, Perry, Plymouth, Sandusky, Sharon, Springfield, Troy and Vernon Twps. A portion of Troy, A through O is missing. This book was thrown out when the old courthouse was torn down. It was purchased from an antique dealer by a dedicated genealogist and donated to The Ohio Genealogical Society, where it is stored in the Manuscript Room. The Chattel tax was divided into several portions with the state, township, county, and roads each receiving a part. Each horse was taxed 40¢ and cattle 8¢. Many of these townships were divided in 1845 and 1848, with portions going to other counties.

Many of these birth records have been lost, but we were fortunate to find a list for Richland County. We had previously understood that the records were copied at the Ohio Historical Society, in Columbus, Ohio, but they do not have any knowledge of them. At the present we are still looking for the source of these records.

#### Former Comrades United After Forty-One Years

A most touching scene was enacted at the flowing well at Camp Sychar Friday afternoon when two old soldiers stood face to face for the first time in forty-one years. Each knew the other and their meeting will long be remembered in the minds of those who stood about the well and saw these two old soldiers clasp hands after being separated for nearly half a century.

The soldiers were **John Weeks** of Delaware and **Daniel Yarger** of Richland county. Both of these old comrades belonged to the 32<sup>nd</sup> O.V.I. and marched with Sherman from Atlanta to the sea. Mr. Weeks was a member of Company I and Mr. Yarger was a member of Company A.

During their military career Mr. Yarger and Mr. Weeks were most intimate friends and when they parted at the close of the war each drifted in a different direction and each supposed the other was dead.

The circumstances connected with the meeting at the well on Friday afternoon were most remarkable. The two men had gone to the well for a drink. One stood at one side of the well and the other opposite him. They were bent forward, loosening the tin cups, which had become entangled in the ropes and as providence played a little part in the occurrence, both men entangled their cups at the same time, and they raised their heads at the same time to look one another in the face.

Mr. Weeks was the first to speak and with a choked voice and with tears in his eyes he clasped the hand of his old comrade. Mr. Yarger recognized his old companion and the two old soldiers stood for a few moments in perfect silence, being unable to speak. Finally the silence was broken and the two chatted together of olden times and spent a portion of the afternoon in conversation. Mansfield Newspaper - Aug 16, 1906

Mrs. Martha Golliday, who had been visiting H.G. Palmer and family on Wood street the past three weeks, died there Monday. She was bout 65 years of age, her home was north of the city. The funeral will be held at 11 a.m. Wednesday. Interment at Franklin Cemetery, eight miles north of the city.

The infant child of W. Hampson and wife of 191 East Second street died Tuesday morning.

Mrs. Isaac Light died this morning at her home in Franklin township of consumption. The buial will be at Ganges.

Mrs. Barbara Marks died Tuesday and the funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon at the First Lutheran Church.

The infant daughter of Charles Remy and wife of Cemetery street died last [Wednesday] night.

Coroner Baughman was notified about 6 o'clock this morning [Tuesday] .....that a child had been found dead at the home of David Zehner, 189 East Third street, a little daughter about a week old. Mrs. Zehner stated that she awoke about midnight and the child seemed to be as well as usual at that time. She awoke again at daylight and the child was dead. Coroner Baughman made a minute examination and decided that its death was caused by convulsions. The coroner will not hold a post mortum as he is sufficiently satisfied of the cause of death.

Ray, the only child of Mr. and Mrs. Williard Bly, died last Thursday, after intense suffering of blood poison, aged about one and one-half years. The funeral services were conducted at the church Saturday at 10 a.m., Rev. Singley of Shelby officiating. Interment at Shiloh.

September 6, 1898

The funeral of Irene, infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C.F. Remy, will be held at the residence, 65 Chestnut street Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock. All friends are invited.

John E. Shea, for many years with Johnson & Bortz furniture dealers, this city died of malignant cancer at the Soldiers home in Sandusky on Thursday and will be buried from J.A. Niman's undertaking rooms Saturday morning at 10 a.m.

Mrs. Iona Orewiler died the morning at her home on East Fourth. She as 41 years old. Funeral services will be held at the residence at 8 o'clock tonight and the remains will be taken to Sulphur Springs for burial.

A message received here announces the death of Mrs. George W. Forney, Jr., which occurred Friday at her home in Cleveland. The remains will arrive here Saturday evening. Mrs. Forney formerly lived in this city and had many friends who will be pained to learn of her death. Mrs. Forney was the eldest daughter of Louis Gerrisch, whose home is on Sturges avenue. She had been ill sometime. Her husband is the son of George W. Forney of this city. The funeral of Mrs. George Forney Jr. will be held Monday afternoon at 4 p.m., from the home of Louis Gerisch.

Peter Lalone of Company C., Eighth Ohio, died at his home in Ashland Sunday morning. He arrived from Camp Wikoff

just a week ago ill with fever, having just left Bellevue hospital.

September 9, 1898

A daughter of William Hays formerly of this city and now living in Butler, committed suicide in Pittsburg. The remains were brought home for interment, arriving in Butler this morning [Tuesday] The young woman was about 22 years old.

James Oswalt, an aged and respected citizen of Weller township died at his home Wednesday afternoon. He was stricken with paralysis. He was the father of seven sons and one daughter. Six of them survive him. He was buried in the Franklin cemetery Saturday.

Mrs. Sherman Koontz after a brief illness, died at her home east of Olivesburg Monday morning. She leaves five small children and a husband to mourn the loss of a kind and benevolent wife and mother. Funeral Wednesday. Interment at the Imhoff cemetery.

Mrs. Isaac Light an esteemed lady of this vicinity, died last Monday of consumption. She bore her affliction patiently until the last. A husband and several children survive to mourn her departure. The funeral was conducted at the church Wednesday by Rev. Loose. Interment at Ganges.

Bert Forester of Wise street receiving a telegram yesterday announcing the death of his father, Frederick Forester at Columbus. Mr. Forester was engaged in the confectionery business in this city a few years ago. Mr. Forester was 70 years of age. Mr. and Mrs. Bert Forester left last night for Columbus to attend the funeral.

September 13, 1898

Mrs. Catherine Mitchell, widow of the late Tobias Mitchell, died Sept. 8, of dropsy at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Esther Pressler, 430 Bowman. Three daughters and two sons survive. Mrs.O.S. Myers and Mrs. Esther E. Pressler of Mansfield, Mrs. Mary E. White of Marion, James Mitchell of Mansfield and Samuel H. Mitchell of Barberton. Short funeral services will be held at the house, Saturday morning at 9:30 o'clock. The remains will be taken to Little Washington for interment.

Abraham Lash died Monday morning at his home, corner of First and Adams streets. His age was 73 years, 6 months

and 28 days. He was stricken with paralysis March 9, 1898, which was the cause of his death. Mr. Lash was born at Bellville, the youngest of nine children of Philip Lash. In 1850, he married Mary C. Baughman, who died in 1892. they were the parents of four boys, Nathan P. and Clark L. surviving them. Mr. Lash was a carpenter until he engaged in manufacture of boxes several years ago. Funeral Wednesday at 8:30 a.m. conducted by Rev. L.G. Batman. Interment at Bellville.

Michael Overdeer died this morning at the county infirmary where he has been an inmate during the past two years.

The deceased will be taken to Shelby tomorrow for interment.

at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon

**Durbin Spitler**, about 22 years of age and was a member of Company M for about three years. He was a private in the Sixteenth O.N.G., at Fostoria and when he left that city and came to Mansfield, he procured a discharge from that regiment and enlisted in Company M. He had not been ill a day until the regiment reached Camp Wikoff and his death can almost be attributed to the privation and suffering on board the Mohawk. He was ill four days in camp before he came home. His complaint seemed to be a combination of typhoid fever, dysentery, camp fever and the like. He had been a resident of Mansfield for several years, having been employed by his uncle, A.F. Spitler, in the cold storage warehouse on East Johns street. His home is at Tiffin, where his parents reside. His father came to this city several days ago when the gravity of his son's condition was made known....he was at his beside when death came at 3:40 Sunday afternoon. Brief funeral services were held at the residence at 10 o'clock Tuesday. The remains were then taken to Tiffin for interment.

Al W. Hines died at his home on Sturges avenue, at 1 o'clock Sunday morning from the effect of the shots fire by an unknown assassin last November. Al Hines was about 40 years of age and leaves a wife and two children. The funeral

services of J. Albert Hines were held Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock from the family residence on Ritter street.

A post mortem examination of the body of **Al Hines** was held at 9 o'clock Monday morning. The physicans were able to find but one bullet. It will be remembered Hines was shot twice, both bullets penetrating his body. The attending physician probed for the balls but was unable to locate either. An X-ray examination was also a failure. The post mortem revealed one of the bullets, which was located just under the breastbone at the junction of the breastbone and first rib. It is the opinion of the physicians the other ball penetrated the spinal column, although it could not be located.

#### September 16, 1898

Private Harry Hoyer of Company M died at noon Wednesday at the Emergency hospital of malarial fever. His illness dates only from the time the company left Camp Wikoff for home. In Cuba he was able to be around and was of great assistance in caring for the sick members of the company. He was engaged to be married to Miss Eva Huss, of this city, and it is stated the ceremony was to have been performed in a short time. The funeral arrangements have not yet been made. The young man's father is living with his second wife, having separated from his first wife, who is the young soldier's mother. His mother lives at Nashville,O, and it is likely the remains will be shipped there for interment. He was a nephew of A.J. Bortz, of the firm of Johnston & Bortz.

Delbert Dewitte Rebman, a promising young man of only 20 years died at the home of his parents Sidon Rebman and wife Monday morning at 9 o'clock. The young man had been a sufferer of consumption for a year and a half. The funeral

was held at 10 o'clock Wednesday morning. He was a member of the M.E. church at Olivesburg.

The death angel again unfolded his winds in this township Saturday and removed from the home of **O.P. Secrist** and wife their daughter **Dulsie**, after a brief illness of spinal trouble. The deceased was about 18 years of age and beloved by all who knew her. The funeral was held at Shenandoah Sunday afternoon and was largely attended. Rev. Cliffe officiated at the services.

James Moore, died Sept 8, 1898, and was laid to rest in Marlow cemetery, near Alta. The deceased was aged 43 years, 11 months, 28 days. He united with the Congregational church at Greenwich in his youth. He was born in Belmont county, Ohio and leaves a wife, mother and a brother to mourn his early demise. The funeral was conducted by the Rev. Gray of Ontario.

The funeral of Corporal **Durbin Spitler**, of Company M, Eighth Ohio took place this afternoon at the residence of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A.J. Spitler, 104 Main street. The deceased was about 27 and has resided in Mansfield for the past five years. Durbin was born in Bloomville and often visited in this city. He leaves a father, mother, sister, Mrs. J.B. Fiege and a brother, Edson, of San Francisco. Although typhoid fever was the disease with which he was afflicted, the immediate cause of his death was congestion of the lungs. Interment was made at Greenlawn.

Samuel Johnston, was probably born 1 Oct 1784 in NJ, the son of William Johnston and Sarah Douglas He is recorded on both the 1790 and 1800 Census' of Washington Co., PA. He moved to Richland County, OH sometime prior to 1830. His wife was Elizabeth Huntsman. Two of their children were: (1) Mary Johnston, born 5 May 1801 in Washington County, PA, died 15 Aug 1895, Arroyo Grande, San Luis Obispo, CA, and was married to James Huntsman on 19 Nov 1822 in Richland Co., OH; and (2) Sarah Johnston, b. 1815 in PA, d. 26 Oct 1879, and was married to Ira Ames on 10 Aug 1839.

There may have been more than one Samuel **Johnston** living in Richland County. 
