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Since its inception in December 2007, the University of Pittsburgh Press Digital Editions site has been visited by thousands of users, many from outside the United States. Sales of the UPPDE titles still in print and requests for print copies of out-of-print titles suggest sufficient interest among scholars and students in having these titles available again as printed books.

For the past decade, the University of Pittsburgh Library System has been building digital collections on the Web under its D-Scribe Digital Publishing Program, making available a wide array of historical documents, images, and texts that can be browsed by collection and are fully searchable. The addition of the University of Pittsburgh Press Digital Editions collection is one of an expanding number of digital collaborations between the University Library System and the University Press.
