500 Pitt Press Titles Available Again Online and In Print

PITTSBURGH—The University of Pittsburgh Press, in collaboration with the University of Pittsburgh Library System and the Chicago Digital Distribution Center (CDDC), is making nearly 500 out-of-print Press titles available again for scholars and students around the world.

Representing the full range of scholarly series and subject areas published by the Press, these titles are now part of the University of Pittsburgh Press Digital Editions collection, fully searchable and freely accessible to anyone with an internet connection through the University of Pittsburgh Library System's D-Scribe Digital Publishing Program. Over the next year, they will also be made available for purchase in reasonably priced paperback editions through the CDDC. Readers and researchers may read and search the full texts online, and those who wish to have a print copy may purchase it through retail outlets or directly from the Press.

The University of Pittsburgh Press Digital Editions (UPPDE) may be viewed through the Press Web site, www.upress.pitt.edu, click Digital Editions. Print editions of these titles, as they become available, may be purchased through the shopping cart icon on each book page of the Press Web site or at www.bibliovault.org.

Since its inception in December 2007, the University of Pittsburgh Press Digital Editions site has been visited by thousands of users, many from outside the United States. Sales of the UPPDE titles still in print and requests for print copies of out-of-print titles suggest sufficient interest among scholars and students in having these titles available again as printed books.

For the past decade, the University of Pittsburgh Library System has been building digital collections on the Web under its D-Scribe Digital Publishing Program, making available a wide array of historical documents, images, and texts that can be browsed by collection and are fully searchable. The addition of the University of Pittsburgh Press Digital Editions collection is one of an expanding number of digital collaborations between the University Library System and the University Press. The D-Scribe collections are accessible at www.library.pitt.edu/dscribe/.

The Chicago Digital Distribution Center was founded in 2001 with assistance from the A.W. Mellon Foundation as part of the University of Chicago Press Distribution Center. As digital printing and electronic content delivery have become ever more central to the business of publishing, CDDC offers client presses the services necessary to keep books available in a cost-effective, customer-friendly way.
