Unemployment – May 2009

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This briefing provides the latest unemployment data for Scottish Parliament constituency areas. Official unemployment rates from the Labour Force Survey are not available by Parliamentary constituency and so Claimant Count data is used in this analysis. The Claimant Count records the number of people claiming Jobseekers Allowance (JSA) and National Insurance Credits at Jobcentre Plus local offices.

A summary of the latest trends is shown below:

- Official unemployment was 6.6% (176,000 people) in Scotland, compared to 7.2% in the UK (2,261,000 people) for the period Feb-Apr 09.
- The Claimant Count rate in Scotland was 3.9% in May 2009, the same as the previous two months but 1.7 percentage points higher on the previous year.
- Between April and May the Claimant Count rate fell in 21 constituencies and remained static in 29 constituencies, suggesting more stable economic conditions compared with earlier this year. Seasonality may also be a contributing factor with unemployment typically lower in summer months.
- Over the month, the Claimant Count rate rose in 23 constituencies. It rose the most (0.2 percentage points) in East Kilbride, Glasgow Baillieston, Glasgow Rutherglen and Glasgow Maryhill.
- Over the month, the Claimant Count rate fell the most (0.4 percentage points) in the Western Isles – for the second consecutive month.







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MAP 2 - CHANGE IN UNEMPLOYMENT RATES ON PREVIOUS MONTH BY CONSTITUENCY
