This includes respondents who voted in both the previous two general elections who indicate they are “almost certain” or “probably” will vote in 2010 and those who have registered since the 2008 election due to ineligibility who are “almost certain,” all of whom must respond 5 or higher on a 0-10 enthusiasm scale.

² An oversample of 400 Latino cases was conducted by Latino Decisions, a joint effort between Pacific Market Research and professors Dr. Gary Segura from Stanford University and Dr. Matt Barreto from the University of Washington. This document reports results of 367 Latino respondents.
