Mr. Toameh speaks out against the lack of free speech and press within the PA controlled areas and its effect on the foreign press' coverage on Israel, as well as the biased opinions in foreign press coverage. <u>David A. Harris</u> has been the Executive Director of AJC since 1990. He is one of the foremost American advocates for Israel's political and diplomatic standing. He was also centrally involved in the Soviet Jewry movement and in the rescue of the Ethiopian Jewish community in the early 1980s. He has been invited to speak at some of the world's most prestigious forums and has been honored several times by many governments. Mr. Harris is the author of seven books, hundreds of articles, op-eds, letters, and reviews in leading newspapers and magazines. He has a regular spot on the CBS Radio Network and a blog on international issues at the Jerusalem Post.

Kenneth Stern is AJC's specialist on antisemitism and extremism. An attorney and award-winning author, Stern is a nationally-recognized expert on hate and hate groups and has been instrumental in developing a new academic discipline, Hate Studies, to analyze the evolution of hate and ways to counter its spread. Stern was an invited presenter at the White House conference on hate crimes, has testified before Congress, has argued before the United States Supreme Court, and is frequently interviewed by the media.

Jewish National Fund (JNF):

Raanan Gissin – Dr. Gissin is the Senior Advisor to Prime Minister Ariel Sharon. In recent years he has become one of Israel's leading spokesmen for the foreign press and the international community on security and strategic issues and the peace process. His distinguished career with the Israel Defense Forces began in 1979 with his position as a Strategic Analyst in the planning branch. At that time, he was involved in the planning and implementation of the Sinai withdrawal. During most of the 1980s, which included the war in Lebanon and the "Intifada" in the territories he served as IDF spokesman. Also in 1991, he served as special advisor to the Israeli Delegation at the Madrid Peace Conference and the subsequent negotiations with Arab and Palestinian delegations in Washington D.C. After retiring from active duty in 1993, Dr. Gissin initiated and organized the Pension 200 Conference in Israel with senior Israeli economic leaders and top fund executives and investors from the United States. In 1996, he was appointed spokesperson of the newly created Ministry of National Infrastructures, headed by Ariel Sharon.

Jacob Shrybman grew up in Young Judea, the Zionist Youth Movement of Hadassah. After spending his gap year on Young Judea's year course program Jacob began college at the University of Michigan. Upset with the image of Israel portrayed on his campus Jacob got involved in pro-Israel activism by serving as the political chair for one of America's largest pro-Israel student groups. Jacob, a Middle Eastern Studies major, spent a semester studying in Cairo, Egypt. Following his dream, after graduating with a bachelor's degree in Middle Eastern North African Studies and Hebrew Jewish Cultural Studies from the University of Michigan, Jacob made aliyah. Now Jacob is advocating for Israel internationally through the voice of Sderot. Jacob's work has been published on various internet news sources and by scholars such as Daniel Pipes and Jonathan Schanzer. As the Advocacy Director of the Sderot Media Center, Jacob has participated in a Pre-Election Debate at this year's annual Jerusalem Conference where he was interviewed on the Israeli news channel Arutz Sheva.

B'tselem, an Israel Human Rights Organization, endeavors to document and educate the Israeli public and policymakers about human rights violations in the Occupied Territories, combat the phenomenon of denial prevalent among the Israeli public, and help create a human rights culture in Israel. B'tselem recently opened a Washington office and is excited to bring their message to American campuses. The exact topic to be discussed depends on the time that they have to speak, the 'hot' topic of the day, the expected audience, etc., but some possibilities include: Media as an Activist Tool, National Security vs. Human Rights, Human Rights of the Palestinians (general overview), Accountability, Restrictions on Movement, Settlements, Administrative Punishment, the Separation Barrier and Torture.

Morton Klein is the National President of the ZOA, and was recently named by *The Forward* as one of the top five Jewish leaders in the US. He has testified before the US Congress and the Israeli Knesset, and more than 300 of his articles and letters have been published in major publications. Topics include: Israel and the Arabs: Is Peace Possible?; The Arab War Against Israel: What's Next?; Jerusalem: Whose City Is It?; Lessons of the Holocaust Applied to Today's Mideast.

Zion Uness was born in 1977 in Ethiopia, and immigrated to Israel at the age of 7. He served in the infantry of the IDF and subsequently received a degree in occupational therapy from the University of Haifa. Since that time he has worked to improve Ethiopian-Israeli education and community life, and has spoken widely at Jewish community centers, film festivals and universities about Ethiopian Jewry. Topics include: Operation Moses; My Journey; The Story of Ethiopian Immigrants to Israel.
