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

2009 park winners showcase the Best of the Best

Cedar Point, Schlitterbahn both make an even dozen years with an award

Cedar Point and Schlitterbahn have made it an even dozen. Since the inception of the Golden Ticket Awards in 1998, these two parks have stayed at the tops of their mountainous peaks showing no mercy to the up-and-coming parks below. Their grasp on Best Park and Best Waterpark seems inescapably

Rising in the category of Best Park is Knoebels Amusement Resort to the No. 2 spot. This off-thebeaten-path gem has charmed all who visit during the summer season, as well as our experienced vot-

Disneyland and all its magic places third, and Germany's magnificently themed Europa Park ties with Universal's Islands of Adventure in fourth place to create a top five. Along with the other noteworthy parks in our list of top 10, millions of guests each year have been delighted by their experiences at these great parks.



Taking the second place position in Best Waterpark again is Holiday World's **Splashin' Safari**. Already poised with a huge investment for 2010, this park continues to grow in huge proportions.

Rounding out the top five includes the delightfully themed Blizzard Beach at the Walt Disney World complex; Wisconsin Dells' Noah's Ark, one of the largest waterparks in the world; and the recently opened Aquatica in Orlando, a newcomer to our

in a row by Golden Ticket host Legoland California. The diverse rides, activities, and unique family interactions have continued to impress our voters.

Second place once again is nabbed by Idlewild, the backwoods treasure trove tucked away in Ligonier, Penn. Here young ones continue to delight to the notably unique Mr. Rogers Neighorhood trol-

Completing the category of Best Children's Park is Dutch Wonderland, also in Pennsylvania; Fårup Sommerland in Saltum, Denmark; and the beloved Kiddieland outside Chicago, sadly closing after the 2009 season. Its absence will be a major loss for the city.

A waterfront setting often makes for a fantastic atmosphere. Earning the Golden Ticket for Best Seaside Park once again this year is Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk. Its Giant Dipper, the oldest coaster on our charts, has delighted riders for 85 years and the park has been a staple of Northern California entertainment for more than a century.



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
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

Rounding out this category are seaside settings on all other edges of the country, and the world! Pleasure Beach Blackpool on the U.K.'s west coast, has the largest assortment of rides in the United Kingdom. It also boasts more than one hundred years of entertaining guests, dating all the way back to 1896. Morey's Piers on the East Coast is a wellknown family favorite for those near the Jersey shore. Kemah Boardwalk, located south of Houston, closes out the category and triumphantly overcame numerous obstacles in rebuilding following the devestation of Hurricane

Best Marine Life Park was overwhelmingly voted to be SeaWorld Orlando. Its sister park in Texas, SeaWorld San Antonio places second. Rare in guest experience is the ingenious Discovery Cove in Orlando, tying for third with SeaWorld San **Diego**. Finishing out the category is Six Flags Discovery Kingdom.

Ike last year.

Schlitterbahn Galveston Island, also making an amazing recovery following Hurricane Ike, was voted as Best Indoor Waterpark. Year round, visitors can enjoy more than 12 attractions in the park's convertible environment.

"Schlitterbahn Galveston Island was not just renovated after Hurricane Ike, but re-energized," says General Manager Ron Sutuala. "The hurricane afforded our park the opportunity to improve our property and motivated us to come back better than ever."

The enormous Kalahari Resorts in Sandusky, Ohio and Wisconsin Dells take the second and third place spots on our chart this year. World Waterpark in the massive West Edmonton Mall in Alberta Canada and Splash **Landings** at Alton Towers in England finish out the top five.

The 1880s theme park sees its first win of a Golden Ticket, as **Silver Dollar City** snags Friendliest Park Staff. Boosted by a convention of amusement park enthusiasts, Silver Dollar City was finally given the exposure to showcase their outstanding guest service and friendly atmosphere, in addition to their world class theming and attractions. "We love what we do, and we believe in one another," shares Thomas.

Very close behind was Holiday World with their renowned commitment to friendly service. Dollywood also made a strong showing, making for a true competition within the top three.

Rounding out the top five is **Knoebels** in fourth and **Beech Bend** in fifth.

The quest for the award of Best Food also involved some of the same principal players from the former category. Knoebels Amusement Resort held onto the prize, as it has for many years. Silver Dollar City rushed into a strong second place with their down home cookin', and Epcot placed third. Dollywood and Busch Gardens Williamsburg complete the five finalists.

As so many parks have such a diverse range of guests, many visitors are occupied admiring the beautiful landscaping at many parks. Our perennial winner, Busch Gardens Williamsburg, continues to hold on to Best Landscaping.

Pike adds, "Their input really helped create a very unique coaster for GCII."

Frank Wilburn, general manager of Worlds of Fun agrees. "Immediately following my first ride on Prowler, I knew — wow — we have something very special." The success of this new wooden coaster is also reflected from the guests, says Wilburn. "Guests continually approach me with a handshake to express their pleasure with the ride and to pass on what they feel it adds to the park." He adds they are most impressed with it at night when it pounces through the woods with only moonlight to illuminate the journey.

Coming in a close second place for Best New Attraction in an Amusement Park is Kings Island's Diamondback. The monstrous new steel coaster



by B&M just might overtake the popularity of the park's legendary Beast. Coming in at 230 feet, Diamondback is the tallest coaster ever built at the

Other finalists in this category are B&M's Manta at SeaWorld Orlando that combines a sleek flying roller coaster brilliantly with gorgeous below-ground aquariums. The ride's noted spectator moment is the "wing dip" where the coaster cars appear to slice through the surface of the water.

Six Flags Mountain's new Terminator Salvation: The Ride, also built by GCII, places fourth and a tie for fifth between Six Flags Over Georgia's re-do of Monster Plantation into Monster Mansion by Gary Goddard Entertainment and Holiday World's new recordsetting Pilgrims Plunge from Intamin complete our final-

On the wet side, Best New Waterpark Ride overwhelmingly went to Schlitterbahn. Never content to just do

something off the shelf, Schlitterbahn spectacularly transformed two underutilized attractions into the fiendishly clever Congo River Expedition. Now guests are lining up in droves to journey down a river of mystery enshrouded in fog, animated figures and jungle creatures and a terrifying drop into a

dark mine shaft. It is the most creative thing to hit the waterpark industry in ages.

New Jersey enthusiast Robert Derman visited Schlitterbahn in New Braunfels calling the ride innovative. "You could go all over a park to ride a lazy river, dark ride, flume, and rapids ride," says Derman, "or you could go

to Schlitterbahn and ride the Congo River Expedition!"

Six Flags St. Louis scores second place with its new Wahoo Racer, a multi-lane racing slide, and Alabama Adventure unleashed **UpSurge!**, a slide that twists and turns and drops riders into a halfpipe. This new attraction comes in third.

Rounding out the five finalists are Maximum Velocity, an uphill dueling waterslide at Wet 'n' Wild Phoenix and Dr. Von Dark's Tunnel of Terror at Splish Splash in Long Island.

Already several new attractions for 2010 have been announced which should have our panel of experts scrambling to experience the latest and greatest in both waterparks and amusement parks next year.






Ride category winners hold onto awards until the Golden Tickets come to a complete stop

At least for one more year, perennial favorites reign supreme in our ride catego-

Best Water Ride (amusement park) stays with Universal's Islands Adventure. The drenching Dudley Do-Right's Ripsaw Falls combines the excitement of a log flume along with thrilling theming and whimsical storytelling.

Other finalists in this category are Valhalla at Pleasure Beach Blackpool, which maintains its second place foothold, and Splash Mountain at Magic Kingdom in Florida hangs onto third.

New on the charts for this category is Mountain Slidewinder at Dollywood, a hugely popular (and wet!) homemade water toboggan down the hillside. Popeye and Bluto's Bilge-Rat Barges, also at IOA, completes the top five.

For Best Waterpark Ride, MasterBlaster at **Schlitterbahn** has remained dominant for close to a decade, winning the award for eleven out of the 12 years Amusement Today has bestowed Golden Tickets.

Zoombabwe at Splashin' Safari places second, and Deluge at Six Flags Kentucky Kingdom closes out the top

Other final ists are Dragon'sRevenge, also at Schlitterbahn, and Summit Plummet, the skithemed plunge at Walt Disney World's **Blizzard Beach**.

On the dryer side, but going indoors, Best Dark Ride continues to go to Islands of Adventure's Amazing Adventures of Spider-Man. IOA has seemed to have a lock on this category for some time, but next year, the strongest competition might come from themselves.

Other finalists Twilight Zone Tower of Terror at Disney's Hollywood Studios, Haunted Mansion at Knoebels, Indiana Jones and the Temple of the Forbidden Eye at Disneyland, and new on the chart this year, Journey to the Center of the Earth at Tokyo DisneySea.



Keeping inside, Best Indoor Coaster once again goes to Revenge of the Mummy at Universal Studios Orlando. This indoor coaster took this award for the first time last year and continues scaring riders day after day.

The other finalists are Rock 'n' Roller Coaster at Disney's Hollywood Studios, Space Mountain at Disneyland in

California, Mindbender in Canada at Galaxyland within the West Edmonton Mall, and Space Mountain at Walt Disney World's Magic Kingdom.

The Best Funhouse/Walk-Through Attraction category introduced in 2008 maintains its same winner, but once again in a very close race. Frankenstein's Castle at Indiana Beach narrowly beats out Noah's Ark at Kennywood.

The remainder of the category is dominated by Europe where they know how to do such things quite well (and

haven't let the lawyers scare these attractions away from the parks, which has sadly happened in the U.S.). Hotel Gasten, a frightening and elaborate mansion haunted by live (or are they?) characters at **Liseberg** is the highest rated European contender. Lustiga Huset (a hilarious funhouse) and Spok Huset (a haunted walk-through) both reside at Gröna Lund and wrap up the category.

Attracting children to begin enjoying a park at a young age is certainly a logical philosophy. Many parents find a respite during the day by landing in a children's section of the park. As the sole winner for this category ever since it has been introduced, Kings Island once again takes the Golden Ticket for Best Kids' Area.

Following KI's strong

lead is Universal's Islands of Adventure in second place and its delightful Seuss Landing. Rising up two notches this year is Nickelodeon Universe in Bloomington, Minnesota, now placing third.

This category is completed with a tie. **Efteling**, with its huge fairy tale area offering much more than just rides, ties with Knott's Berry Farm and its very popular Camp Snoopy.

Finally, Best Carousel is once again recognized as the Grand Carousel at Knoebels Amusement Resort. Park fans know the nostalgic thrill of being able to catch the brass ring while riding. At Knoebels, such an experience is highlighted by an authentic band

Reaching for the ring is also available at Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk, one of very few places that remain in the United States where this is possible. This carousel comes in second.

Closing out the category is Six Flags Over Georgia and its century old Riverside Carousel in third place, Islands of Adventure with its custom-designed Caro-Seuss-el in fourth place, and the double decker Columbia Carousel at Six Flags Great America in fifth.







Dollywood strikes gold with a ticket win for shows

Dollywood and Six Flags Fiesta Texas have continued to wrestle for top honors in the category of Best Shows over the past years. 2009 proved to be a real nail-biter once again as the outcome came down to the final day of ballot tabulation. Both parks offer a superb show product, and Dollywood couldn't be more thrilled to take the prize this year.

"Dollywood and especially Dolly herself continually encourage us to make our shows the best they can be," says Paul Couch, director of entertainment. "Pleasing our

audience is the ultimate goal. This Golden Ticket is a wonderful indication we are doing just that."

Six Flags Fiesta Texas, having claimed the Golden Ticket for the past decade comes in at a close second this year. Silver Dollar City rises into third place, and a tie for fourth is shared between Disney's Hollywood Studios and SeaWorld Orlando.

Since introducing the category in 2005, both Universal Orlando and Knott's Berry Farm have been engaged in a tug-of-war, taking the award for best Halloween Event from each other back and forth. However, Universal hangs



onto the prize for a second year in a row with a deathly grip this year. Spooky.

Following these two leaders are Knoebels scaring up third place and **Kennywood** in fourth.

Christmas seems to be a growing festival season as more and more parks around the globe tap into the goodwill and merriment of the December yuletide. **Dollywood** once again stays on top this year with its sister park Silver Dollar City placing second. Both of these parks have been noted in the media for the tremendous light displays that truly define breathtaking.

Walt Disney World's Magic Kingdom jingles into third place on the charts with its sister park Disneyland also placing right behind. Completing the top five is the long running Christmas event at Hersheypark.

Ending the day at a park with one final "Wow!" is a popular trend. Outdoor Night Show Productions can help keep the guests in the park into the late hours. Epcot has taken top honors in this category for several years and remains perched in the No. 1

Disneyland's Fantasmic still enthralls visitors and places in second. Six Flags Fiesta Texas has dazzled park visitors with The Lone Star Spectacular since the park opened in 1992. The laser/ pyrotechnic/multi-media extravaganza lands in third. Finishing the top five are Disney's Hollywood Studios and Magic Kingdom.

With Disney's California Adventure putting the finishing touches on the next big thing, all this Disney representation might find a new challenger next year from within.

Texas' Wonderland Park traces roots back to 1951, expands in 2009

Founded 1951 as Kiddieland by Paul and Alethea Roads, this West Texas amusement park would grow from three kiddie rides and a ticket



booth, made out of the crates used to ship the rides in, to a full blown amusement park that Amarillo residents are proud to have.

Overseeing the duties of the park now are daughter Paula, husband Paul Borchardt and their daughter Rebecca Parker.

Wonderland Park has always been a family park. It's run by a caring family and it caters to families. With an annual attendance of more than 200,000 guests, there are no long lines here, just simple thrills, food and fun, all at an affordable price.

While the park has grown to include everything from a miniature train ride, a classic dark ride and even the high tech thrills of a double looping roller coaster, it wasn't until this year that the park saw its first multi-ride expansion in a new area.

Three rides, a Chance Yo-Yo, a Vekoma family coaster and a Moser drop tower, were all purchased used. The Wonderland $\hat{\text{team}}$ then totally refurbished the rides in house over a three year period. The result is the new West End, a big hit for guests and for the park, proving good things do come to those with dedication, drive and patience.

The park's marketing campaign plays on the WOW factor, also known locally as the World of Wonderland. Now Wonderland Park has something else to be wowed over, as AT's selection for 2009 Park of the Year.

Amusement Today honors Jack Krantz in Legends Series

"Nothing great was ever achieved without enthusiasm."

That is a quote that is inscribed on a plaque behind the desk of Jack Krantz, the late founder of Adventureland Park in Des Moines, Iowa.

For our amusement industry those words ring home. The people of this industry, like Jack was until his death in Jan. 2006, are full of enthusiasm equal only to the rides and thrills found in the parks.

Krantz, seeing the need for quality family amusement park Des in

Jack

Moines, started construction in 1973 on a piece of former airport property that once saw a 1924 landing by Charles Lindbergh.

By August 1974 a portion of Adventureland opened to the public with its main street and a handful of rides. Its



opening was delayed only by a small tornado which passed through the park that July.

Adventureland's first full season arrived in 1975 and thanks to the addition of a skyride from the World's Fair in Spokane, Washington and numerous other rides, the park was off and running.

Running so Adventureland was able to add its first big ride in 1978, a wooden roller coaster. One year later it moved rides from the aging Riverview Amusement Park, also in Des Moines.

Under Jack's guidance, the park continued to grow into Îowa's largest tourist attraction complete with a hotel and campground and more than \$60 million in reinvestment into the 180-acre resort.

Those who knew Jack,

knew his love for the amusement industry. He listened, he learned and then he passed on his success and knowledge to others.

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















overdrive!" Noting the new effects, Piper adds, "Bizarro at night brings it on full force."

Melissa Pinkerton, public relations manager for Six Flags New England, adds "The new trains are more comfortable and allow for a smoother, quieter ride which lets you enjoy the on-board audio that is tracked precisely to each drop and turn."

Cedar Point's 310-foot Millennium Force scores once again in the second place spot. Since both it and Superman debuted in 2000 in the top ten, the two rides have battled for the top spot since 2001. This makes the fifth year in a row that New England's coaster has been declared champ. However, the gap between was much slimmer this year. Both coasters were built by Intamin.

The top five is rounded out by a trio by B&M. **Nitro** at Six Flags Great Adventure holds on to third place. Sister park Six Flags Over Georgia enters the top five with Goliath continuing to gain momentum making for three Six Flags parks in the top five. Apollo's **Chariot** completes the B&M trio of hyper coasters. This one debuted at Busch Gardens Williamsburg in 1999.

B&M has seen a strong fan base this year in addition to its coasters in the top five. Kings Island's new Diamondback made an impressive debut in the top ten at No. 7. Last vear's **Behemoth** at Canada's Wonderland leapt up the charts from No. 29 in 2008 to the No. 12 spot this year by more than doubling its points. B&M boasts 20 of the 50 coasters listed on our charts, $including \, SeaWorld \, \, Orlando's \, \,$ dazzling new Manta at No.

Of note, one coaster will be saying goodbye after this year. By the time this issue goes to print, Busch Gardens Williamsburg will have dispatched the last train on Big Bad Wolf, celebrating its

25th anniversary this year. With this huge loss, not just to coaster fans, but also loyal Busch Gardens guests, the United States will only claim three remaining Arrow suspended coasters. If ever there was a product just waiting to see a re-emergence, this is it. Hopefully some coaster manufacturer will update this truly exciting ride experience. Big Bad Wolf ended its lifelong career at No. 24.

Another interesting twist to the chart this year is that for the first time in Golden Ticket history, the steel top ten list does not contain a single coaster that goes upside down. Montu at Busch Gardens Tampa Bay is the highest ranked looper, this year placing at No. 11.

Another big climber this year is Silver Dollar City's Powder Keg, enjoying some quality exposure from ACE's Coaster Con XXXII this past June. Powder Keg was unleashed by S&S Power in 2005 and climbs from No. 49 last year to No. 21 this year.

Steel coasters



six countries comprise the chart in 2009. Katun from Mirabilandia (Italy) debuts on our list (No. 50); Holiday Park's Expedition GeForce, our highest rated international coaster (No. 6) joins Europa Park's Euro-Mir (No. 43) in representing Germany; Great Britain is showcased with Nemesis at Alton Towers (No. 20) and The Big One at Pleasure Beach Blackpool (No. 45); Walibi World in The Netherlands boasts Goliath at No. 40; and Canada has three top-rated rides: Behemoth, Goliath at La Ronde (No. 25), and Mindbender at Galaxyland at West Edmonton Mall (No. 48).

Kings Dominion has already announced a new 300-foot contender for 2010, in addition to Carowinds and Kennywood unleashing new steel coasters as well. Next year looks to be a forceful battle to shake up the steel charts, and potentially the top 10 once again.

Wooden it be fun!

Holiday World stays on top while the top five shuffles

Out of all the categories featured in the Golden Ticket Awards, Best Wooden Coaster has had more winners than any other category. Holiday World's Raven held the title the longest for four years (2000 - 2003). Holiday World's amazing woodie, The Voyage, takes the prize for the third year in a row. Its strong fanbase could help the coaster easily tie its sibling's record in 2010. The nonstop drops, high banked curves, airtime, and tunnels have left riders (and voters) breathless since The Gravity Group designed this thriller in 2006.

The rest of the top five has seen a bit of a juggling act in comparison to last year's chart. Boulder Dash at Lake Compounce has seen a surge in popularity since a significant refurbish job by Great Coasters International, Inc. took place last season. Roller coaster historian Matt Crowther commented in 2008, "Can the re-do of BoulderDash count as Best New Attraction?" This woodie leaps solidly into second place. BoulderDash claimed the No. 1 spot in

Completing the Win-Place-Show positions is El Toro, rising a notch up to third place. Standing at 181 feet tall, Six Flags Great Adventure's star woodie is among the world's

tallest and delivers a smooth and wild ride, with some deliciously insane airtime.

Completing the top five is Knoebels' Phoenix at No. 4 and Dollywood's Thunderhead at No. 5.

Phoenix is regarded as one of the greatest preservation stories in roller coaster history. The ride dates back to the 1940s when it was designed and built by PTC at Playland in San Antonio. Rescued by Dick Knoebel and given new

life, Phoenix was reborn in 1985 and has enthralled riders and enthusiasts ever since as perhaps the quintessential wooden roller coaster.

Coasters International has some bragging rights this year. In addition to their handiwork helping BoulderDash rocket higher and Thunderhead placing in the top five, their brand new Prowler at Worlds of Fun debuts in the top ten and won Best New Attraction. Also,

last year's Evel Knievel at Six Flags St. Louis more than quadrupled its points from its debut year to vault from No. 44 to No. 13 this season. It was the biggest leap over last year's tallies.

Waldameer's Flyer II also jumps into the top ten after barely missing it last year. This coaster by The Gravity Group lands at No. 6 this year after taking Best New Attaction in 2008.

One coaster most likely

to be missing off next year's charts is Texas Giant (No. 31). After 20 seasons, the recordbreaking woodie will become silent this fall. Six Flags Over Texas will not operate this coaster during their 50th season next year, but instead will invest millions in some TLC that will prepare the new, smoother version for the park's and chain's 50th anniversary in 2011. Coaster fans from across the country are expected to take some final rides at an event this September. Texas Giant took Best Wooden Coaster for the first two years of Amusement Today's Golden Ticket Awards.

Ten of the 50 coasters on our chart come from international destinations. Leading the way is Colossos at Heide Park, Germany (No. 18), Balder at Liseberg, Sweden (No. 21); Megafobia at Oakwood Leisure Park, Wales (No. 25); Coaster at Playland at the PNE, Canada (No. 26); Grand National at Pleasure Beach Blackpool, England (No. 27); Thunderbird at PowerPark, Finland (No. 34); Troy at Toverland, The Netherlands (No. 35), Tonnerre de Zeus at Parc Asterix, France (No. 38), T Express at Everland, South Korea (No. 46); and Aska at Nara Dreamland, Japan (No. 47). Incidentally, Coaster at Playland was just designated an ACE Roller Coaster Landmark this past summer, a designation currently shared with four other coasters on the

Adding to the excitement for the 2010 season will be the new WILDEBEEST, the World's Longest Water Roller Coaster. The four-person rafts will fly up a series of seven hills . The water coaster begins with a conveyor ride "lift hill," conveying guests to the top of the ride without having to walk up stairs. The two-and-a-half minute ride travels 1/3 of a mile, the greatest length of any water coaster in the world!
