North Carolina Voters Strongly Support Agenda for Education, the Environment, and Working

Raleigh, N.C. – Likely voters in North Carolina are overwhelmingly in favor of several public policy proposals regarding education, the environment, and working families, according to an OnPoint Polling and Research survey conducted February 8. The survey was commissioned by AARP North Carolina, the NC Academy of Trial Lawyers, the Conservation Council of NC, Equality NC, the Planned Parenthood Action Fund of Central NC, and the North Carolina AFL-CIO.

- 87% of likely Tar Heel voters favor requiring chemical plants to publicize lists of the dangerous products they contain.
- 69% percent support giving counties the authority to charge impact fees on developers to help pay for new school construction.
- 64% percent support a children's health insurance program to help cover uninsured children.
- 64% want the state income tax deduction for people who save money through the North Carolina college savings plan to be made permanent.
- 62% of likely voters support requiring hog farmers to use new technology to replace hog lagoons.
- 61% of North Carolina voters favor an annual cost-of-living adjustment for the minimum wage.
- 61% favor a plan to provide health insurance for all North Carolinians where the costs are shared by all parties.

These are not partisan issues, either. Five of the seven issues have majority support from both Democrats and Republicans, and all of them have significant support across party lines.

NC Survey Results -- A

Q1	For the first time in 10 years, in 2006, the state legislature increased the minimum wage, but because of inflation, the minimum wage doesn't buy as much today as it did in 1995. In your opinion, should the legislature put an annual cost-of-living adjustment on the minimum wage, so that the minimum wage will keep up with inflation? If you favor automatic cost-of-living adjustments to the minimum wage, press 1 on your keypad now. If you oppose, press 2 now. If you don't know, press 3 now. Favor	Q3	The state legislature has banned hog farmers in North Carolina from building any new lagoons that hold hog waste. The ban on new lagoons will expire this year. Some people say that the lagoons pollute rivers, lakes, streams, and the air, and that farmers should find another way to deal with hog waste. Other people say it would be much too expensive for farmers to change the way they deal with hog waste. Would you favor or oppose a plan to replace the current ban on new lagoons with a requirement that farmers clean up existing lagoons and switch to new technology to deal with hog waste? If you favor requiring farmers to use new technology to replace hog lagoons, press 1 on your keypad now. If you oppose, press 2 now. If you don't know, press 3 now.
Q2	Would you favor or oppose a plan to provide health insurance for all North Carolinians, with costs to be shared by taxpayers, businesses, insurance companies, doctors, hospitals, and the uninsured themselves?
